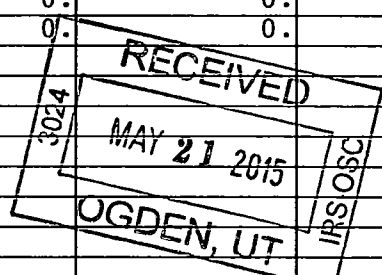

**BYLAWS OF THE WINDMILL FOUNDATION, INC.
A NONPROFIT CORPORATION**

ARTICLE I - INTRODUCTION

- 1.01. **Definition of Bylaws.** These Bylaws constitute the code of rules adopted by THE WINDMILL FOUNDATION, INC. for the regulation and management of its affairs.
- 1.02. **Purposes and Powers.** This Corporation will have the purposes or powers as stated in its Articles of Incorporation, and whatever powers are or may be granted by the Nonprofit Corporation Law of 1988 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 15 Pa. C.S.A. §§ 5301 et seq., or any successor legislation. The primary purposes of this Corporation are charitable, literary, educational and scientific purposes, including the purposes set forth on Attachment A to the Articles of Incorporation which is incorporated by reference in the Bylaws

ARTICLE II - OFFICES

- 2.01. **Principal and Branch Offices.** The principal place of business of this Corporation in Pennsylvania will be located at 527 Tennis Avenue, Ambler, PA 19002. In addition, the Corporation may maintain other offices either within or without the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as the Board of Directors may from time to time appoint or as the Corporation's business may require.
- 2.02. **Registered Office.** The location of the registered office of this Corporation is stated in the Articles of Incorporation. This office will be continuously maintained in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the duration of this Corporation. The Board of Directors may from time to time change the address of its registered office by duly adopted resolution and amend its Articles or file the appropriate statement with the Department of State.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- 3.01. **No Members - Definition of Membership.** The Corporation shall have no members at this time.

ARTICLE IV - DIRECTORS

- 4.01. **General Powers.** The management, the business and the affairs of this Corporation shall be governed by the Board of Directors.

- 4.02. **Structure of Board.** The Board of Directors of this Corporation will constitute a single class.
- 4.03. **Qualifications of Directors.** The qualifications for becoming and remaining a Director of this Corporation are as follows:
- (1) Directors must be natural persons of full age.
 - (2) Directors need not be residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 4.04. **Number of Directors.** The number of Directors of this Corporation will not be less than one at any time, but no more than five.
- 4.05. **Terms of Directors.** The Directors constituting the first Board of Directors as named in the Articles of Incorporation will hold office until the first annual election of Directors. Thereafter, Directors will be elected for a term of one year by vote of the Directors. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared the elected members of the Board of Directors. Each Director will hold office for the term for which the Director was elected and until a successor has been selected and qualified.
- 4.06. **Vacancies on the Board.** Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors, and any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of Directors, will be filled by a majority vote of the Board of Directors or an officer. The new Director elected to fill the vacancy will serve for the unexpired term of the predecessor in office.
- 4.07. **Location of Directors' Meetings.** Meetings of the Board of Directors, regular or special, will be held at the principal place of business of this Corporation or such place or places as the Board of Directors designates by resolution duly adopted. One or more persons may participate in a meeting of the Board of Directors by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- 4.08. **Annual Directors' Meetings.** The annual meeting of the Board of Directors will be held on the first Tuesday in April of each year. If the date set for the meeting falls on a legal business holiday, then the meeting will be held instead on the day immediately following. This provision of the Bylaws constitutes notice to all Directors of the annual meeting, and no further notice shall be required, although further notice may be given.

- 4.09. **Notice of Special Directors' Meetings.** Written or printed notice stating the place, day, and hours of any special meeting of the Board of Directors will be delivered to each Director not less than twenty-four (24) hours or more than five (5) days before the date of the meeting, either personally, by telefax, or by first class or express mail, or facsimile or electronic transmission, by or at the direction of the President, or the Secretary, or the Directors calling the meeting. If mailed, the notice will be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail addressed to the Director at the Director's address as it appears on the records of this Corporation, with postage prepaid. The notice need not state the business to be transacted at, or the purpose of, the meeting.
- 4.10. **Call of Special Board Meetings.** A special meeting of the Board of Directors may be called by either:
- (1) An officer; or
 - (2) Two-thirds of the Board of Directors.
- 4.11. **Waiver of Notice.** Attendance of a Director at any meeting of the Board of Directors will constitute a waiver of notice of that meeting except when the Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting, at the beginning of the meeting, to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.
- 4.12. **Quorum of Directors.** A majority of the whole Board of Directors will constitute a quorum; provided, that in no event will a quorum consist of less than one-third of the whole Board. The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present will be the act of the Board of Directors unless a greater number is required under the provisions of the Nonprofit Corporation Law of 1988, the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation, or any provision of these Bylaws.
- 4.13. **Removal of Director.** The Board of Directors may declare vacant the office of a director if he is declared of unsound mind by an order of court or is convicted of felony, or if, within sixty days after notice of his selection, he does not accept such office either in writing or by attending a meeting of the Board of Directors and fulfill such other requirements of qualification as the By-Laws may specify.
- 4.14. **Voting Rights of Members.** Each Director will be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of Directors. Unless otherwise provided herein, a quorum shall consist of a majority of the Directors in office.

ARTICLE FIVE - OFFICERS

- 5.01. **Roster of Officers.** The Officers of this Corporation will consist of the following personnel:
- (1) A President.
 - (2) A Vice President.
 - (3) A Secretary.
 - (4) A Treasurer.
 - (5) Such other officers and assistant officers as designated from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- 5.02. **Selection of Officers.** Each of the Officers of this Corporation will be elected and appointed annually by the Board of Directors. Each Officer will remain in office until a successor to the office has been selected and qualified. Elections will be held at the regular meeting of the Board of Directors taking place immediately after the Voting Members= annual regular meeting.
- 5.03. **Multiple Officeholders.** In any election of Officers, the Board of Directors may elect and appoint a single person to more than one office simultaneously.
- 5.04. **President.** The President is the Chief Executive Officer of this Corporation and will, subject to the control of the Board of Directors or any Committees, supervise and control the affairs of the Corporation. The President will perform all duties incident to the office and any other duties that may be required by these Bylaws or prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- 5.05. **Vice President.** The Vice President will perform all duties and exercise all powers of the President when the President is absent or is otherwise unable to act. The Vice President will perform any other duties that may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- 5.06. **Secretary.** The Secretary will keep minutes of all meetings of Members and of the Board of Directors, be the custodian of the corporate records, give all notices as are required by law or by these Bylaws, and generally, perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and any other duties as may be required by law, by the Articles of Incorporation, or by these Bylaws, or that may be assigned by the Board of Directors.
- 5.07. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer will have charge and custody of all funds of this Corporation, and will deposit the funds as required by the Board of Directors, keep and maintain adequate and correct accounts of the Corporation's properties and business transactions, render reports and accountings to the Directors and to the

Members as required by the Board of Directors or by Members or by law. The Treasurer will perform in general all duties incident to the office of Treasurer and any other duties as may be required by law, by the Articles of Incorporation, or by these Bylaws, or that may be assigned by the Board of Directors.

- 5.08. **Removal of Officers.** Any Officer elected or appointed to office may be removed by the persons authorized under these Bylaws to elect or appoint Officers whenever in their judgment the best interests of this Corporation will be served. However, any removal will be without prejudice to any contract rights of the Officer so removed.

ARTICLE VI - INFORMAL ACTION

- 6.01. **Waiver of Notice.** Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the Nonprofit Corporation Law of 1988, the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation, or these Bylaws, a waiver of the notice in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to notice, whether before or after the time stated in the waiver, will be deemed equivalent to the giving of the notice. The waiver must, in the case of a special meeting of Members, specify the general nature of the business to be transacted.

- 6.02. **Action by Consent.** Any action required by law or under the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation or these Bylaws, or any action that otherwise may be taken at a meeting of the or Board of Directors, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action taken, is signed by all Directors in office, and filed with the Secretary of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

- 7.01. **Definition of Executive Committees.** This Corporation may have certain Committees, each of which will consist of one or more Directors. Each Executive Committee will have and will exercise some prescribed authority of the Board of Directors in the management of this Corporation. However, no Committee will have the authority of the Board in reference to affecting any of the following:

- (1) Adoption of a plan for distribution of assets of the Corporation or for dissolution.
- (2) Filling of vacancies in the Board.
- (3) Adoption, amendment, or repeal of Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation.
- (4) Amendment or repeal or any action inconsistent with any resolution of the Board.

- (5) Action on matters committed by Bylaws or resolution of the Board to another Committee of the Board.
- (6) Adoption of a plan of merger or a plan of consolidation with another entity, or authorizing the sale, lease, exchange or mortgage of all or substantially all of the property or assets of the Corporation.
- (7) Any action requiring approval of members under the Nonprofit Corporation Law of 1988, if this Corporation had members.

7.02. **Appointment of Committees.** The Board of Directors, by resolution duly adopted by a majority of the Directors in office, may designate and appoint one or more Executive Committees and delegate to these Committees the specific and prescribed authority of the Board of Directors to exercise in the management of this Corporation. However, the creation of Executive Committees will not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed by law.

7.03. **Functionary Committees.** In addition, the Board of Directors, by resolution, may designate and appoint certain Functionary Committees designed to transact certain ministerial business of the Corporation or to advise the Board of Directors. These Committees will be chaired by an Officer or Director as designated by the Board. The Chairperson will proceed to select the remaining members of the Committee up to the number set by the Board or terminate the memberships or appoint successors in the Chairperson's discretion. The Board may terminate any Committee by resolution.

ARTICLE VIII - INDEMNIFICATION

8.01 **Limitation of Personal Liability of Directors.** A director of the corporation shall not be personally liable for monetary damages as such for any action taken, or any failure to take any action, unless:

- (1) the director has breached or failed to perform the duties of his or her office as defined in Section 8.02 below; and
- (2) the breach or failure to perform constitutes self dealing, willful misconduct or recklessness.

The provisions of this Section shall not apply to (a) the responsibility or liability of a director pursuant to any criminal statute; or (b) the liability of a director for the payment of taxes pursuant to local, state or federal law.

8.02. Standard of Care and Justifiable Reliance.

- (a) A director of the corporation shall stand in a fiduciary relationship to the corporation, and shall perform his or her duties as a director, including his or her duties as a member of any committee of the Board upon which he or she may serve, in good faith, in a manner he or she reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the corporation, and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, skill and diligence, as a person of ordinary prudence would use under similar circumstances. In performing his or her duties, a director shall be entitled to rely in good faith on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by any of the following:
- (i) One or more officers or employees of the corporation whom the director reasonably believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented;
 - (ii) Counsel, public accountants or other persons as to matters which the director reasonably believes to be within the professional or expert competence of such person;
 - (iii) A committee of the Board upon which he or she does not serve, duly designated in accordance with law, as to matters within its designated authority, which committee the director reasonably believes to merit confidence.

A director shall not be considered to be acting in good faith if he or she has knowledge concerning the matter in question that would cause his or her reliance to be unwarranted.

- (b) In discharging the duties of their respective positions, the Board, committees of the board and individual director may, in considering the best interests of the corporation, consider the effects of any action upon employees, upon persons with whom the corporation has business and other relations and upon communities which the offices or other establishments of or related to the corporation are located, and all other pertinent factors. The consideration of those factors shall not constitute a violation of subsection (a) of this Section.
- (c) Absent breach of fiduciary duty, lack of good faith or self-dealing, actions taken as a director or any failure to take any action shall be presumed to be in the best interests of the corporation.

- 8.03. **Indemnification in Third Party Proceedings.** The corporation shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (other than an action by or in the right of the corporation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a representative of the corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a representative of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with such action, suit or proceeding if he acted in good faith and in a manner reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the corporation, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not of itself create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the corporation, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.
- 8.04. **Indemnification in Derivative Actions.** The corporation shall indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action or suit by or in the right of the corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a representative of the corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a representative of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit if he or she acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the corporation and except that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to the corporation unless and only to the extent that the Court of Common Pleas or the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses which the Court of Common Pleas or such other court shall deem proper.
- 8.05. **Mandatory Indemnification.** Notwithstanding any contrary provision of the articles or these by-laws, to the extent that a representative of the corporation has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in either Section 8.03 or Section 8.04 above, he or she shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection therewith.

- 8.06. **Determination of Entitlement to Indemnification.** Unless ordered by a court, any indemnification under Section 8.03 or 8.04 above shall be made by the corporation only as authorized in the specific case upon determination that indemnification of the representative is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in such paragraph. Such determination shall be made:
- (a) by the Board by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding; or
 - (b) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or, even if obtainable, a majority vote of a quorum of disinterested directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion.
- 8.07. **Advancing Expenses.** Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding as authorized by the Board in a specific case upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the representative to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he is entitled to be indemnified by the corporation as authorized in Sections 8.03 through 8.05 above.
- 8.08. **Indemnification of Former Representatives.** Each such indemnity may continue as to a person who has ceased to be a representative of the corporation and may inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person.
- 8.09. **Insurance.** The corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the corporation or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any capacity or arising out of such person's status as such, whether or not the corporation would otherwise have the power to indemnify such person against such liability.
- 8.10. **Reliance on Provisions.** Each person who shall act as an authorized representative of the corporation shall be deemed to be doing so in reliance upon the rights of indemnification provided by this Article.

ARTICLE IX - OPERATIONS

- 9.01. **Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of this corporation will be the calendar year.

- 9.02. **Execution of Documents.** Except as otherwise provided by law, checks, drafts, promissory notes, orders for the payment of money, and other evidences of indebtedness of this Corporation will be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President. Contracts, leases, or other instruments executed in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation will be signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the President, and will have attached copies of the resolutions of the Board of Directors certified by the Secretary authorizing their execution.
- 9.03. **Books and Records.** This Corporation will keep correct and complete books and records of account, and will also keep minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and Executive Committees. The Corporation will keep at its principal place of business a register giving the names and addresses of each Director, and the original or a copy of its Bylaws including amendments to date certified by the Secretary of the Corporation.
- 9.04. **Inspection of Books and Records.** All books and records of this Corporation may be inspected by any Director or the Director's agent or attorney, for any proper purpose at any reasonable time on written demand under oath stating the purpose of the inspection.
- 9.05. **Nonprofit Operations.** This Corporation will not have or issue shares of stock. No dividend will be paid, and no part of the income of this Corporation will be distributed to its Directors or Officers. However, the Corporation may pay compensation in a reasonable amount to Directors or Officers for services rendered.
- 9.06. **Loans to Management.** This Corporation will make no loans to any of its Directors or Officers.
- 9.07. **Seal.** The corporate seal shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation, the year of its organization and the words "Corporate Seal, Pennsylvania".

ARTICLE X - ANNUAL REPORT

- 10.01. **Annual Report/Contents.** The Board of Directors shall present at the annual meeting of the Directors a report, verified by the President and Treasurer or by a majority of the directors, showing in appropriate detail the following:
- (a) The assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the corporation as of the end of the fiscal year immediately preceding the date of the report.
 - (b) The principal changes in assets and liabilities including trust funds, during the year immediately preceding the date of the report.

(c) The revenue or receipts of the corporation, both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes, for the year immediately preceding the date of the report, including separate data with respect to each trust fund held by or for the corporation.


(d) The expenses or disbursements of the corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, during the year immediately preceding the date of the report, including separate data with respect to each trust fund held by or for the corporation.


10.02. **Place of Filing.** This report shall be filed with the minutes of the annual meeting of Directors.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENT

11.01. **Modification of Bylaws.** The power to alter, amend, or repeal these Bylaws, or to adopt new Bylaws, to the extent allowed by law, is vested in the Board of Directors.

11.02. **Adoption of Bylaws.** These Bylaws were adopted by the incorporators by written consent effective April 9, 2014.






