BYLAWS OF COASTAL EMC FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE I

NAME OF ORGANIZATION

The name of the Corporation shall be the Coastal EMC Foundation, Inc.
Herein below referred to as

"FOUNDATION"

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE OF ORGANIZATION

The purpose of the FOUNDATION shall be the accumulation and disbursement of funds for charitable purposes in the service area of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation. Upon dissolution of the FOUNDATION, any remaining funds shall be distributed only for charitable purposes.

ARTICLE III

FUNDING

The FOUNDATION shall be funded by such rules and regulations as may be promulgated by the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation and from any other source of funds available to the said FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE IV

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The FOUNDATION shall be administered by a nine (9) person Board of Directors. The initial Board of Directors shall be composed of nine (9) persons residing in Bryan, Liberty, or McIntosh County as designated by the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation. The Board shall have three (3) members from Bryan County, three (3) members from Liberty County, and three (3) members from McIntosh County.

At the initial organizational meeting of the Board of Directors the members of the Board shall by lot draw from terms of office of one (1), two (2), and three (3) years. One (1) member from Bryan County, one (1) from Liberty, and one (1) from McIntosh County shall be chosen for one (1) year terms, and like members from each county shall be chosen for two (2) and three (3) year terms. Thereafter, the terms of office for each Board member shall be for a period of three (3) years.

ARTICLE V

QUALIFICATIONS OF BOARD MEMBERSHIP

A Board member of the FOUNDATION shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age, a permanent resident of the county from which he is chosen and of good moral character. It shall not be necessary for members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION to be members of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation. No person seeking or holding a seat on the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation shall remain a member of the FOUNDATION Board.

ARTICLE VI

SELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The initial Board of Directors shall be designated by the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation. Thereafter, when vacancies are to be filled or when terms expire, persons shall be named to their respective vacancies on the said Board of Directors by a vote of the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation. The existing Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make recommendations to the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation for nominees for the FOUNDATION Board.

ARTICLE VII

COMPENSATION FOR DIRECTORS

No director shall receive compensation for serving on the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION. Such Board members may, however, be reimbursed for mileage and out of pocket expenses incurred while on the business of the FOUNDATION when such business is sanctioned by the Board of Directors of said FOUNDATION.

ATTICLE VIII

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. <u>REGULAR MEETING</u>: The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall meet not less than quarterly at a place designated by the Board. The Board of Directors may meet at such other times as they may deem at their discretion to be necessary.
- B. <u>SPECIAL MEETINGS</u>: Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chairman or by any three (3) Directors and it shall thereupon be the duty of the Secretary to cause a Notice of such meeting to be given as hereafter provided. The Chairman or Directors calling such meeting shall fix the time and place.
- C. NOTICE OF DIRECTORS MEETING: Written notice of the time and place of regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be delivered to members of the Board not less than five (5) days prior thereto, either personally, by mail, or by phone at the direction of the Secretary, and upon default in that duty by the Secretary, then by the Chairman or the Directors calling for such meeting.

ARTICLE IX

QUORUM

A majority of the Board of Directors shall, unless otherwise designated in these Articles, constitute a quorum. In the event that less than a majority of the Board of Directors is present any meeting, the majority of those Directors present may adjourn the meeting and designate a place and time for the next meeting, under which circumstances the Secretary shall notify the absent members of the place and time of the next meeting. An act of the majority of the Board of Directors present at any meeting at which a quorum is present, and unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws, shall be the act of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE X

REMOVAL OF MEMBER OF BOARD

Any member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall automatically cease to be a member of said Board if and in the event such member misses three (3) successive "regular" meetings as outlined in Section "A" of Article VIII of these Bylaws. Any member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may otherwise be removed for cause from the Board by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XI

OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

The officers of the FOUNDATION shall be a <u>Chairman</u>, a <u>Vice-Chairman</u>, a <u>Secretary</u> and a <u>Treasurer</u>, and such other officers as may be determined by the Board from time to time. For the purposes of these Bylaws, the above four (4) officers shall constitute the Executive Committee of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XII

ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND TERMS OF OFFICE

The officers shall by secret ballot be elected annually by the Board of Directors at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on an annual basis after the initial organizational meeting.

The terms of office shall be for one (1) year, however, nothing shall prevent an officer from being re-elected to consecutive terms of office.

ARTICLE XIII

EX OFFICIO MEMBERS OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The General Manager of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation shall be an ex officio member of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION. The FOUNDATION may from time to time have other such ex officio members as the Board of Directors may in its discretion determine as necessary or prudent.

ARTICLE XIV

POLICIES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall have the power to make and adopt such rules and regulations, not in consistent with law, the Articles of Incorporation or these-Bylaws, as it may deem advisable for the management, administration and regulation of the business and affairs of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XV

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- A. <u>CHAIRMAN</u>: The Chairman shall be the principal executive officer of the FOUNDATION and, unless otherwise determined by the Board of Directors, shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and in general perform all duties incidental to the office of Chairman and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.
- B. <u>VICE CHAIRMAN</u>: In the absence of the Chairman, or in the event of his inability or refusal to act, the Vice Chairman shall perform the duties of the Chairman, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chairman. The Vice Chairman shall also perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors.
- C. <u>SECRETARY</u>: The Secretary shall be responsible for the keeping of the minutes of the meetings of the members and of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose; be responsible for seeing that all notices are duly given in accordance with these Bylaws or as required by Law; be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the FOUNDATION and affix the seal of the FOUNDATION to all necessary documents, the execution of which on behalf of the FOUNDATION under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provision of these Bylaws; have general charge of the books of the FOUNDATION; be responsible for the keeping on file at all times a complete copy of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the FOUNDATION containing all amendments thereto; and, in general, perform all duties incidental to the office of the Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors.
- D. <u>TREASURER</u>: The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Foundation; be responsible for the receipt of and the issuance of receipts for monies due and payable to the FOUNDATION from any source whatsoever, and for the deposit of all such monies in the name of the FOUNDATION in such bank or banks as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws; and in general perform all the duties incidental to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XVI

CHECK SIGNING

Any and all checks issued by the FOUNDATION, for any purpose, shall be signed by two (2) officers or one (1) officer and such other person(s) as may be designated by the Board of Directors as having check signing authority.

ARTICLE XVII

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Except as otherwise provided by these Bylaws, the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall have the full and sole responsibility for the disbursement of all monies of the FOUNDATION in accordance with these Bylaws and the policies as adopted by the Board of Directors.

Prior to the consideration, by the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION, of any disbursement, member(s) of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall disclose and explain any personal and/or business interest, connection, kinship, or other association he or she has with the person, family, group, corporation or other entity under consideration for funding by the FOUNDATION.

Such member shall, if requested by the Chairman or any three (3) members of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION, excuse himself or herself from the meeting and not participate in the discussion of or voting on the disbursement.

If no request is made that the interested director excuse himself or herself from the meeting, then and in that event, said director may participate in the discussion of the disbursement but shall not vote on the disbursement.

ARTICLE XVIII

ACCUMULATION OF FUNDS

Coastal Electric Membership Corporation shall transfer funds collected by it for the benefit of the FOUNDATION on a regular basis, but in no event less than quarterly. The FOUNDATION may also solicit and accept contributions from other sources as deemed appropriate by its Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIX

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall be responsible for the funds entrusted to it and shall make such investment of said funds in a manner which is reasonable and prudent and in keeping with these Bylaws and the policies of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XX

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed by the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation at any regular meeting of said Board after at least ten (10) days notice. The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make advisory recommendations to the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation.

ARTICLE XXI

ACCOUNTING SYSTEM & REPORTS

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall cause to be established and maintained a complete accounting system such that is in keeping with sound financial management and furthermore the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall make reports to the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation on the operation and expenditures of the FOUNDATION as may be necessary and prudent, but in no case less than annually.

ARTICLE XXII

POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS

No funds of the FOUNDATION shall in any fashion be used to support any candidate for political officer or for any political purpose.

ARTICLE XXIII

BORROWING FUNDS

The FOUNDATION shall NOT have the authority to borrow monies from any bank, savings and loan or other institutions for any purpose.

ARTICLE XXIV

EMERGENCY EXPENDITURE

The Executive Committee of the FOUNDATION by a vote of at least three (3) of its members may from time to time make expenditures on an emergency basis, in accordance with

these Bylaws; and policies adopted by the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION; and in accordance with the purpose of this FOUNDATION, in an amount not exceeding ONE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS, to any person, family, group or organization.

Such emergency expenditure shall be fully disclosed by the Executive Committee at the next regularly called meeting of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XXV

AMOUNT OF EXPENDITURES

Unless otherwise provided by these Bylaws and in keeping with the purpose of this Foundation the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may make annual expenditures of FOUNDATION funds by majority vote of members present at a meeting and constituting a quorum according to the following rules:

- a.) Not more than ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100THS (\$1,500.00) DOLLARS, annually to any individual.
- b.) Not more than FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS, annually to any family unit, group, organization, charity or like organization.

ARTICLE XXVI

EXPENDITURES EXCEEDING FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board of Directors {six (6) members} make expenditures in any amount to any person(s); family unit, group, organization, charity or like organization which such members determine is in keeping with the purpose and spirit of the FOUNDATION and these Bylaws.

ARTICLE XXVII

RETENTION OF FUNDS

Until such time as there exists a sum of money, including earned interest, in a amount of not less than ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS within the FOUNDATION, no expenditures exceeding ninety-five (95%) percent of the annual

contributions, from whatever source derived, may be disbursed or otherwise disposed of for any purpose. Thereafter the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION may in its discretion and in accordance with other dictates imposed by these Bylaws expend any and all monies saving and excepting five percent (5%) of the previous years total contributions or FIVE THOUSAND AND NO/100THS (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS, whichever is less.

ARTICLE XXVIII

PROXY VOTING

There shall not exist proxy voting at any meeting of the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE XXIX

AUDIT

The Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION shall on an annual basis cause the books and records of the FOUNDATION to be audited by a certified public accountant and a report in keeping with sound accounting principles be issued to the Board of Directors of the FOUNDATION and the Board of Directors of Coastal Electric Membership Corporation.

ARTICLE XXX

FISCAL YEAR

The Fiscal Year of the FOUNDATION shall commence on the 1st day of January of each calendar year and end on the 31st day of December of each calendar year.

FOUNDATION GUIDELINES

January 11, 1995

1. The Board decided when new applications are received, if the applicant resides in the director's county, the application will go to that director to be investigated before the next meeting.

March 4, 1998

2. The Board set a limit of \$5,000 on all fire department requests. Those fire departments that have already received funds and have not reached this limit will be able to receive up to the limit of \$5,000. After the limit has been received the fire departments will no longer be eligible for funds.

June 3, 1998

3. The Board decided to set a cut-off date for receiving applications. The cut-off date will be one week prior to the quarterly meeting. If the application is received after the cut-off date, it will be presented at the next quarterly meeting.

June 7, 2000

4. The Board set a new guideline for organizations receiving donations of \$5,000. Organizations who receive a donation of \$5,000 can resubmit an application after a three year period. Request for donations after the three year period will be allocated based on funds available.

December 6, 2000

5. The Board set a new guideline for emergency expenditures for one person in household with home fire to receive a total of \$500. If more than one person in household, each person in household will receive \$300 up to \$1,000. If the number in household goes over \$1,000, the remainder of the funds will be discussed at the next quarterly board meeting under the individual and/or family application process.

September 5, 2001

6. A suggestion was made to prioritize the applications that are received by sorting them into the following groups: organizations, senior citizens, emergency house fire disbursements and individuals. It was decided to continue the process of receiving the applications as they come into the office and not prioritize.

September 5, 2001

7. Grants have a no "must be claimed by date". It was suggested that in the future grants should have a must be claimed date; this will force the recipient to move forward with the project or risk losing his or her funding. If the applicant reaches the three month deadline, he or she may request an extension if necessary. If the recipient takes no action, the grant is withdrawn and the funds will be available to fund other grants approved by the Board.

8. December 5, 2001

It was suggested that the individual applications be prioritized for the neediest. All applicants that are not awarded will be notified by letter to resubmit their application with updated information by the next quarterly meeting; the applications will also be subject to available funds.

9. March 6, 2002

A one year moratorium on home repairs/upgrades will be implemented until some guidelines are created to assist in making the process work more smoothly for individual applicants requesting repairs.

10. March 6, 2003

It was decided to end the moratorium and utilize the guidelines set forth herewith:

- Have the Foundation set up an "approved contractors" list. To become approved the contractor would have to supply basic information such as his name, address, phone, etc., as well as, the names of people he had done work for. (The cooperatives staff would verify the references and other information.) The contractor would have to supply proof of insurance. If he is unable to do so, he would have to sign a blanket waiver releasing the Foundation and all grant recipients from liability, should he be injured on one of the jobs.
- Have the Foundation set up funding criteria that more accurately describes exactly what they will fund. An example might be a "wheel chair ramp and stoop". The stoop shall not be bigger than 6' x 6'. The ramp shall not be wider than 48" and shall have a slope that meets ADA guidelines, etc.
- This would allow the Foundation to have more control over the process. If desired the co-op would develop a set of master plans for the types of home improvements the Foundation would consider funding. These plans would include a detailed materials list. Doing this would help ensure that Member A received the same service that Member B received. In addition, there would be some cost savings because similar projects would be built the same way.

11. June 11, 2003

Board agreed that the scholarships and education would be top priority as to how they would grant the funds. It was also agreed upon awarding six scholarships - \$1,000 each, as a one time gift to students. Students residing/attending school in McIntosh, Liberty, and Bryan Counties will be eligible for the scholarships. The remaining funds will be split 50-50 among individuals and organizations.

For the Bright Ideas program, Coastal Electric Cooperative will continue to include Long County until Canoochee EMC implements the Bright Ideas program in their area.

Home improvements for individuals will be funded for materials only and a Cooperative employee will investigate the need of the improvement. The applicant will be responsible for the labor charges.

The Board decided that they would meet every other month beginning with its September 2003 meeting.

The Board decided that once these guidelines were implemented that they would consider partnering with other organizations on additional projects.

12. October 8, 2003

Volunteer Fire Departments funding will be as follows:

- o Set fund limit for \$2,000 every five years with a maximum amount of \$10,000 in the last 10 years.
- o Applications denied can resubmit in one year.
- o Change application for VFD to include:
 - > Families Served
 - ➤ Insurance Rating
 - > How VFD is Funded
 - > Community Support
 - > Major Equipment Already in Place
 - > Minimum Amount Funds VFD can get by With
 - ➤ Last Time Application was Submitted and Amount Awarded
 - > List of Commonly Used Equipment
- o Guidelines will be placed in the GA Magazine for the Volunteer Fire Departments.

13. November 5, 2003

Board's decision to have all fire stations considered as individual stations.

14. March 3, 2004

\$10,000 fund limit only applies to the fire departments and not to other organizations until there is a need to set this limit.

15. September 7, 2005

The Board set a new guideline to allow the Foundation to contribute \$3,000 for disaster relief if the need arises.

HOKE YOUMANS TRUST

Grant Disbursement Conditions

- 1. Grant proceeds are to be used for community projects, with a priority given to projects, groups, etc. that enhance educational activities in the Foundation's service territory.
- 2. Grant funds must be matched dollar for dollar with the Foundation's general funds, except as noted below.
 - a. The Foundation may use the grant funds to fund a project without the required match if two-thirds of the entire Foundation Board approves it.
- 3. Grant funds are to be released at the rate of \$5,000 per quarter.
 - a. If, in any quarter, the Foundation does not fund \$5,000 in projects, the remaining balance for a quarter will revert to the Foundation's general fund and is no longer subject to these guidelines.
 - b. The Foundation may exceed the giving of \$5,000 in a quarter if two-thirds of the Foundation's entire Board approves it.

Foundation Strategic Planning Session

June 11, 2003

The Foundation Board met on June 11, 2003 at the Coastal Electric Cooperative auditorium for a Strategic Planning Session. Those in attendance were Donette Bargeron, Jimmie Bowen, Bob Caldwell, Robert Carpenter, Kim Carter, Runette Parker, Paul Ripley, Roger Sapp, Mark Bolton, Cindy Chambless, Anne Cordeiro and Whit Hollowell. Special guest were Tom Upshaw, CEO of Palmetto Electric and his assistant, Martha McMillan.

Mr. Upshaw was the mediator of the session. He gave the Board an overview of how the Palmetto Electric Cooperative handled their Operation RoundUp program.

After reviewing everyone's responses to the Strategic Planning Questionnaire, each attendee listed his top four issues. These issues were tallied and the six topics most often listed by the attendees were:

- Creating a shared vision among the Foundation Board.
- **♦** Application process.
- School programs/scholarships.
- . Continue to build programs that can be owned.
- Guidelines for home improvement projects.
- ❖ Being able to partner with other organizations to make \$\$ go further.

The Board agreed that the scholarships and education would be top priority as to how they would grant the funds.

They also agreed on awarding six scholarships - \$1,000 each, as a one time gift to students. Students residing/attending school in McIntosh, Liberty, and Bryan Counties will be eligible for the scholarships. This action will be ratified at the September Board Meeting. The remaining funds will be split 50-50 among individuals and organizations.

For the Bright Ideas Program, Coastal Electric Cooperative will continue to include Long County until Canoochee EMC implements the Bright Ideas in their area.

Home improvements for individuals will be funded for materials only and a Coop employee will investigate the need of the improvement. The applicant will be responsible for the labor.

The Board decided that once the guidelines had been implemented they would consider partnering with other organizations on additional projects.
