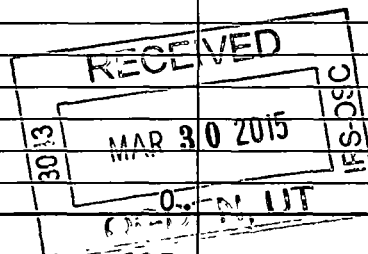

Individual Grant Procedures

Pursuant to Section 4945(g) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Section 53.4945-4 of Treasury Regulations, The Foundation For Visions (the "Foundation") proposes to make grants described in IRC §4945(g)(1), (2) or (3) to individuals in accordance with the following procedures:

1. Selection of Grantees. Depending on the availability of funds and other charitable activities in which the Foundation may be engaged in a given year, the Foundation may make one or more grants of the type described in IRC §4945(g) per year. The selection of grantees will be made by the Foundation on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis. An individual grantee may be selected in one of several different ways. First, the Foundation may become aware of the needs, circumstances and/or qualifications of a prospective grantee from a report about the prospective grantee published in the media. Examples of the kind of media reports the Foundation may choose to respond to are articles that were published in the Daily Oklahoman on December 20, 1991 and May 3, 1992, copies of which are attached as Exhibits "A" and "B". If the Foundation learns of a prospective grantee from such a media report, it will obtain additional information about the prospective grantee from the prospective grantee and/or from one or more adults who know the prospective grantee, such as a school counselor, principal, or teacher, or an employer, minister or other adult. An individual grantee may also be selected by the Foundation (i) from a group of qualified candidates, or (ii) without reference to a group of candidates, if he or she is exceptionally qualified to carry out the charitable, educational or scientific purposes of the grant, or (iii) if it is otherwise evident that the selection is particularly calculated to effectuate the exempt purpose of the grant rather than to benefit particular persons. Neither employees of the Foundation nor "disqualified persons" with respect to the Foundation, as defined in IRC §4946(a), are eligible for grants from the Foundation. Furthermore, no such disqualified persons or employees of the Foundation may be in a position to derive a private benefit, directly or indirectly, if certain potential grantees are selected over others.

(a) Solicitation of Applications. In some years, the Foundation may decide not to make any scholarship grants, and in other years, its scholarship grants may be made only to students whose needs, circumstances and/or qualifications it first learns about from media reports. In those years, the Foundation will not solicit applications for scholarship grants. For other years, it is anticipated that the Foundation will make one or more scholarship grants to students from a group of qualified candidates, and applications from members of such a group will be solicited by notifying the principals and/or counselors of one or more schools of the availability of such scholarship grants.

(b) How Selected. Applicants must be recommended for a grant by a school counselor, principal, or teacher, or by an employer, minister or other adult. Biographical information, including such matters as academic qualifications, financial need, and plans for a prospective grantee's continued education, will be obtained from the applicant and/or from one or more of the adults who have recommended the applicant. The Foundation may select grantees for its grants based on this information, or it may also conduct and consider a personal interview with the applicant and/or one or more adults who know or have recommended the applicant. The criteria used in selecting grant recipients will include financial need and hardship circumstances, recommendations from adults who know the applicant and the conclusions which the Foundation might draw in a personal interview with the applicant and/or one or more adults who know or have recommended the applicant for a grant as to the applicant's motivation, character, ability and potential. The Foundation may also consider the applicant's academic record and/or his or her performance on college entrance tests. The Foundation will not discriminate in the selection of grantees on the basis of race, creed, color, sex, national origin or religious affiliation.

2. Terms and Conditions Under Which the Foundation Makes Individual Grants. The terms and conditions of each grant will be contained in a letter sent to the recipient of the grant. The recipient will be required to communicate his or her acceptance of the terms and conditions of the grant in writing to the Foundation. The terms and conditions of grants will include the specific purpose of the grant, its duration, the total amount of the grant, requirements for narrative reports, including due dates for such reports, the circumstances under which the grant could be terminated or withdrawn (such as withdrawal from school, failure to meet the minimum standards of academic performance outlined in the grant letter, conviction of a felony, and conviction of using or distributing illegal drugs) and the demonstrated progress the applicant must make in his or her education to be eligible to continue receiving grants from the Foundation. Generally, it is anticipated that grants will be made by the Foundation for a single academic year or semester, with the grantee then being required to reapply for additional grants for subsequent academic years or semesters. Grantees of scholarships will be required to pursue their studies or training at an educational institution that normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly organized body of students in attendance at the place where the educational activities are carried on.

3. Procedure for Exercising Supervision Over Individual Grants. With respect to individual grants, the Foundation will require the grantee to provide a report of the grantee's courses taken (if any) and grades received (if any) in each academic period. Each such report must be verified by the educational institution attended by the grantee and will be obtained at least once a year. Where study at an institution does not involve the taking of courses but involves other academic endeavors, such as the preparation of research papers or projects, the Foundation will require a brief report from the institution on the progress of the applicant at least once a year. Such a report must be approved by the faculty member supervising the grantee or by another appropriate

official of the institution. Upon completion of a grantee's study at an educational institution, a final report will also be obtained.

The Foundation may not require such reports to be submitted if the following conditions are met: First, the grant is a scholarship or fellowship subject to the provisions of section 117(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and is to be used for study at an educational institution which normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly organized body of students in attendance at the place where its educational activities are carried on. Second, the Foundation pays the scholarship or fellowship to the educational institution. Third, the educational institution agrees to use the grant funds to defray the recipient's expenses or pay funds to the recipient only if he or she is enrolled at the educational institution and his or her standing at such institution is consistent with the purposes and conditions of the grant.

4. Procedures for Review of Grantee Reports, for Investigation Where Diversion of Grant Funds from Their Specified Purposes Is Indicated, and for Recovery of Diverted Grant Funds.

(a) Review of Grantee Reports. One or more representatives of the Foundation will have the responsibility to follow the progress of the individual grant, that is, to review each report submitted by the funded educational institution or person, to make a determination as to whether the grant purposes are being or have been fulfilled, and to look into any questions requiring further scrutiny or investigation.

(b) Investigation Where Diversion of Grant Funds From Their Specified Purposes Is Indicated. Where reports to the Foundation or other information (including failure to submit reports after a reasonable time has elapsed from their due date) indicates that all or any part of grant funds are not being used for the purposes of such grant, the Foundation will initiate an investigation. While conducting the investigation, the Foundation will withhold further payments to the extent possible until it has determined that no part of the grant has been used for improper purposes, and until any delinquent reports have been submitted.

If the Foundation determines that any part of a grant has been used for improper purposes, the Foundation will take all reasonable and appropriate steps to recover diverted grant funds or to insure the restoration of diverted funds and the dedication of other grant funds held by the grantee to the purposes being financed by the grant. These steps will include legal action unless the Foundation reasonably believes that such action would in all probability not result in a judgment being obtained and collected, or unless the amount that could reasonably be expected to be collected from pursuing such a legal action would not justify the legal expenses to be incurred in pursuing legal action.

If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the grantee has not previously diverted grant funds to any use not in furtherance of a purpose specified in the grant, the Foundation will withhold further payments on the particular grant until (1) it has received the grantee's assurances that future diversions will not occur, (2) any delinquent reports have been submitted, and (3) it has required the grantee to take extraordinary precautions to prevent future diversions from occurring. If the Foundation determines that any part of the grant has been used for improper purposes and the grantee has previously diverted Foundation grant funds, the Foundation will withhold further payments until the three conditions of the preceding sentence have been met and the diverted funds are in fact recovered or restored.
