Located in the southwest sector of Fort Worth for more than 20 years, Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital Southwest Fort Worth (THSW) operates 190 beds THSW provides a wide array of comprehensive services, including surgical and imaging services, 24-hour emergency services, Virginia Clay Dorman Breast Care Center, orthopedics and sports therapy, adult critical care and a Level IIIA neonatal intensive care unit, obstetrics and gynecology, cardiovascular services, cancer care, physical rehabilitation, and more The hospital continually ranks among the area's preferred facilities to deliver babies, according to Fort Worth Child magazine (December 2006 issue) In 2007, THSW earned the Premiere Award for Quality, presented only to the top-performing hospitals in the nation, and in 2010, THSW became just the second hospital in Texas to earn Acute Heart Failure Center status from the Society of Chest Pain Centers During the year, THSW had 45,038 patient days, 13,107 discharges, 97,688 outpatient encounters, 64,745 emergency room visits and 3,197 births THSW provides quality medical healthcare regardless of race, creed, sex, national origin, handicap, age, or ability to pay The hospital provides care to persons covered by governmental programs including Medicare and Medicaid for reimbursement that does not always cover the cost of providing the care Recognizing its mission to the community, services are provided to both financially indigent and medically indigent patients Community benefit is provided through many reduced price services and free programs to the community These services are essential to provide complete healthcare to the communities served Some of these programs include \* Various health screenings were offered to the community free of charge or for a nominal charge such as diabetes and breast cancer \* Community education classes offered such as Safe Sitter, Girls Growing Up, Lamaze, CPR and parenting \* Senior adult community education through Seniorcising, a program designed to promote health education, wellness strategies and healthy living with physical exercise in senior adults



The hospital is part of a consolidated system of hospitals which operate under the name Texas Health Resources (THR). THR's annual audit is conducted on a system-wide basis with a single consolidated audit report issued for THR and its affiliates. The audited financial statements of THR, which includes the activity of the organization, contain a footnote regarding Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts that reads as follows: Patient accounts receivable are reported net of estimated allowances for doubtful accounts and contractual adjustments in the balance sheets. The allowance and resulting provision for bad debts is based upon a combination of the aging of receivables and management's assessment of historical and expected net collections considering business and economic conditions, trends in health care coverage and other collection indicators for each of its major payor sources of revenue. Management assesses the adequacy of the allowance for doubtful accounts based upon historical write-off experience and payment trends by payor category. Patient accounts are also monitored and, if necessary, past due accounts are placed with collection agencies in accordance with guidelines established by management. For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the System analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts and a provision for bad debts, if necessary (for example, for expected uncollectible deductibles and copayments, or for payors who are known to be having financial difficulties that make the realization of amounts due unlikely). For receivables associated with self-pay patients (which includes both patients without insurance and patients with deductible and copayment balances due for which third party coverage exists for part of the bill), the System records a significant provision for bad debts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible. The difference between the billed rates and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts. The System's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients (including allowances for charity care) increased from 96.0% of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2013, to 96.1% of self-pay accounts receivable at December 31, 2014. In addition, the System's self-pay write-offs for bad debts increased from approximately \$294,476,000 for fiscal year 2013 to approximately \$310,000,000 for fiscal year 2014. The increase in write offs was the result of an overall increase in patient revenue in fiscal year 2014. The System does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write-offs from third-party payors.</p>

If it is determined that the patient is potentially eligible for governmental assistance, the counselor will assist the patient in completing forms necessary to apply for the assistance. At the same time, patients are provided with a Charity Care application and information flyer. The patient is informed that the hospital is a non-profit organization offering financial assistance to patients deemed medically or financially indigent. A Plain Language Summary titled "Getting Help Paying Your Bill" is included on the back of our patient statements. The plain language summary informs the patients of how to qualify for charity, how to apply for help, necessary documentation, and informs of THR's collection activities. The onsite financial counselors may assist the patient in completing the application and obtain available verification information. Once the patient is discharged, the counselors will continue to contact the patient to ensure all forms and verifications needed to file an application for governmental assistance and Charity Care have been provided. In certain cases, self-pay patients who are discharged before seeing a financial counselor receive both a phone call and a letter to alert them to the existence of the financial assistance program. Each bill sent for hospital services also contains contact information alerting patients that Texas Health has a charity care program.</p>

In addition, THR does daily cash sweeps of all controlled tax exempt entity cash accounts. As a result, THR has numerous daily transactions with controlled tax exempt entities, none of which fall within the scope of IRC Section 512(b)(13). A management fee is charged for the centralized services and reported on Form 990, Part VII, Section B as a professional services fee. Transactions with related tax exempt organizations falling within the meaning of centralized services as described above, are not listed on Schedule R, Part V, Line 2.
