BY-LAWS OF CRISTALIS INC.

Original Date of Adoption: February 20, 2005

ARTICLE I

Name and Object of Nonprofit Corporation

Section 1. Name. This nonprofit corporation shall be known as Cristalis Inc.

Section 2. Objects. The objects of the corporation shall be to engage in charitable activities including, but not limited to the development, establishment and implementation of programs that will improve the welfare of underprivileged individuals in various parts of the world.

ARTICLE II

Board of Directors

Section 1. Power of Board. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors. Directors need not be residents of Maryland.

Section 2. Board of Directors


2a. Number of Directors. The property, affairs, activities, and concerns of the corporation shall be vested in the Operational Board of Directors consisting of no fewer than seven (7) members and no more than seventeen (17) members. The number of directors may be set from time to time by amendment to the Bylaws. No decrease in the number of directors shall have the effect of shortening the term of any incumbent director. The Advisory Board of Directors shall consist of no fewer than three (3) members and no more than sixteen (16) members.

2b. Founders. The Founders, Shalini David, Elizabeth David, and Evon David shall remain members of the Operational and Advisory Boards throughout the lifetime of the organization.

Section 3. Election.

3a. Initial Directors. The first Board of Directors of the Corporation shall consist of those persons named as initial directors in the Articles of Incorporation. Such person shall hold office until the first annual election of directors. Thereafter, at each annual meeting of the Board of Directors, the Board shall elect directors.

3b. Election of Subsequent Directors. Directors shall be elected by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors at the annual meeting of the corporation or at any other meeting of the Board called for such purpose. If a Director or Directors are to be elected at any meeting other than the annual meeting, notice of such meeting shall be given in accordance with section 8 of

this Article II, provided, however, that such notice shall specify that a purpose of the meeting is the election of one or more Directors.

Section 4. Term of Directors. Each Director shall hold office for a term of three (3) years or until a successor is duly elected. The initial Directors shall be divided into three (3) approximately equal groups, one-third (1/3) of them to serve for an initial term of one (1) year, one-third (1/3) to serve for an initial term of two (2) years, and one-third (1/3) to serve for an initial term of three (3) years. No person shall serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms on the Board. Upon approval by the Board, a director may extend their term for one year to serve as immediate past president or immediate past treasurer. Persons serving an initial term of less than three (3) years may serve for two (2) additional three year terms. After serving the maximum time allowed, a person may again serve after being off the Board for one year.

Section 5a. Election/Vacancies. The officers shall consist of President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer and such additional vice presidents or assistant secretaries or assistant treasurers as the Board may from time to time appoint. The officers shall be elected by the Board, from among the Directors, at the first meeting of the Board following the annual meeting of the Corporation. Any vacancy occurring in any office, for whatever reason, shall be filled by the Board and any Director so elected shall fulfill the term of his/her predecessor.

Section 5b. Term. Officers shall serve a term of one 2-years and until their successors are elected, or until they are removed for cause. No officer shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same office.

Section 6. Removal of Directors. A director may be removed with or without cause at any time by action of the Board, provided that notice of the Board's proposed action is. Included in the notice of the meeting at which such vote is taken.

Section 7. Resignation. Except as otherwise required by law, any director of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board or to the President or Secretary of the Corporation. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified in such notice, or on receipt of the notice if no time is specified. Unless otherwise specified in the notice of resignation, no acceptance of such resignation shall be necessary to make it effective.

Section 8. Meetings. The Board will meet at least once a quarter and as often as necessary. Any one of the members of the board can call a meeting. Meetings will be scheduled at the end of every meeting. Board may act without a meeting if the members consent in writing.

Section 9. Meetings by conference Telephone (or Teleconference). Any or all directors may participate in a meeting of the board or of a committee of the Board by means of conference telephone or by any means of communications by which all persons

participating in the meeting are able to hear one another, and such participation shall be counted as presence in person at the meeting.

Section 10. Notice of Meeting. Notice may be given by written notice delivered personally or sent by mail, express delivery service, test, fax, or email to each Director at his or her address as shown by the records of the Corporation. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered three days after being deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage thereon unpaid. If notice be given by telegram, other commercial message deliver service, email or telephone call such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when transmitted by electronic facsimile equipment to the intended recipient's electronic facsimile number as shown in the records of the Corporation.

Section 11. Waiver of Notice. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting, therefore objecting to the meeting if it was not properly convened, either before or after the time notice would have been required. A Director's attendance at any meeting shall constitute his or her acceptance of such meeting and its purpose, except Director Meetings for the purpose of objecting to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Except as specifically required by the Articles, or these Bylaws, neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice, or waiver of notice, of such meeting.

Section 12. Informal Action by Directors. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all the directors authorizing the action. Such consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote. The signed documents setting forth such consent by all the directors shall be filed with the minutes of proceedings of the Board.

Section 13. Quorum. Unless a greater proportion is required by law or these Bylaws, a majority (one more than one-half) of the total number of Directors then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; provided, however, that in no event shall a quorum consist of less than one-third of the number of directors qualified to vote as provided in these Bylaws. Except as otherwise provided by law or by the Articles of Incorporation of these bylaws, the act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board.

Section 14. Committees. The Directors may create one or more committees, each of which shall include at least one (1) Director or one (1) Officer. The creation of a committee must be approved by a majority of all the directors in office. Each committee shall have the power designated to it by the Board of Directors; provided, however that in no event may a committee: (1) fill vacancies on the Board or any committee; (2) amend the Articles of Incorporation; (3) adopt, amend, or repeal the Bylaws; or (4) approve a plan of merger not requiring member approval. The President (Chairperson) will be a ex-officio member of all committees. The designation and appointment of any committee

and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual director, of any responsibility imposed upon it or him by law.

Section 15. Staff Report. Staff, either paid or unpaid, should report to one of the Directors with a frequency between once a week to once a month. The Director who receives the report is responsible to convey the report to the Board.

Section 16. Compensation of Directors. The corporation shall not pay any compensation to directors for services rendered to the corporation, except that directors may be reimbursed for expenses reasonably incurred in the performance of the duties to the corporation. A Director serving as a manager in another country will be reimbursed for living expenses and other costs pertaining to the management of the Corporation's subsidiary organization. A person serving as a director may not be compensated for services provided to the corporation in any other capacity. Board members should avoid conflicts of interest or even the appearance of conflict of interest, which would affect the public's perception of the organization.

ARTICLE III

Officers

Section 1. Titles. The officers of this corporation will consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers and assistant officer as may be determined by the Board. Any two (2) or more offices may be held by the same person except that the offices of President and Secretary shall be held by different people. The office of President and Vice-President cannot be held by the same person.

Section 2. Election and Term of Office. The officers shall be elected at each annual meeting of the Board. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Each person so elected shall hold office for the term for which he/she is elected. The election or appointment of an officer shall not of itself create contract rights.

Section 3. Term. An officer's term will be one (1) year unless the officer resigns before the one (1) year is completed or the Board decides with a majority vote that the person should be replaced. If the officer has completed his or her one (1) year term and is capable of continuing and has done a good job his or her one (1) year term the Board can vote to have the officer succeed himself/herself without limitation.

Section 4. Removal. Any officer may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interest of the corporation will be served thereby; provided, however, that removal of an officer shall be without prejudice to his contract rights, if any.

Section 5. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by the Board at any meeting.

Section 6. Powers and Duties of Officers. Subject to the control of the Board of Directors, all officers as between themselves and the corporation shall have such authority and perform such duties in the management of the property and affairs of the corporation as may be provided in these Bylaws or by resolution of the Board not inconsistent with these Bylaws and, to the extent not so provided, as generally pertain to their respective offices. The Directors of the Board will serve as officers until it is necessary to have separate officers at which time there may be amendments made to the Bylaws.

President. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and may also serve as the Chair of the Board of Directors, as needed. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and, subject to the supervision of the Board of Directors, shall perform all duties customary to that office and shall supervise and control all of the affairs of the Corporation in accordance with such policies and directives as may be established by the Board of Directors. The President may delegate authority and responsibility but shall remain fully accountable to the Board.

Vice-President. In the absence of the President or in the event of his/her inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President, and, when as acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The Vice-President shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Board of Directors may from time to time prescribe by standing or special resolution, or as the President may from time to time provide, subject to the powers and supervision of the Board of Directors.

Secretary. The Secretary shall be responsible for the keeping of an accurate record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Board of Directors, shall see to it that all notices required by these Bylaws or by law are given, and, in general, shall perform all duties customary to the office of Secretary. The Secretary will also perform other duties as assigned by the Board.

Chief Financial Officer. The CFO will have the custody of, and be responsible for, all funds and securities of the Corporation. The CFO will maintain the financial records of the corporation, he/she will prepare the financial statements and report to the Board about the corporation's financial status. The CFO shall annually cause proper audit of the books and accounts for the corporation. The treasurer will notify the President and Secretary of Sponsors that have not fulfilled their pledges for the month. CFO will be responsible for filing taxes for the corporation.

Section 7. Agents and Employees. The Board of Directors may appoint agents and employees who shall have such authority and perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Board. The Board may remove any agent or employee at any time with or without cause. Removal shall be without prejudice to such person's contract rights, if any. The appointment of such person as an agent or employee shall not itself create contract rights.

Section 8. Compensation of Officers, Agents and Employees. The Corporation may pay compensation in reasonable amounts to officers for services rendered such amounts to be approved by the Board. The corporation may pay compensation in reasonable amounts to agents and employees for services rendered, such amount to be approved by the Board or, if the Board delegate such power to any officer or officers, the by such officer or officers. The Board may require officers, agents or employees to give security for the faithful performance of their duties, for which they shall be reimbursed.

ARTICLE IV Membership

Membership. Christalis Inc. shall not have any members. The nonprofit corporation shall be governed entirely by the Board as stated in these By-laws.

ARTICLE V Miscellaneous


Section 1. Fiscal year. The fiscal year of the corporation shall be the calendar year unless otherwise determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Loans, Etc. All checks, drafts, loans or other orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation shall be signed by such officer or agent of the Corporation and in such manner as shall be from time to time determined by the Board. The Board may delegate this power to the President, on such terms as it prescribes. In the absence of such determination, such instruments shall be signed by one of the Co-Founders.
