(a) Starting in late June 2014, for a period of up to one year, the Vice President is serving as executive director of an unaffiliated local nonprofit organization. During this period, the Vice President continues to be an employee of the Boettcher Foundation and receives her compensation and benefits from the Boettcher Foundation. The unaffiliated nonprofit organization reimburses the Boettcher Foundation for the portion of time that the Vice President serves as their executive director but does not reimburse for benefits. The Boettcher Foundation pays 100% of the Vice President's benefits. The compensation reported above represents the compensation earned in her capacity as Vice President of the Boettcher Foundation. For the period from January through June 2014, 100% of the Vice President's time was devoted to the Boettcher Foundation. From July to December 2014, approximately 20% of the Vice President's time was devoted to the Boettcher Foundation.

The Boettcher Foundation provides grants in support of its mission to effectively assist, encourage and promote a better quality of life for the citizens of Colorado. The Foundation's four grant-making areas are:

- Capital grants - We seek to make grants for the purchase, construction or major renovation of buildings that are owned or used by Colorado 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations. Our three target areas are community enrichment, social services and education.
- Scholarships – Each year our highly competitive, merit based Scholarship program awards 40, four-year undergraduate scholarships for students to attend college in Colorado. The virtually full-ride scholarship includes tuition, books, fees and a living stipend.
- Teacher training – The Boettcher Teacher Residency recruits and trains individuals to become exceptional teachers by providing an intensive and supportive teacher training program that combines master's-level coursework with hands-on learning guided by a skilled mentor teacher in a K-12 classroom.
- Biomedical research – Our Webb-Waring Biomedical Research program funds the work of early-career scientists in the biomedical sciences in Colorado. Boettcher Investigators are awarded grants covering up to three years of research.
