- The Lemelson Foundation agreed to the restructuring and exchanged its E+Co debt for available cash and ownership in Persistent Energy Partners Fund, LLC; Non-Core Liquidation, LLC; and Outsourced Assets, LLC. The Lemelson Foundation holds no further ownership interest in E+Co.
- The Lemelson Foundation received 1.586% of each of the LLCs as its pro rata ownership interest. Creditors, including The Lemelson Foundation, may recover additional funds as the assets in the LLCs are liquidated.
