**Memorandum of Understanding
Between the Board of Regents of the
Nevada System of Higher Education
and the
Harry and Rebecca Lahr Foundation**

Revised ~ September 2007

Establishment of the Funds

This Memorandum of Understanding ("Memorandum") between The Harry and Rebecca Lahr Foundation ("Foundation") and the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education, on behalf of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, ("University"), concerns the Foundation's financial commitment toward scholarships and fellowships to be awarded for use at the University.

This Memorandum between the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education and the Foundation contains the entire agreement between the Foundation and the Board of Regents concerning the provisions of the Foundation's financial commitment.

The uses of this fund shall be consistent with the policies of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The fund shall be used only for a qualified charitable purpose consistent with the laws of the state of Nevada and the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.

Procedures

The Foundation hereby pledges to provide annual funding for Scholarships and Fellowships totaling up to five percent (5%) of the value of the Foundation, or more, to the University for the purposes outlined in this Memorandum. The Foundation will evaluate funding this year to year commitment on an annual basis.

The Foundation will make a partial payment of the annual contribution prior to the start of the Fall Trimester of each year, and final payment of the remaining amount prior to December 31, covering the funding of the Spring and Summer Trimesters.

The Harry & Rebecca Lahr Foundation

The Harry & Rebecca Lahr Foundation is an established, tax-exempt charity presently under the control of its "Trustee", William C. Scoble, or his assignee(s).

The Foundation shall maintain total control of all funds within the Foundation, which includes the right to invest funds. The Foundation maintains the right to pay all expenses including Trustee fees. The Foundation will follow all appropriate laws and regulations pertaining to the operation of a 501 (c) (3) organization.

The purpose of the Foundation is to fund Scholarships, Fellowships, or other appropriate funding within the medical educational community.

All monies ("Scholarships" and/or "Fellowships") provided to the University by the Foundation are to be used only for scholarships and/or fellowships as described herein, in the year and trimester of designation. Any monies provided but not used due to subsequent ineligibility shall be returned to the Foundation.

Uses and Purposes of the Harry & Rebecca Lahr Scholarships

Monies presented by the Foundation are to be used to provide financial support for students who are enrolled full time at the University and majoring in the undergraduate and/or the graduate programs in the School of Nursing.

Undergraduate students in the School of Nursing must be enrolled for a minimum of twelve (12) undergraduate credit hours for each trimester in which they receive an award of a Scholarship. Graduate students in the School of Nursing must be enrolled for a minimum of nine (9) graduate credit hours (MSN program) or six (6) graduate credit hours (PhD program) for each trimester in which they receive an award of a Scholarship or a Fellowship.

Recipients must have a cumulative GPA at the University of at least 3.0 as an undergraduate and a 3.5 as a graduate in each trimester in which they receive an award.

Students may receive an award in more than one year, although awards will not be made for more than one academic year at a time, with trimester review. Scholarship recipients must reapply on an annual basis; except when no trimester break occurs. Previously awarded recipients must complete a new Application Form and Disclosure Document to be considered for continuance (new letters of recommendation, statement of intent, and transcript will not be required). Preference will be given to former recipients.

Scholarship requirements and applications process will be reviewed annually and adjusted appropriately. The award amounts can be changed by the Trustee on a yearly basis.

In each trimester, student tuition and fees for each recipient will be paid by the office of Student Financial Services with any refund of funds in excess of such tuition and fees, including any balance of Lahr Scholarship funds, going directly to the recipient to be used for books, other educational fees, and living expenses.

Scholarship recipients will be selected on a merit basis. Although merit will be the prime consideration for the granting of Scholarships, financial need can be taken into consideration in the selection process.

In-state undergraduate candidates will be given preference for Scholarships.

The method to be used for application will be determined by the Trustees of the Lahr Foundation. This method will include distribution of an application package, including a required Application Form (a sample whereof is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"), completion of a Financial Aid Disclosure and Waiver of Confidentiality form (a sample whereof is attached hereto as Exhibit "B"), three (3) letters of recommendation from UNLV School of Nursing Faculty, and a statement of interest, as well as an official transcript. Final award selections will be confirmed by the Trustee and his assignee(s).

Uses and Purposes of the Harry & Rebecca Lahr Graduate Fellowship

The Foundation agrees to fund one (1) Graduate Fellowship ("Lahr Nursing Fellowship") initiating in the 2007 Fall Trimester with a PhD candidate preferred. Fellowship candidates will complete the same application packet as Scholarship candidates. The Lahr Fellowship recipient will be confirmed by the Trustee and his assignee(s) and will be known as a Lahr Nursing Fellow.

This commitment is in the amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) per year for a maximum of three (3) to four (4) years, as long as the recipient is; attending UNLV full time (MSN 9 credits) or (PhD 6 credits), a confirmed twelve (12) month full time Graduate Assistant in the School of Nursing, and making satisfactory progress toward the MSN or PhD degree as determined by annual review by the Trustee of the Foundation and his assignee(s).

The Foundation will provide annual funding of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) prior to the Fall Trimester, and an additional thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000.00) prior to December 31st covering the funding of sixty-five hundred dollars (\$6,500.00) for the Spring Trimester and sixty-five hundred dollars (\$6,500.00) for the Summer Trimester. The Lahr Foundation Fellowship funds will be deposited with the University of Nevada, Las Vegas Student Financial Services Office for distribution to the selected Lahr Nursing Fellow. It is understood that the entire funding amount as provided by the Lahr Foundation will go to the named Lahr Nursing Fellow once all UNLV tuition obligations have been satisfied.

Change of Conditions

If, at some future date, circumstances within the University should change, e.g., elimination of the recipient schools, so that the uses and purposes for which this scholarship program has been established are no longer appropriate and/or possible, and/or are in conflict with the policies of the Board of Regents or the University, the Trustee of the Foundation will have the authority to redesign the purpose of the Lahr Foundation Scholarship and Fellowship program.

Although the agreement herein states the Foundation's commitment for Scholarships and Fellowships as annual, it is the intention of the Trustee of the Foundation to maintain the Scholarship and Fellowship commitment with continued success.
