Note 1 - Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Activities

North America Indian Mission Inc. dba North America Indigenous Ministries is located in Sumas, Washington and is a multicultural team that exists to glorify God through building the Church by making disciples among North American Indigenous peoples, to reach the world for Christ. The Organization was incorporated as a not-for-profit religious corporation under the laws of the State of Washington in 1949 as Marine Medical Mission, Inc. and changed its name to North America Indian Mission, Inc. in 1965. Substantially all revenue is from contributions.

The combined financial statements include the accounts of The Thetis Foundation. The Thetis Foundation is governed by a common board and exists for the benefit of the combined organization. All significant inter-organization transactions and accounts are eliminated. There are no external restrictions on distributions from the controlled organization to the reporting organization that would result in unavailability of net assets for use by the reporting organization.

Basis of Accounting

The Organization presents financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. This basis of accounting involves the application of accrual accounting; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

Basis of Presentation

Generally accepted accounting principles require the Organization to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Unrestricted net assets - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily restricted net assets - Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met either by actions of the Organization and/or the passage of time.

Permanently restricted net assets - Permanently restricted net assets must be maintained by the Organization in perpetuity, the income of which is expendable for operations. Permanently restricted net assets increase when the Organization receives contributions for which donor-imposed restrictions limiting the Organization's use of an asset for its economic benefits neither expire with the passage of time nor can be removed by the Organization meeting certain requirements. The Organization had no permanently restricted net assets at December 31, 2014 and 2013.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates. Significant estimates include useful lives of property and equipment, fair value of marketable securities, net realizable value of contributions receivable, and allocation of expenses to programs.

Cash

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes time deposits, money market accounts, certificates of deposit, and all highly liquid debt instruments with original maturities of three months or less that are not restricted by donors for capital or long term purposes.

Property, Equipment, and Depreciation

Property and equipment purchases are stated at cost. Donated assets are stated at fair market value at date of receipt. Donated services that enhance non-financial assets are capitalized at fair market value at the date the services are provided. Depreciation is provided by use of the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets ranging from four to five years for equipment and vehicles and thirty to forty years for buildings. All acquisitions of property and equipment in excess of \$1,000 and all expenditures for repairs, maintenance, renewals, and betterments that materially prolong the useful lives of assets are capitalized. Depreciation expense for the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013 was \$16,650 and \$15,383, respectively.

Marketable Equity Securities

In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, the Organization reports its investments at market value determined using published quotes as of the close of business. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the statement of activities as increases or decreases in unrestricted net assets unless the use of the assets received is limited by donor-imposed restrictions. Donor-restricted investment income is reported as an increase in temporarily restricted net assets or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the type of restriction. Gains or losses upon disposition of securities are based on the net proceeds and the adjusted stated amount of the securities sold, using the specific-identification method. At December 31, 2014 and 2013, unrestricted marketable securities were \$911,035 and \$1,202,414, respectively, and restricted marketable securities were \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

The Organization records a receivable for costs advanced to mission personnel programs. An allowance for doubtful accounts is provided based on management's best estimate of probable losses inherent in the accounts receivable balance. Management primarily determines the allowance based upon review of specific accounts and historical loss experience. Uncollectible accounts are charged against the allowance when it is evident that the likelihood of collection is remote. Delinquency is determined based upon agreed terms.

Accrued Compensated Absences

Mission personnel are compensated based on designated support less expenses. Therefore, no amounts are accrued for vacation or sick pay.

Federal Income Tax

The Organization is exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) except to the extent of unrelated business taxable income, if any.

Contributions Received

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Donor restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are treated as unrestricted support. Gains, losses and other income earned on donor restricted assets are reported as unrestricted income unless donor restrictions exist to the contrary. Donations of long-lived assets, in the absence of donor-imposed use restrictions, are reported as unrestricted support.

All other donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Donated Services and Materials

The Organization recognizes donated services that create or enhance nonfinancial assets. Donated services that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation are also recognized.

Many people have contributed significant amounts of time to the activities of the Organization without compensation. The financial statements do not reflect the value of those contributed services because, although clearly substantial, the services do not meet the recognition criteria required by generally accepted accounting principles and no reliable basis exists for determining an appropriate value for those services. Donated materials are included in the financial statements at their estimated fair market values as of the date of their receipt.

Note 2 - Concentrations

Amounts on deposit with U.S. or Canadian banks may occasionally exceed the insurance limits of \$250,000, for U.S. institutions and \$100,000 for Canadian institutions, or be held in uninsured money market accounts. It is the Organization's policy to evaluate the financial condition of the institutions in which funds are on deposit on a regular basis to determine the extent of credit risk for deposits in excess of insurance limits. Bank balances on deposit in excess of insurance limits were \$304,419 and \$74,046 as of the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013, respectively. In 2013 all of the funds were invested in fixed income insured certificates of deposit.

During the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013, a small number of donors each made contributions in excess of \$20,000 totaling approximately \$60,000 and \$130,000, respectively. A concentration is defined as any financial transaction or group of transactions or relationships with a contributor, vendor, or other party for which a financial impact would be recognized in the absence of the transactions or relationship for the year under consideration. No individual donors including churches or estates gave more than \$35,000. No other concentrations were identified during the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013.

Note 5 - Leases

Operating Leases

Facility lease payments included in expense for the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013 were \$12,839 and \$16,586, respectively. The lease term commenced April 1, 2011 and was renewed for an additional three year term starting in 2014 at a rate negotiated at the time of renewal. In the normal course of business, operating leases are generally renewed or replaced by other leases.

Note 6 - Related Party Transactions

North America Indian Mission of Canada (NAIM Canada) is a separate legal entity that works closely with the Organization and carries out similar operations in Canada. The purpose and mission of both entities is the same. The Boards of each entity are comprised of different individuals. However, operating results and financial position may be influenced by actions of the Boards of either entity. The amounts due to NAIM Canada are non-interest bearing and have no specific terms of repayment. The amount represents a timing difference related to payment of expenses or receipt of funds in advance of payment of funds raised for NAIM Canada staff. Total support provided to NAIM Canada was \$1,274,938 and \$1,248,869 in 2014 and 2013 respectively. The amounts are included in contributions and gifts in the Combined Statements of Activities and are allocated to programs, administration and fundraising in accordance with their use by NAIM Canada in the Combined Statements of Activities and the Combined Schedules of Functional Expenses.

Note 7 - Defined Contribution Plan

The Organization participates in a defined contribution pension plan allowed under Internal Revenue Code section 403(b). Full-time staff may participate upon the effective date of employment. For the years ended December 31, 2014 and 2013, the amount of retirement plan expense representing contributions made by the Organization, not through salary reduction agreements, was \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Note 8 - Subsequent Events

Management has considered and found no subsequent events requiring recognition or disclosure in the financial statements occurring after the balance sheet date until April 1, 2015, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
