ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I.

NAME

The name of this Corporation shall be THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE II.

DURATION

The period of this Corporation's duration is perpetual unless dissolved by operation of law or otherwise.

ARTICLE III.

PURPOSES

This Corporation is organized exclusively for educational, charitable, religious, scientific, and/or literary purposes, all within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended from time to time (the "Code"), including, but not limited to, making disbursements to qualifying organizations.

ARTICLE IV.

POWERS

Subject only to such limitations as now or hereafter are prescribed by law or in the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws, the Corporation shall have all powers which now or hereafter are conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes previously stated in this Article IV or are necessary or incidental to the powers so conferred. Specifically, subject only to such limitations, the Corporation may:

- Take by bequest, devise, gift, grant, purchase, lease or otherwise any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to amount or value, and hold, administer, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of any such property and invest, reinvest, or deal with the principal and the income thereof, all in such manner as, in the judgment of the directors, will further the Corporation's purposes;
- Aid, support and assist by gifts, contributions or otherwise, other corporations, community chests, funds and foundations which qualify as exempt organizations under Code Section 501(c)(3) as long as such aid, support or assistance is in furtherance of the

Corporation's purposes; and

(c) Engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of the Corporation's purposes, either directly or indirectly and either alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, whether such others be persons or organizations of any kind or nature.

ARTICLE V.

NO MEMBERS

This Corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE VI.

LIMITATIONS

Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation, this Corporation shall not conduct or carry on activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code. No part of the net carnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any director, officer or other private individual, except that the Corporation may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to it and make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be devoted to the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except as may be permitted Section 501(c)(3) organizations by the Code, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE VII.

REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The registered office of this Corporation is 3511 S. Chelsea Court, Spokane, Washington 99203. The registered agent of the Corporation at such address is Lawrence R. Small.

ARTICLE VIII.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The management of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number of Directors and the method of scleeting the Directors, shall be fixed by the Bylaws of the Corporation; provided, however, that there shall be no less than three (3) Directors and no more than five (5) Directors, and the names and addresses of the present members of the Board of Directors are as follows:

ARTICLE IX,

LIMITATION OF DIRECTOR LIABILITY

Except to the extent otherwise required by applicable law (as presently in effect and as hereafter amended), a director of the Corporation shall not be personally liable to this Corporation for monetary damages for conduct as a director, except for liability of the director (i) for acts or omissions which involve intentional misconduct by the director or a knowing violation of law by the director or (ii) for any transaction from which the director personally receives a benefit in money, property or services to which the director is not legally entitled. If the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act or the Washington Business Corporation Act is amended to authorize further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors, then the liability of a director of the Corporation shall be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act and the Washington Business Corporation Act, as so amended, without any requirement of further action by the Corporation or its directors.

No amendment to or repeal of this Article shall adversely affect any right of protection of any director of the Corporation occurring after the date of the adoption of this Article and prior to such amendment or repeal.

ARTICLE X.

INDEMNIFICATION

The Corporation shall indemnify any director of the Corporation who is involved in any capacity in a proceeding (as defined in RCW 23B.08.500, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended) by reason of the position held by such person or entity in the Corporation, to the full extent allowed by law, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended. By means of a resolution or of a contract specifically approved by the Board of Directors, the Corporation may indemnify an officer, employee or agent to such degree as the Board of Directors determines to be reasonable, appropriate and consistent with applicable law and to be in the best interests of the Corporation. Reasonable expenses incurred by a director, who is involved in any capacity in a proceeding by reason of the position held in the Corporation, shall be advanced by the Corporation to the full extent allowed by and on the conditions required by applicable law, as

presently in effect and as hereafter amended, unless and until it is determined that such person is not entitled to be indemnified.

The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall have the right to designate the counsel who shall defend any person or entity that may be entitled to indemnification, to approve any settlement, and to approve in advance any expense. The rights conferred by or pursuant to this Article shall not be exclusive of any other rights which any person may have or acquire under any applicable law (as presently in effect and as hereafter amended), these Amended and Restated Articles of incorporation, the Bylaws of the Corporation, a vote of the Board of Directors of the Corporation, or otherwise. No amendment to or repeal of this Article shall adversely affect any right of any director, officer, employee or agent for events occurring after the date of the adoption of this Article and prior to such amendment or repeal.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, no indemnification shall be provided to any person if, in the opinion of counsel, payment of such indemnification would cause the Corporation to lose its tax exempt status, if any, from federal income taxation.

ARTICLE XI.

INTEREST OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, OR OTHERS IN TRANSACTIONS WITH THIS CORPORATION

Any officer or director (hereinafter referred to generally as "interested persons") individually, or any firm of which any interested person is a partner, or any private firm of which any interested person may be an officer, director, employee or holder of any amount of its capital stock or other ownership interest, may be a party to or may be interested in any contract or transaction of this Corporation and, in the absence of actual fraud, no such contract or other transaction shall be thereby affected, impeached or invalidated.

No interested person shall be liable to account to this Corporation for any profit realized by him or her from or through any such transaction or contract, provided that such contract or transaction shall be approved or ratified by the affirmative vote of directors who are not so interested constituting a majority of a quorum of directors present at a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation having authority in the premises.

Directors interested in any contracts or transactions of the types described in the foregoing paragraphs may be counted when present at meetings of the Board of Directors or of any committee for the purpose of determining the existence of a quorum to consider and vote upon any such contract or transaction.

ARTICLE XII.

DISTRIBUTIONS UPON DISSOLUTION

No director, trustee or officer of the Corporation, nor any other private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of this Corporation or the winding up of its affairs. Upon dissolution or winding up of the Corporation,

after paying or making adequate provision for payment of all of its liabilities, all remaining assets of the Corporation shall be distributed by the Board of Directors to one or more nonprofit funds, foundations or corporations that are organized and duly operated exclusively for educational, charitable, religious, scientific and/or literary purposes, within the meaning of the Code, and which at that time qualify for tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of Spokane County, Washington, for the purposes set forth in Article III of these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation or to such organization or organizations as the Superior Court of Spokane County shall determine to be organized and operated for purposes similar to that of the Corporation.

ARTICLE XIII.

PRIVATE FOUNDATION

At any time during which this Corporation is classified as a "private foundation," as that term is defined by Section 509 of the Code, the following provisions shall apply in the management of its affairs:

- 1. The Corporation shall distribute its income for each tax year at a time and in a manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code;
- 2. The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code;
- 3. The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code;
- 4. The Corporation shall not make any investments in the manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code; and
- 5. The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE XIV. BYLAWS

The Board of Directors shall adopt the initial Bylaws of the Corporation. Except to the extent otherwise provided in the Bylaws of the Corporation, the authority to make, alter, amend or repeal the Bylaws of the Corporation is vested in the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XV.

AMENDMENTS

These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation may be amended only by a majority vote of the Directors.

ARTICLE XVI.

STATEMENT

These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation correctly set forth without change the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation, as amended, and these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation supersede the original Articles of Incorporation and all amendments thereto.

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

OF

THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION

The Board of Directors of THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION adopted a resolution on July _____, 2014, which amended and restated its Bylaws, and the following constitute the Amended and Restated Bylaws of THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION. These Amended and Restated Bylaws correctly and completely set forth the Bylaws of THE E.S. BERGQUIST FOUNDATION and supersede all prior Bylaws, amended or restated.

Article 1. Members

The Corporation shall have no members.

Article 2. Board of Directors

- 2.1 <u>Powers</u>. The management of all the affairs, property and interests of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors.
- 2.2 <u>Number</u>. The number of directors will be as determined from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors, but shall not be less than three (3) nor more than five (5) in number, provided that any change in number which necessitates the removal of one or more directors shall require a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all the directors.
- 2.3 <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected at each annual meeting by vote of the majority of the directors then in office and shall serve until their successors have been duly elected and qualified. Directors may be reelected to serve more than one term in office.
- 2.4 <u>Vacancies</u>. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Directors, at a regular or special meeting, and the new director shall complete the term of the director he or she is replacing.
- 2.5 Removal; Resignation. Any director may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the whole Board of Directors represented in person at a meeting of directors at which a quorum is present. For purposes of this paragraph, two-thirds (2/3) of the whole Board of Directors shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum. Any director may resign his or her office as director at any time by mailing or otherwise delivering a written resignation to the Secretary of the Corporation, who shall advise the Board of Directors of such resignation. Such resignation may also include any office he or she holds as an officer of the Corporation.

- Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at the registered office of the Corporation or at such other place or places, either within or outside the State of Washington, as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate. The annual meeting shall be held in ________ at such time and place as the Board of Directors shall designate by written notice. In addition to the annual meeting, there shall be regular meetings of the Board of Directors held, with proper notice, not less frequently than once each calendar quarter.
- 2.7 <u>Special Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called at any time by the President or by the Secretary upon written request by any two directors. Such meetings shall be held at the registered office of the Corporation or at such other place or places as the directors may from time to time designate.
- 2.8 <u>Notice</u>. Notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given to each director at least three (3) days' prior to the meeting by telegram, by letter, by email (as specified in Article 4 of these Bylaws) or in person. Unless otherwise required by these Bylaws or applicable law, such notice need not specify the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, the meeting. If meetings are scheduled on a regular basis and the date and place of any such meeting is announced at a prior regularly scheduled meeting, no additional notice shall be necessary.
- 2.9 Quorum. Except as otherwise provided for in these Bylaws, a majority of the whole Board of Directors shall be necessary and sufficient at meetings to constitute a quorum, but if less than a majority of the directors are present at any meeting, the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.
- 2.10 <u>Voting</u>. Each director shall have one (1) vote. If the matter before the Board simply requires a majority of the whole Board of Directors to be present to constitute a quorum, then a majority vote of those directors present shall constitute corporate approval. All voting shall be by each director in person, whether by telephone or otherwise, and voting by proxy shall not be allowed.
- 2.11 <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. A waiver of notice signed by the director or directors, whether before or after the time stated for the meeting, shall be equivalent to the giving of notice.
- 2.12 <u>Registered Dissent</u>. A director who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which action on a corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to such action unless the director's dissent or abstention shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting, or the director shall file a written dissent or abstention to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof, or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the Corporation immediately after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right to dissent or abstain shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.
- 2.13 <u>Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may appoint, from time to time, standing or temporary committees. Subject to the limitations set forth in Section 2.14, such committees may be

vested with such powers as the Board may determine by resolution receiving two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which a quorum is present. Unless otherwise directed by the Board of Directors, all committees shall be governed by the same provisions as govern the meetings, actions without meetings, notice and waiver of notice, quorum and voting requirements, and standards of conduct of the Board of Directors. All committees shall keep regular minutes of the transactions of their meetings and shall cause them to be recorded in books kept for that purpose in the office of the Corporation. The designation of any such committee and the delegation of authority thereto, shall not relieve the Board of Directors, or any member thereof, of any responsibility imposed by law.

- 2.14 <u>Limitations on Committees</u>. No committee shall have the authority of the Board of Directors in reference to amending, altering, or repealing these Bylaws; electing, appointing, or removing any member of any such committee or any director or officer of the Corporation; amending the Articles of Incorporation; adopting a plan of merger or adopting a plan of consolidation with another corporation; authorizing the sale, lease, or exchange of all or substantially all of the property and assets of the Corporation other than in the ordinary course of business; authorizing the voluntary dissolution of the Corporation or adopting a plan for the distribution of assets of the Corporation; or amending, altering, or repealing any resolution of the Board of Directors.
- 2.15 <u>Remuneration</u>. No stated salary shall be paid directors, as such, for their service, but by resolution of the Board of Directors, a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of such Board; provided, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor. Members of special or standing committees may be allowed like compensation for attending committee meetings.
 - 2.16 Loans. No loans shall be made by the Corporation to any director.
- 2.17 <u>Attendance by Communications Equipment</u>. The directors may participate in a meeting by means of any communications equipment which enables all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other simultaneously during the meeting. A director who participates by means of communications equipment is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.
- 2.18 Action by Directors without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the directors, or of a committee thereof, may be taken without a meeting by a consent either in writing or by electronic transmission (as defined in Section 5.1 of these Bylaws) setting forth the action to be taken, of all the directors, or all of the members of the committee, as the case may be, before such action is taken. Such consent shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote. Any such action may also be ratified after it has been taken, either at a meeting of the directors or by unanimous written consent.
- 2.19 <u>Minutes</u>. Minutes of all proceedings of the Board of Directors shall be maintained by the Secretary and shall not be disclosed to any person other than the directors except by direction of the Board of Directors. Unless otherwise directed by the Board of Directors, the Corporation's accountant and attorney may inspect the minutes in connection with their respective responsibilities.

Article 3. Officers

- 3.1 <u>Designations</u>. The officers of the Corporation shall be the President, one or more Vice-Presidents as authorized by the Board of Directors, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. Any two (2) offices may be held by the same person.
- 3.2 <u>The President</u>. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, shall have general supervision over the affairs of the Corporation, shall prepare an agenda for meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office or are properly required of the President by the Board of Directors.
- 3.3 <u>Vice President</u>. Each Vice President, if any, shall perform such duties as the Board of Directors may designate.
- 3.4 <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall issue notices for all meetings, shall keep minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors, shall have charge of the corporate books, and shall make such reports and perform such other duties as are incident to the office, or are properly required of the Secretary by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may appoint an Assistant Secretary, or Assistant Secretaries, who shall perform all of the duties of the Secretary in the absence or disability of the Secretary, and at other times may perform such other duties as are directed by the Board of Directors.
- 3.5 The Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have the custody of all monies and securities of the Corporation and shall keep regular books of account. The Treasurer shall disburse the funds of the Corporation in payment of the just demands against the Corporation or as may be ordered by the Board of Directors (taking proper vouchers for such disbursements) and shall render to the Board of Directors from time to time as may be required, an account of all transactions undertaken as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office or are properly required by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may appoint an Assistant Treasurer, or Assistant Treasurers, who shall perform all of the duties of the Treasurer in the absence or disability of the Treasurer, and at other times may perform such other duties as are directed by the Board of Directors.
- 3 6 Other Officers. The Board of Directors may appoint such other officers or agents as it shall deem necessary or expedient, who shall hold their offices for such terms and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as shall be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- 3.7 Appointment and Term of Office. The officers of the Corporation shall be appointed annually by the Board of Directors at the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors at which newly elected directors take office. If the election of officers is not held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as is convenient. New offices may be created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office until his or her successor has been duly elected and qualified.

- 3.8 <u>Removal</u>. Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed with or without cause by a vote of the majority of the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interest of the Corporation would be served thereby. Such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.
- 3.9 <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.
 - 3.10 Loans. No loan shall be made by the Corporation to any officer.
- 3.11 <u>Bonds</u>. The Board of Directors may require any officer, agent or employee of the Corporation to provide bonds to the Corporation, with surety or sureties acceptable to the Board, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices, with the premium therefor to be paid by the Corporation.

Article 4. Notices

- 4.1 <u>In General</u>. Except as may otherwise be required by law, any notice to any director may be delivered personally, by electronic transmission pursuant to Section 4.2, or by mail. If mailed, the notice shall be deemed to have been delivered when deposited in the United States mail, addressed to the addressee at his or her last known address in the records of the Corporation, postage prepaid.
- 4.2 <u>Consent to Notice by Electronic Transmission</u>. Any notice provided under these Bylaws may be sent by means of an electronic communication (a) not directly involving the physical transfer of information in a writing (which does not include an electronic transmission), facsimile, or a physical reproduction, each on paper or on other tangible material ("tangible medium") and (b) that may be retained, retrieved and reviewed by the sender and the recipient of the information, and that may be directly reproduced in a tangible medium ("electronic transmission"), provided that the director has consented either in a tangible medium or electronic transmission to the receipt of notices by electronic submission and said consent of the director designates the message format accessible to said director and the address, location or system to which these notices may be electronically transmitted.
- 4.3 Revocation of Consent to Notice by Electronic Transmission. A director may revoke any consent to receiving electronically transmitted notices by delivering a revocation to the Corporation either in a tangible medium or electronic transmission. Any consent of a director is deemed revoked if the Corporation is unable to electronically transmit two consecutive notices in accordance with the terms of the director's consent and the inability to provide notice becomes known to the Secretary.

Article 5. Depositories

The monies of the Corporation shall be deposited in the name of the Corporation in such bank or banks or trust company or trust companies as the Board of Directors shall designate, and

shall be drawn from such accounts only by check or other order for payment of money signed by such persons, in such manner, as may be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Article 6. Seal

The seal of the Corporation, if any, shall be in such form and bear such inscription as may be adopted by resolution of the Board of Directors, or by usage of the officers on behalf of the Corporation.

Article 7. Books and Records

The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors; and shall keep at its registered office or principal place of business, or at the office of its transfer agent or registrar, a record of its directors, giving the names and addresses of all directors.

Article 8. Exempt Activities

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, no director, officer, employee, or representative of this Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity, by or on behalf of the Corporation, not permitted to be taken or carried on without penalty, by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and applicable regulations thereunder, as they now exist, or as they should hereafter be amended.

Article 9. Indemnification and Insurance

- 9.1 <u>Director Liability</u>. A director of the Corporation shall not be personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for conduct as a director except for liability of the director for: (i) acts or omissions that involve intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of law by the director, or (ii) any transaction from which the director will personally receive a benefit of money, property, or services to which the director is not legally entitled. If applicable law is amended to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of directors, then the liability of a director of the Corporation shall be eliminated or limited to the fullest extent permitted by law, as so amended. Any repeal or modification of the foregoing paragraph by the directors of the Corporation shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.
- 9.2 <u>Indemnification of Directors and Officers</u>. Unless restricted in the Articles of Incorporation, this Corporation shall indemnify its directors and officers against all liability, damage, or expense resulting from the fact that such person is or was a director or officer, to the fullest extent, to the maximum amount and under all circumstances permitted by applicable law as then in effect.
- 9.3 <u>Indemnification of Employees and Agents.</u> The Corporation may, by action of its Board of Directors from time to time, provide indemnification and pay expenses in advance of the final disposition of a proceeding to employees and agents of the Corporation with the same scope and

effect as the provisions of this Article with respect to the indemnification of directors and officers of the Corporation.

- 9.4 <u>Insurance</u>. This Corporation shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is, or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of this Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of this Corporation as an officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, other enterprise, or employee benefit plan against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity or arising out of his/her status as such, whether or not this Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.
- 9.5 <u>Nonexclusive</u>. The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such director, officer, employee or agent may be entitled apart from the provisions of this Article 9.

Article 10. Amendments

The Board of Directors shall have power to make, alter, amend, and repeal the Bylaws of this Corporation.
