Matching Gift Program Summary

Scholarship Program Summary

The Foundation Scholarship Program was established in 1996 to reward the academic excellence of children of Subaru of America, Inc. employees and to encourage them to further their education. Since that time, 320 scholarships have been awarded totaling \$628,000. Scholarship awards range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.
