With respect to other University officers, deans and key employees, each year prior comparability data from peer institutions is collected and summarized for review by the President (nine comparable doctoral class institutions of similar size, scope and organizational complexity, locally and nationally, used as comparators for several academic and financial scopes across the university). This data obtained via survey is used by the President to present compensation adjustments to the University's independent Compensation Committee of the Board of Trustees. The competitive data obtained is also used when determining compensation offers for new hires at the executive level. Once this data is collected and presented for approval by the Compensation Committee and the Board of Trustees, documentation of the surrounding discussions and decisions is prepared by the Special Assistant to the Board of Trustees and filed with the University Archivist, along with the related minutes of the meetings for historical record. The University further has a robust performance evaluation process in place, the results of which are considered during the compensation determination process. The University's President does not take part in Board voting relating to matters involving his compensation, benefits and other terms and conditions of his employment, or participate in or attend Board meetings and discussions relating thereto, except at times when responding to questions from the Compensation Committee.
