THE LENFEST FOUNDATION HAS NO KNOWLEDGE OF HOW EACH BOARD MEMBER ADVISES THE DONOR ADVISED FUND TO CONTRIBUTE THEIR SHARE OF THIS CONTRIBUTION. THIS CONTRIBUTION HAS BEEN TREATED AS A "QUALIFYING DISTRIBUTION". THIS ARRANGEMENT IS NOT COMPENSATORY IN NATURE - THE BOARD MEMBERS DO NOT HAVE THE OPTION OF BEING PAID THESE FUNDS AS COMPENSATION. IT IS SIMPLY AN ARRANGEMENT TO PERMIT BOARD MEMBERS TO FUND CHARITIES OF THEIR OWN CHOOSING WITHOUT HAVING TO HAVE THESE CONSTRIBUTIONS APPROVED BY THE BOARD. IN THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED 6/30/2015, THIS \$150,000 WAS LESS THAN 2.5% OF THE GRANTS PAID OUT BY THIS FOUNDATION.

# The Lenfest Foundation, Inc. Corporate Action of the Board of Directors

The undersigned, constituting all of the Directors of the Board of Directors of The Lenfest Foundation, Inc., a Pennsylvania Non-Profit Corporation ("Corporation"), hereby consent to and adopt the following resolutions in accordance with the powers granted to the Directors under the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Corporation and the Pennsylvania Non-Profit Corporation Law of 1988, as amended.

WHEREAS, the Lenfest College Scholarship Program supports high school students from rural areas of Pennsylvania and is not in any way connected to the new focus areas of the Foundation in Philadelphia, and H.F. (Gerry) Lenfest, as Founder, has recommended that the Scholarship Program be shifted to a new non-profit organization so that it might survive and continue as a legacy program beyond the termination date of The Lenfest Foundation; and

WHEREAS, with the help and guidance of Dr. Keith Leaphart (Chair of the Board) and Daniel Porterfield (Foundation Board member who oversees the Scholarship Program), Mr. Lenfest has begun to develop a plan for the continued existence of this legacy program and now asks that the Articles and Article VIII of the Foundation Bylaws be changed to eliminate a termination gift of remaining assets to the Scholarship Program. He also asks that Wilson College be dropped from the group of schools listed in the final gift-over provision; and

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Lenfest, the Founders, have given their express written consent to this proposed change to the Articles and Bylaws, as is required for any change to the termination provisions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors, upon the recommendation of the Founders, H.F. (Gerry) and Marguerite Lenfest, and the Chair of the Board, Dr. Keith Leaphart, has determined to approve this change to the Foundation Articles and Bylaws.

# Now, be it hereby, RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Articles and Article VIII, Section 1(b) of the Bylaws of the Corporation shall be and are hereby changed to eliminate the termination gift of remaining assets to the Scholarship Program and a subsequent gift-over to Wilson College, all of which is more fully set forth in Exhibit A attached,
- 2.
