Mercy will pursue appropriate means in the collection of delinquent accounts from patients with an established ability to pay or an unwillingness to cooperate in validating eligibility for financial assistance. These appropriate means may include legal action consistent with mercy mission and values. Additionally, they may include liens upon real property and reasonable wage garnishments. Legal actions will generally not include bank garnishments, repossession of assets or foreclosures to ensure satisfaction of a lien. Mercy has policies and procedures established to address the initiation of legal action and annually reviews compliance with policies.

However, when our health collaborative brought together the expertise of the health care community, and developed a unified front our goals were exceeded and area water fluoridated. Some protection against dental disease was offered to the masses regardless of their ability to afford dental care.
