We have also been collaborating with Medical College of Wisconsin to establish a community medical education program in Green Bay, and have provided financial support to offset operating costs this fiscal year, and have budgeted to do the same in the future. St. Vincent Hospital provided \$513,121 in family support services. Professionals at the hospital assisted in excess of 3200 people by screening and applying for the appropriate assistance, such as SSDI or Medical Assistance when they came to the hospital in a time of medical need. This included providing certified application counselors to assist patients in understanding and using the new insurance marketplace. When patients can't get to St. Vincent Hospital, or get to their doctor appointments from the hospital, St. Vincent finds a way to help. In the past year, the hospital paid for more than \$7086 in uncompensated ambulance and other vehicle rides for patients, either to or from the hospital or to help them get to their doctor appointments elsewhere. The information ga thered from these assessments is being used to develop new, and enhance existing, programs and services that best address the needs of the community Several priority needs were dentified in the FY2015 CHNAs including mental health, chronic disease prevention and manag ement, alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse, nutrition/wellness, access to care, oral health, and domestic abuse. HSHS hospitals are addressing these and other needs by proactively offering educational opportunities, preventative screenings, and new or enhanced clinical services. While this shortfall in Medicare payments is not classified as community benefit by the IRS, we nonetheless believe it is an important contribution made by the hospital to the health and well-being of the community. If the Medicare program did not exist, many Medicare patients would be eligible for charity care or other means-tested government programs. After patients receive service, our customer service representatives are also trained to assist them to apply for various government programs or for our charity care program.
