Median value of owner-occupied housing units for the same time period was \$85,000 for Crawford County and \$70,600 for Cherokee County. According to Quick Facts from the US Census, 20.8% of Crawford County lived below the poverty level between the years 2010-2014. This is higher than the 14.8% identified for the State of Kansas. Cherokee County is also above the State of Kansas level as 17.4% of their residents suggest that they live below the poverty level. VCH-P is the only hospital facility in the City of Pittsburg. Other hospitals are in neighboring communities but offer fewer services. In order to find a similar medical facility, patients would need to travel to Joplin, Missouri or Tulsa, Oklahoma for emergency care. Kansas reported in 2014 that 14.5% of all residents were persons 65 years of age and older. This compares to 14.8% for Crawford and 17.7% for Cherokee Counties. Thus services for a growing aging population need to be monitored in future assessments.</p>
