The provision of this discount to all patients without insurance lowers the amount that is billed to the patient and reduces the amount of any subsequent bad debt expense. In fiscal year 2015, self pay discounts were \$17.5 million representing \$4.1 million at cost. Memorial Health Care System uses a number of processes as described in Part VI, Item 3 below to identify who can and cannot afford to pay. Patients who are unable to pay are identified in advance of billing or during the billing and collection process, particularly those who are medically indigent or underinsured. At any time in the process that a patient is determined to be eligible for charity care, the patient is re-classified from bad debt and all billing and collection efforts are discontinued. In spite of the best efforts of Memorial Health Care System, some patients do not self-identify as needing assistance or provide enough information to allow the hospital to determine their eligibility and remain classified as bad debt. We are unable to accurately estimate the amount of bad debt expense (at cost) that is attributable to patients that would qualify for financial assistance.
