ARTICLE I
Name and Seal

The name of this nonprofit corporation shall be STONEYPEAK FOUNDATION, INC (the "Corporation"), and the seal shall be adopted by the Board (the "Board") and affixed on the right margin of this page.

ARTICLE II
Purpose

The objects and purposes for which the Corporation is formed are set forth in the Articles of Incorporation as filed with the Secretary of State of Georgia. The principal purpose of the Corporation is grant-making activities. The Board will solicit proposals to make grants to various charitable organizations in accordance with the stated exempt purposes of the Corporation. The Board will analyze such proposals, will prioritize the proposals for funding, and will formulate a plan for use of the funds available for distribution in a given year. These activities further the exempt purposes of the Corporation by providing a source of funding for programs in the following areas: (i) K-12 educational development via grants to schools and programs that focus on academic excellence at the K-12 level; (ii) early childhood development via grants to programs based on need and that are focused on physical and mental development; (iii) higher educational institutions, as well as charitable institutions such as United Way, churches, etc.; and (iv) the arts.



ARTICLE III

Location

The Corporation's principal office shall be at 3439 Knollwood Drive, Atlanta, Fulton County, Georgia 30305, or at such other place or places as may be designated by the Board from time to time

ARTICLE IV

Directors

Section 1. Powers of Directors. The property, business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board (the "Board"). The Board is hereby vested with all the powers possessed by the Corporation itself, so far as this designation of authority is not inconsistent with the laws of the State of Georgia, with the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation, with these Bylaws or with any duties, obligations or restrictions imposed on the operation, management, property, business and affairs of corporations qualifying as non-profit corporations in the State of Georgia.

Section 2. Number and Qualification of Directors. The Board shall be comprised of three (3) Directors or such greater number of Directors as may be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

Section 3. Election and Term of Directors.

a. **Initial Board.** The initial Board shall be comprised of the following members (the "Initial Directors"):

David A. Stonecipher ("DAS")
Nancy S. Stonecipher
Stephen P. Stonecipher
Christopher A. Stonecipher

b. **Terms of Directors.** Directors shall serve for the following terms:

i. **Initial Directors.** The term of each Initial Director shall continue until his or her death, resignation or incapacity.

ii. **Successor Directors.** Each other person elected to serve as a Director shall serve until the third annual meeting of the Board following his or her election and thereafter until his or her successor is duly elected and qualified or until his or her earlier death, resignation or removal.

Directors whose terms have expired may be reappointed for one or more additional terms

c. **Election of Successor or Additional Directors.** Except for the Initial Directors, all Directors of the Corporation shall be elected by a Majority Director Vote at any regular or special meeting of the Board.

Section 4. Voting Rights of Directors. Except for DAS, each Director shall have one (1) vote for all matters that come before the Board. During the DAS Term, DAS shall have that number of votes which shall constitute a Majority Director Vote

Section 5. Chairman. The Board shall appoint a Chairman of the Board (the "Chairman") from among the Directors who, when present, shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and who shall have such other powers as the Board shall prescribe, and may elect one or more Vice-Chairmen of the Board who shall have such powers as the Board shall prescribe. The initial Chairman shall be DAS who shall serve in such capacity for so long as he serves as a Director of the Corporation. At such time as DAS shall cease to serve as Chairman, successor Chairmen shall be appointed follows

a. Nancy S. Stonecipher shall serve as successor Chairman for so long as she continues to serve as a Director of the Corporation.

b. If Nancy S. Stonecipher shall cease to serve as a Director or for any other reason be unable or refuse to serve as Chairman, Christopher A. Stonecipher, shall be the successor Chairman.

c. If Christopher A. Stonecipher shall cease to be a Director or for any other reason be unable or refuse to serve as Chairman, Stephen P. Stonecipher shall be the successor Chairman

d. If Stephen P. Stonecipher shall cease to be a Director or for any other reason be unable or refuse to serve as Chairman, the successor Chairman shall be elected by Majority Director Vote from among the Directors then serving.

Section 5. Resignation. Any Director of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice to Board or to the Chairman. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or, if the time is not specified therein, upon its acceptance by the Board.

Section 6. Removal. Any Director may be removed from office with or without cause by a Majority Director Vote at any special meeting called for that purpose.

Section 7. Vacancies. A vacancy occurring among the Directors shall be filled pursuant to Section 3 c of this Article IV

Section 8. Compensation and Expenses of Directors. Directors of the Corporation may receive reasonable compensation for their services as Directors and may be reimbursed for their out-of-pocket expenses incurred in carrying out the business and affairs of the Corporation.

ARTICLE V
Meetings of Directors

Just MPM
Section 1. Annual and Regular Meetings. The annual meeting of the Board shall be held at ~~6:00~~ p.m. on the third (3rd) Thursday in August, if not a legal holiday, but if a legal holiday, then on the next day following which is not a legal holiday, at such location as shall be determined by the Board from time to time, either within or outside the State of Georgia, for the purpose of electing Directors of the Corporation and for the transaction of such other business as may be properly brought before the meeting. In addition, the Board may provide, by resolution, the time and place, either within or outside the State of Georgia, for the holding of additional regular meetings.

Section 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be called by or at the request of the President, Chairman or any other two (2) Directors. Such meetings may be held within or outside the State of Georgia.

Section 3. Notice of Meetings. Regular meetings, as defined in Section 1 of this Article V, may be held without notice. A Special Meeting, as defined in Section 2 of this Article V, requires the person or persons calling such Special Meeting to give notice, a minimum of two (2) days before such Special Meeting, by using any usual means of communication.

Section 4. Waiver of Notice. Any Director may waive notice of any Directors' meeting held without proper call or notice, either before or after the meeting is held. Attendance by a Director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the purpose of objection to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called. Failure of a Director who did not attend a meeting that was held without proper call or notice to file with the Secretary or Assistance Secretary of the Corporation his or her written objection to the holding of the meeting or to any specific action so taken promptly after having knowledge of the action taken or the insufficiency of notice shall constitute ratification of the action taken at the meeting.

Section 5. Quorum. The presence of Directors holding a majority of the votes entitled to be cast at any meeting of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board.

Section 6. Board Action. All matters approved by a Majority Director Vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the official act of the Board

Section 7. Action by Written Consent. Notwithstanding any provisions of these Bylaws to the contrary, any action required to be, or which may be, taken at a meeting of the Board or any committee of the Board may be taken without a meeting if Directors holding the number of votes required to approve such action shall consent to such action in a writing setting forth the action so taken, and the writing is filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board. Such consent shall have the same force and effect as a majority vote of the Board

Section 8. Conference Telephone Meeting. Unless the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws provide otherwise, Directors may participate in a meeting of the Board by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment whereby all persons participating in the meeting simultaneously may hear each other. Participation in the meeting by such means shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

ARTICLE VI

Officers

Section 1. Number. The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer and such Vice Presidents, Assistance Secretaries, Assistant Treasurers and other officers as the Board may from time to time elect. Any two (2) or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary, but no officer may act in more than one capacity where action of two (2) or more officers is required.

Section 2. Election and Term. The officers of the Corporation shall be elected by the Board. Such election may be held at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Each officer shall hold office until his or her death, resignation, retirement, removal or disqualification.

Section 3. Removal. Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board may be removed by the Board at any time with or without cause; but said removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

Section 4. Resignation. Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board may resign at any time with or without cause, except as otherwise provided in any written agreement between the Corporation and such officer or agent.

Section 5. Compensation. The compensation of all officers of the Corporation, if any, shall be fixed by the Board.

Section 6. Officer Duties.

a. **President.** The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Corporation and, subject to the control of the Board, shall supervise and control the management of the Corporation according to these Bylaws. The President shall preside at meetings of the Directors and, in general, shall perform all duties as may be prescribed by the Board from time to time

b. **Vice Presidents.** The Vice Presidents in the order of their election, unless otherwise determined by the Board, shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties and exercise the powers of that office. ~~In addition, they shall perform such other duties and shall have such other powers as the Board shall prescribe~~

c. **Secretary.** The Secretary shall keep as permanent records (i) the minutes of all meetings of the Board; (ii) a record of all actions taken by the Directors without a meeting, and (iii) a record of all actions taken by committees of the Board in place of the Board on behalf of the Corporation. The Secretary shall give all notices required by law and by these Bylaws. The Secretary shall have general charge of the corporate records and books and of the corporate seal, and he or she shall affix the corporate seal to any lawfully executed instruments requiring it. The Secretary shall sign such instruments as may require his or her signature, and, in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the President or by the Board..

d. **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds and securities belonging to the Corporation and shall receive, deposit or disburse the same under the direction of the Board. The Treasurer shall keep full and accurate accounts of the finances of the Corporation in books especially provided for that purpose. The Treasurer shall in general perform all duties incident to the office and such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the President or by the Board.

e. **Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers.** The Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers shall, in the absence or disability of the Secretary or the Treasurer, respectively, perform the duties and exercise the powers of those offices and shall, in general, perform such other duties as shall be assigned to them by the Secretary or the Treasurer, respectively, or by the President or the Board.

Section 7. Bond. The Board may by resolution require any or all officers, agents and employees of the Corporation to give bond to the Corporation, with sufficient sureties, conditioned on the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices or positions, and to comply with such other conditions as may from time to time be required by the Board.

ARTICLE VII
Indemnification of Directors, Officers and Others

Section 1. Definitions. For purposes of this Article VII, the following definitions shall apply

- a. "Code" means the Georgia Nonprofit Corporation Code, effective July 1, 1991, ~~and all amendments and additions thereto~~
- b. "Director" means an individual who is or was a Director of the Corporation or an individual who, while a Director of the Corporation, is or was serving at the Corporation's request as a Director, officer, manager, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation (whether a business or nonprofit corporation), limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan, or other enterprise. A Director is considered to be serving an employee benefit plan at the corporation request if such Director's duties to the corporation also impose duties on, or otherwise involve services by, the Director to the plan or to participants in or beneficiaries of the plan. "Director" includes, unless the context requires otherwise, the estate or personal representative of a Director.
- c. "Expenses" means expenses of every kind incurred in defending a Proceeding, including, but not limited to, legal, accounting, expert and investigatory fees and expenses
- d. "Indemnified Officer" shall mean each officer of the Corporation who is also a Director of the Corporation and each other officer of the Corporation who is designated by the Board from time to time as an Indemnified Officer. An Indemnified Officer shall be entitled to indemnification hereunder to the same extent as a Director, including, without limitation, indemnification with respect to service by the Indemnified Officer at the Corporation's request as a Director, officer, manager, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation (whether a business or nonprofit corporation limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise). "Indemnified Officer" includes, unless the context requires otherwise, the estate or personal representative of an Indemnified Officer.
- e. "Liabilities" means any obligation to pay any or all of the following: a judgment, a settlement, a penalty, a fine (including an excise tax assessed with respect to an employee benefit plan) and reasonable expenses, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees of opposing parties incurred with respect to a Proceeding

- f "Proceeding" means any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, whether formal or informal, and any appeal therein (and any inquiry or investigation that could lead to such a proceeding).

Section 2. Statement of Intent. The Corporation shall indemnify the Directors and the Indemnified Officers to the maximum extent permitted by the Code and, if applicable, Section 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 3. Indemnification. In addition to, and not in any way in limitation of, all indemnification rights and obligations otherwise provided by law, the Corporation shall indemnify and hold harmless its Directors and Indemnified Officers against all Liabilities and Expenses in any Proceeding (including, without limitation, a Proceeding brought by or on behalf of the corporation itself) arising out of their status as Directors or officers, or their service at the Corporation's request as a Director, officer, manager, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation (whether a business or nonprofit corporation), limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise), or their activities in any such capacity; provided, however, that the Corporation shall not indemnify a Director or an Indemnified Officer against Liabilities or Expenses that such person may incur on account of activities of such person which at the time taken were known or believed by him or her to be clearly in conflict with the best interests of the Corporation. The Corporation shall also indemnify each Director and Indemnified Officer for his or her reasonable costs, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred in connection with the enforcement of the rights to indemnification granted herein, if it is determined in accordance with Article VII, Section 4 of these Bylaws that the Director or Indemnified Officer is entitled to indemnification hereunder.

The Board shall have the authority to adopt such resolutions pertaining to the implementation of this Article VII, Section 3 as it may from time to time determine, and such resolutions shall be given full effect, even though they supplement, amplify or go beyond the provisions of this Article VII, Section 3, provided and to the extent any such resolution does not violate any provision of the Code or the Articles of Incorporation. This Article VII, Section 3 shall be construed in a manner to fully effect the purpose and intent of the resolution of the Board approving and adopting this provision.

Section 4. Determination. Any indemnification under Article VII, Section 3 shall be paid by the Corporation in a specific case only after a determination that the Director or Indemnified Officer has met the standard of conduct set forth in Article VII, Section 3 of these Bylaws. Such determination shall be made:

- a by the Board by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of the members thereof not at the time parties to the Proceeding;

- b if a quorum cannot be obtained under Article VII, Section 3, by a majority vote of a committee duly designated by the Board (in which designation members thereof who are parties to the Proceeding may participate), consisting solely of two or more members of the Board not at the time parties to the Proceeding, or
- c. by special legal counsel i) selected by the Board or a committee thereof in the manner prescribed in Article VII, Section 4(a) or 4(b); or (ii) if a quorum of the Board cannot be obtained under Article VII, Section 4(a) and a committee cannot be designated under Article VII, Section 4(b), selected by a Majority Board Vote (in which selection, members thereof who are parties in the Proceeding may participate).

The Board shall take all such action as may be necessary and appropriate to enable the Corporation to pay the indemnification required by this Article VII.

Section 5. Advances for Expenses. The Expenses incurred by a Director or an Indemnified Officer in defending a Proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such Proceeding as authorized by the Board in the specific case upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the Director or Indemnified Officer to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that such person is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation against such Expenses. Subject to receipt of such undertaking, the Corporation shall make reasonable periodic advances for Expenses pursuant to this Article VII, Section 5, unless the Board shall determine, in the manner provided in Article VII, Section 4 of these Bylaws and based on the facts then known, that indemnification under this Article VII is or will be precluded

Section 6. Reliance and Consideration. Any Director or Indemnified Officer who at any time after the adoption of this Article VII serves or has served in any of the aforesaid capacities for or on behalf of the corporation shall be deemed to be doing or to have done so in reliance upon, and as consideration for, the right of indemnification provided herein. Such right, however, shall not be exclusive of any other rights to which such person may be entitled apart from the provisions of this Article VII. No amendment, modification or repeal of this Article VII shall adversely affect the right of any Director or Indemnified Officer to indemnification hereunder with respect to any activities occurring prior to the time of such amendment, modification or repeal.

Section 7. Insurance. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of its Directors, officers, employees and agents and those persons who were or are serving at the request of the Corporation in any capacity with another corporation (whether a business or nonprofit corporation), limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise against any liability asserted against or incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article VII or otherwise. Any full or partial payment made by an insurance company under any

insurance policy covering any Director, officer, employee, agent or other person identified above made to or on behalf of a person entitled to indemnification under this Article VII shall relieve the corporation of its liability for indemnification provided for in this Article VII or otherwise to the extent of such payment, and no insurer shall have a right of subrogation against the corporation with respect to such payment

Section 8. Savings Clause. If this Article VII or any portion hereof shall be invalidated on any ground by any court or agency of competent jurisdiction, then the corporation shall nevertheless indemnify each person indemnified hereunder to the fullest extent permitted by the portion of this Article VII that is not invalidated and also to the fullest extent permitted or required by the applicable law

ARTICLE VIII

General Provisions

Section 1. Management of Corporate Funds. No funds received by donation, bequest or any other means shall be diverted from the use to which they may be assigned by the donor, testator or testatrix, unless said use is contrary to or in conflict with the purposes of the Corporation, and no funds shall be used for any purpose other than to effect the purposes of the Corporation

Section 2. Records. The Corporation shall keep a copy of the following records at the principal office of the Corporation:

- a. Its Articles of Incorporation or restated Articles of Incorporation and all amendments to them currently in effect;
- b. Its Bylaws or restated Bylaws and all amendments to them currently in effect;
- c. Resolutions adopted by the Board relating to the number or classification of Directors; and
- d. A list of names and business or home addresses of its current Directors and officers.

Section 3. Exempt Activities. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, no member, Director, officer, employee or representative of this Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity by or on behalf of the Corporation not permitted to be taken or carried on by an organization exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist, or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code and Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended..

Section 4. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin the 1st day of July of each year unless a different fiscal year shall be determined by the Board.

Section 5 Amendments. The Bylaws of the Corporation may be amended, added to, or repealed (a) during the DAS Term, by a Majority Director Vote and (b) after the DAS Term, by the unanimous vote of the Directors then serving.
