



NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Organization and Nature of Activities

Albany Public Library Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation founded under the laws and regulations of the state of Oregon. The Foundation exists for the express purpose of advancing and promoting the interest and development of the Albany public libraries and their programs. The Foundation's board of trustees is organized to solicit and accept gifts in support of the Albany public libraries and to manage, invest, and account for the assets of the Foundation.

B. Tax-Exempt Status

Albany Public Library Foundation is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. In addition, the Foundation qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization that is a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2). The Foundation is subject to federal excise tax on its net investment income.

The tax-exempt status can be revoked by the Internal Revenue Service as a result of direct violations of laws and regulations governing 501(c)(3) organizations. The Foundation's operating policy requires strict adherence to these laws and regulations in order to maintain its tax-exempt status. Management's policy is to engage in activities related to their exempt purpose.

Management evaluates tax positions annually based on the guidance in Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 740. FASB ASC 740 prescribes a comprehensive model for recognizing, measuring, presenting, and disclosing, in the financial statements, tax positions taken or expected to be taken on a tax return, including positions that the Foundation is exempt from income taxes or not subject to income taxes on unrelated business income. The Foundation presently discloses or recognizes income tax positions based on management's estimate of whether it is reasonably possible or probable, respectively, that a liability has been incurred for unrecognized income tax benefits.

Tax returns for fiscal years after 2011 remain open to examination.

C. Basis of Presentation

Albany Public Library Foundation records its revenue and expenses using the accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred.

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) as set forth in Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 958. Under FASB ASC 958, the Foundation is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

D. Public Support and Revenue

Contributions are generally available for unrestricted use, unless specifically restricted by the donor. Unconditional promises to give are recorded as received. Unconditional promises to give due in the next year are reflected as current promises to give and are recorded at their net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give due in subsequent years are reflected as long-term promises to give and are recorded at the present value of their net realizable value using risk-free interest rates applicable to the years in which the promises are received to discount the amounts. An allowance for uncollectible promises is provided based on management's evaluation of potential uncollectible promises receivable at year-end.

Grants and other contributions of cash and other assets are reported as temporarily restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and are reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Endowment contributions and investments are permanently restricted by the donor. Investment earnings available for distribution are recorded in unrestricted net assets. Investment earnings with donor restrictions are recorded in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets based on the nature of the restrictions.

Contributions of donated noncash assets are recorded at their fair values in the period received. Contributions of donated services that create or enhance nonfinancial assets or that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation, are recorded at their fair values in the period received.

E. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

F. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Albany Public Library Foundation considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

G. Investments

1. Valuation

Investments are reported at estimated fair value as determined by the Foundation, based upon a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the input techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to level 1 measurements and the lowest priority to level 3 measurements:

Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

<u>Level 2</u>: Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not considered active; observable inputs other than observable quoted prices for the asset or liability; or inputs derived principally from corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs for assets or liabilities

A financial instrument's level within this fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to its fair value measurement. The fair value hierarchy does not correspond to a financial instrument's relative liquidity in the market or to its level of risk.

Level 1 investments are typically investments in debt and equity marketable securities. Money market funds, certificates of deposit, and other highly liquid investments with maturities of 90 days or less are reported at cost, which approximates fair value because of short maturities.

H. Property and Equipment

Donations of property and equipment are recorded as support at their estimated fair values. Property and equipment valued at \$500 or greater and maintained by the Foundation are capitalized. All others are expensed. Such donations are reported as unrestricted support unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose. Assets donated with explicit restrictions regarding their use and contributions of cash that must be used to acquire property and equipment are reported as restricted support.

I. Property and Equipment (Continued)

Absent donor stipulations regarding how long those donated assets must be maintained, the Foundation reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired assets are placed in service or distributed to the Albany public libraries as instructed by the donor. The Foundation reclassifies temporarily restricted net assets to unrestricted net assets at that time. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method.

J. Fair Values of Financial Instruments

The carrying amounts of cash, cash equivalents, and short-term investments, if any, in the statements of financial position, approximate fair value due to the short maturities of those instruments. The carrying amount of investments, which is fair value, is based upon quoted market values.

K. Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis on the statements of activities and the statements of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

L. Reclassifications

Certain prior period financial statement amounts have been reclassified to conform to current period presentation.

NOTE 4 - CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK ARISING FROM INVESTMENTS

At June 30, 2015 and 2014, the Foundation maintained its investments with Charles Schwab. Amounts held with Charles Schwab are subject to market fluctuations, which could dramatically affect the carrying value of these assets.

NOTE 5 - FEDERAL EXCISE TAXES

The Internal Revenue Code imposes an excise tax on private foundations equal to 2% of net investment income, which is defined as interest, dividends, and net realized gains less operating and capital losses on investments and expenses incurred in the production of income. The tax is reduced to 1% for foundations that meet certain distribution requirements. During the years ended June 30, 2015 and 2014, the Foundation paid excise taxes at a rate of 2%.

NOTE 6 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through Date Rep Letter Received, 2015, which was the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.
