BOARD MEMBER, WE PROVIDED A NUMBER OF IN-PERSON TRAININGS, INCLUDING A SUCCESSFUL ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND RELEASED SEVERAL TRAININGS ONLINE, WE UPDATED OUR WEBSITE AND USED OUR BLOG AND EMAILS TO PROVIDE RELEVANT INFORMATION RELATED TO CHILD WELFARE TO OUR MEMBERS AND CONTACTS WE ALSO PARTICIPATED IN SEVERAL TRAININGS BOTH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE OF THE STATE, ALONG WITH OTHER STATEWIDE COMMITTEES ASSISTANT ATTORNEYS GENERAL, GUARDIAN'S AD LITEM AND CASA WORKERS WE HAD 60 PERSONS REGISTER AND PROVIDED CLE CREDIT TO 32 ATTORNEYS (INCLUDING THE WEBCAST VIEWERS) THE FEEDBACK WAS OVERWHELMINGLY POSITIVE ONE ATTORNEY TOLD US "PANEL WAS REFRESHING GREAT CHOICE OF JUDGES " ONE OF THE CASA WORKERS LET US KNOW "THIS WAS INTERESTING AND INFORMATIVE THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR INCLUDING THE CASAS IT WAS
