## **About the Foundation**

The Hattie M. Strong Foundation makes charitable grants to 501(c)(3) charities serving at-risk school-aged children enrolled in public or public charter schools in the city of Washington Occasional grants are also made to organizations serving at-risk children in surrounding jurisdictions. The Strong Foundation's current priority is to assist organizations that provide out-of-school-time (OST) programming during the after-school hours, Saturdays, and summers. Preference is given to programs that support, reinforce, and enrich the core academic objectives of the District of Columbia Public Schools, as well as character development, community service, good citizenship, and appreciation of the performing and visual arts

The Strong Foundation no longer accepts unsolicited requests for grants. This decision makes it possible for the Foundation to direct more money to the community while reducing the burden on local charities. That said, the Foundation is always happy to receive information, such as newsletters and other materials, describing the work of local charities that provide OST programming.

Grants range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 and are made throughout the Foundation's fiscal year which runs September 1 to August 31 Organizations under consideration for potential grants may be contacted for additional information by the Foundation In some cases, the Foundation may ask to schedule a site visit

# The "Strong Scholars" Program for Initial Licensure Teacher Candidates

Starting in 1928, the Hattie M. Strong Foundation (HMSF) has run what we believe to be one of the earliest and most successful student loan programs in the country. We have supported "young people of promise" in their pursuit of higher education across all fields of study in all regions of the country. Our loans always charged zero interest and offered flexible repayment schedules tied to the economic realities of a student's career choice.

In 2009, the HMSF Board of Directors decided to confront a different kind of economic reality, the astonishingly high levels of debt that today's college graduates must incur to complete their studies. Rather than make available yet another layer of debt, we decided to stop lending money and to simply give it away.

In alignment with our traditional focus on education, we have replaced our student loan program with a scholarship program aimed at college students enrolled in teacher-training programs. Specifically, the HMSF hopes to reduce financial pressure during the student-teaching semester, when a student's ability to offset expenses with outside employment is curtailed by the rigor of full-time work in the classroom.

#### Program Operation, Application, and Selection Process

Funds for the \$5,000 scholarships are distributed via partnership with twenty-one institutions, all located near Washington, D C, that have demonstrated leadership in preparing outstanding classroom teachers. Application requirement and student selection will be determined by each institution's scholarship committee in line with the following criteria in descending order of importance.

- Undergraduate students who have exhibited outstanding success and enthusiasm in field experience prior to the final year of the program or graduate students whose life experiences prior to enrollment reveal the same traits
- Students with demonstrated financial need
- Students who have achieved a minimum 3 0 GPA in the two semesters prior to their final year

## The Barbara B. Cantrell Classroom Support Fund

#### Purpose

The "Bobbie Fund" is established in honor and memory of Barbara, "Bobbie." B Cantrell, longtime administrator of our loan program, who acted as a guide and adviser to many generations of loan recipients through her wise counsel and great heart. Its purpose is to provide classroom supplies up to \$500 in value to recent Strong Scholars specifically to enhance learning in their classrooms

#### **Eligibility and Process**

Strong Scholarship recipients are eligible for the Bobbie Fund for three of the first five years of their teaching career but initial funding must be requested within three years of certification. Funding is limited and applications will be approved on a first come, first served basis between September 1 and December 15th. Applications must include a completed Bobbie Fund Support Request and independent verification of employment as a full-time teacher under contract for the upcoming school year (email acceptable)

Upon notification of support, each recipient shall select items electronically from corporate venders including but not limited to Amazon. Target or Walmart and provide those venders with a shipping address for direct delivery. A link to the "cart" or "wish list" from that vendor shall then be forwarded to the Foundation for review and purchase. The Foundation will process no more than two such orders per grant awarded.

#### **Guidelines for Purchases**

Examples of items that would meet the criteria include writing tools paper, books. Kleenex, fans, or anything else that provides an optimal learning environment for students of all ages and abilities. Electronics will not be approved unless they are provided to every student (cheap calculators might be approved but laptops or notepads would not).
