Other characteristics of the hospital that the IRS highlighted included the following: its surplus funds were used to improve patient care, expand hospital facilities, and advance medical training, education, and research; it was controlled by a board of trustees that consisted of independent civic leaders, and hospital medical staff privileges were available to all qualified physicians. The organization believes that Medicare underpayments and bad debt are community benefit and associated costs are includable on the form 990, schedule H, part III. The American Hospital Association ("AHA") feels that Medicare underpayments (shortfall) and bad debt are community benefit and thus includable on the form 990, schedule H, part III. This organization agrees with the AHA position. As outlined in the AHA letter to the IRS dated August 21, 2007 with respect to the first published draft of the new form 990 and schedule H, the AHA felt that the IRS should incorporate the full value of the community benefit that hospitals provide by counting Medicare underpayments (shortfall) as quantifiable community benefit for the following reasons: - providing care for the elderly and serving Medicare patients is an essential part of the community benefit standard - Medicare, like Medicaid, does not pay the full cost of care. Recently, Medicare reimburses hospitals only 92 cents for every dollar they spend to take care of Medicare patients. The Medicare Payment Advisory Commission ("MedPAC") in its March 2007 report to Congress cautioned that underpayment will get even worse, with margins reaching a 10-year low at negative 5.4 percent - many Medicare beneficiaries, like their Medicaid counterparts, are poor. More than 46 percent of Medicare spending is for beneficiaries whose income is below 200 percent of the federal poverty level. Many of those Medicare beneficiaries are also eligible for Medicaid -- so called "dual eligibles." There is every compelling public policy reason to treat Medicare and Medicaid underpayments similarly for purposes of a hospital's community benefit and include these costs on form 990, schedule H, part I. Medicare underpayment must be shouldered by the hospital in order to continue treating the community's elderly and poor. These underpayments represent a real cost of serving the community and should count as a quantifiable community benefit. Both the AHA and this organization also feel that patient bad debt is a community benefit and thus includable on the form 990, schedule H, part III. Like Medicare underpayment (shortfalls), there also are compelling reasons that patient bad debt should be counted as quantifiable community benefit as follows: - a significant majority of bad debt is attributable to low-income patients, who, for many reasons, decline to complete the forms required to establish eligibility for hospitals' charity care or financial assistance programs. A 2006 Congressional Budget Office ("CBO") report, Nonprofit Hospitals and the Provision of Community Benefits, cited two studies indicating that "the great majority of bad debt was attributable to patients with income below 200% of the federal poverty line" - the report also noted that a substantial portion of bad debt is pending charity care. Unlike bad debt in other industries, hospital bad debt is complicated by the fact that hospitals follow their mission to the community and treat every patient that comes through their emergency department, regardless of ability to pay. Patients who have outstanding bills are not turned away, unlike other industries. Bad debt is further complicated by the auditing industry's standards on reporting charity care. Many patients cannot or do not provide the necessary, extensive documentation required to be deemed charity care by auditors. As a result, roughly 40% of bad debt is pending charity care - the CBO concluded that its</p>
