Member agencies present cases for consideration at Unmet Needs meetings. Clients in need of assistance contact a member agency with their specific need. As the cases are discussed, entity representatives talk about programs they have that could assist the patient. Blessing is represented at these meetings. The United Way also has an Interagency Council that meets monthly. Several agencies from throughout the community attend this meeting. They have a presenter at most meetings. Blessing has presented in the past, focusing on care coordination and touching on the financial assistance program. Alliance for Building Community (ABC) is another community collaborative that assists us in educating the community about our financial assistance program. ABC is a community planning group that conducts a community needs assessment and identifies community priorities. ABC leadership includes representative from social service agencies, government, health care, private industry, etc. Once the community priorities are identified, action teams work on implementation strategies to address the issue. Access to health care services has consistently been identified as a community priority for our area. A team has been established to address this area and includes entities such as Adams County Health Department, SIU Quincy Family Practice, Transitions of Western Illinois, Quincy Medical Group, and a variety of other health entities. Blessing has partnered to support the community needs assessment process and to help implement access to health care programs in our community. Through these initiatives, the community is educated about the financial assistance program and how to assist people in accessing the assistance. Blessing Hospital has also established a care coordination department that works with patients in the ambulatory setting to assist them in meeting their healthcare needs. One of the targeted areas of the care coordination program is to help patients establish a primary care home. This can include providing education to patients about services available in the community and if applicable how to access the financial assistance programs within those agencies.
