	Dakota Medical Foundation (DMF) and its supporting organization, Dakota Medical Charities (DMC), (the "Foundations") are recognized leaders dedicated to effectively addressing societal health problems and measurably improving the health and healthcare access for people in North Dakota and western Minnesota The Foundations work closely with and through hundreds of engaged partners in the region health-related nonprofits, healthcare facilities, universities, public agencies, foundations, businesses, volunteers and donors The Foundations place particular emphasis on initiatives and projects that address the special healthcare needs of the communities it serves within its traditional service area The Foundations focused their grants and initiative programs in support of Access to Healthcare, Chronic Disease Prevention, and Organizational Effectiveness ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE -Lend A Hand Initiative In 2007, Dakota Medical Foundation established the Lend A Hand Initiative to provide financial and fundraising assistance to a defined charitable class of families and individuals in Cass County, ND and Clay County, MN that experience financial hardships due to catastrophic medical issues A 12-member application review committee determines eligibility regarding requests for up to \$5,000 in Foundation matching funds available to the defined charitable class of family benefit funds In 2015, the DMF Lend A Hand program celebrated its eighth anniversary and has assisted in raising over \$10.5 million for 344 qualified family benefits The Lend A Hand program teamed with over 6,000 community members who have led fund raising benefit events in local communities with more than 120,000 people attending and supporting the events The Foundations have provided matching funds to the family benefit funds totaling over \$1.7 million since 2008 Donors may contribute to 1) the DMF Lend A Hand Giving Fund or DMF Lend A Hand Endowment Fund where contributions are matched by the Foundations, or 2) directly to the community established family benefit funds that meet the program's eligibility requirements The Lend A Hand program provides a step-by-step fundraising guide, a toolkit for volunteers that include planning and marketing templates and additional resources and fundraising assistance (dakmed.org/lendahand/) Donations to the Lend A Hand program may be made by cash, check or online through the Impact Foundation website, impactgiveback.org Donations to family benefit funds are not tax deductible Healthy Steps Outreach Initiative This initiative provides education and outreach to approximately 13,000 families in North Dakota who have children without medical insurance, seeking to connect them to one of three free or low-cost medical assistance programs Medicaid, Healthy Steps Children's Health Insurance Plan and Caring for Children insurance program Half of uninsured families are potentially eligible for a form of public health coverage with a majority having working parents (80 percent) Efforts to build awareness and connect uninsured children will help to ensure that North Dakota children have a healthy start and a healthy future Studies show that uninsured children are ten times more likely to have unmet medical needs and five times more likely to go more than two years without seeing a doctor, which can lead to a greater risk of illness and hospitalization In addition, a lack of health insurance can have a negative influence on school attendance and participation in extracurricular activities Healthy Steps outreach has the support of Healthy Steps Ambassadors in schools statewide Outreach kits have been created to give ambassadors and child advocates an opportunity to connect families in need of health insurance with available resources and guidance Faith Community Nurses also serve as Healthy Steps Ambassadors in hospitals and human service organizations The number of children covered by Healthy Steps, has risen from 3,399 in 2009 to 4,076 in 2013 (most recent data available from ND Dept. of Human Services) The initiative is funded by a \$650,000 two year grant from the North Dakota Department of Human Services Children's Mental Health Initiative In 2007, the Foundations partnered with the Southeastern North Dakota Community Action Agency (SENDCAA) to develop, implement and manage strategies to provide access to early social-emotional mental health assessment and therapeutic consultation services for children, improve education and awareness of early childhood mental health, and facilitate collaboration among providers Working with local public health units, clinics and childcare sites across North Dakota, but especially in Cass County, ND and Clay County, MN, the initiative implemented social-emotional mental health screenings, assessments and consultation services for children up to age 8 The initiative served nearly 140 families in 2015, typically around 4-5 sessions, including in-home, in childcares/schools and in-office In 2015 the initiative developed parent aids and agency-wide assessment forms for Cass County Social Services A Standard of Practice for Developmental Screening with an evaluation tool kit has been implemented statewide to screen children's mental health, and screenings are more common now than they were nine years ago SENDCAA program consultants taught two semesters of a 400-level course on early childhood mental health at NDSU that is open to Tri-College University students The teaching contract has been extended through 2016 Community education is an important component of the initiative SENDCAA program consultants have become certified Nurtured Heart Approach advanced trainers who arm parents, caregivers and teachers with the tools to create positive relationships with children More than 1,000 childcare providers have been trained The Initiative supported the development of a Resource Guide that identifies information about children's mental health services and providers in Cass and Clay Counties The Initiative was supported through the end of 2015 with a \$40,000 grant to Southeastern North Dakota Community Action Agency Prescription Assistance Initiative Since 2000, the Foundations have supported programs in its service area that provide application assistance for eligible low-income and uninsured persons to secure free or reduced-cost prescription medications from major pharmaceutical company programs The Foundations partnered with South Central Adult Services of Valley City, ND to manage the initiative Since 2003, nearly 40,700 applications for medication assistance have been processed resulting in 7,175 people acquiring over \$28.3 million in essential prescription drugs During 2015, approximately \$520,000 million in prescriptions were acquired through the programs by over 145 clients
