a) The admissions clerk can take the application at the time of the admission. b) The Credit/Collection department can take the application when doing financial assessment. c) The application can be taken any time during the billing cycle. d) The application can be mailed to the patient.

2) Anyone applying for uncompensated care will be required to provide the hospital with proof of income. The proof of income can be as listed: a) Tax return from most recent year of filing, check stubs from the last three months or a check stub showing year-to-date earnings. b) A statement of earnings from the employer or source of income. c) Medicaid denial letter or verification through WVDHHR screening website. The associate will insure that Medicaid eligibility is solicited. If appropriate documentation is not attached, application will be denied. d) Listing of

all assets, ATV's, Boats, Campers, Property, Stocks, Bonds, CD's etc. The most current months bank statement is required.

3) The Business Office Manager or his/her designee will make all determinations: a) The Monthly income is listed and multiplied by 12. b) The chart is referenced to determine uncompensated eligibility. c) If eligible, this is noted and signed by the associate. d) If not eligible, expense information is analyzed. Non-discretionary expenses are considered necessities of life or job (shelter, food, utilities, car loan, etc.). e) Comparison of expenses to income determines disposable income for payment of a hospital debt. f) Total expenses are then totaled, with the same expense to income comparison. g) Accounts will be required to have asset information verified with the county assessor's office. If cash convertible asset information is exactly twice the amount of the patient portion of the St. Joseph's Hospital bill or more, applicant is not eligible for assistance. If substantial hard assets exist, they will be considered.

4) A patient will be notified if Uncompensated Care is denied or a percentage is granted.

5) Accounts approved for uncompensated care will be written off using the appropriate forms and codes.

6) Medicare accounts that are written off to Uncompensated Care must be listed on the Medicare bad Debt Compliance Checklist. Medicare accounts will be required to have asset information verified with the county assessors office.

7) Determination for Uncompensated Care will be based on annual income guidelines (see attachment). Determination will be made at the end of each month.

Management uses collection percentages, based upon historical collection experience, to determine collectability. Management also reviews troubled, aged accounts to determine collection potential. Patient accounts receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible. Recoveries of accounts previously written off are recorded as a reduction to bad debt expense when received. Interest is not charged on patient accounts receivable.

Upshur County WV is the primary service area for St. Joseph's Hospital. The 2010 census showed that 19.3% of the population in Upshur county to be below poverty level. Thus, 19.3% of the bad debt cost was used to calculate the estimated amount of the Organization's bad debt expense attributable to patients under the Organization's financial assistance policy.

Part III, Line 8:

The Medicare allowable costs and revenues were derived from the Medicare cost report.

Part III, Line 9b:

Prior to an account going to collections, especially if it is a self-pay patient, the Organization checks Medicaid and charity eligibility. St. Joseph's hospital requires all self-pay patients to talk to a financial counselor to determine qualification for charity care and Medicaid programs. Self-pay patients are required to show proof that they have been denied by Medicaid. After it is determined that self-pay patients do not qualify for assistance, and if they are still unable to pay their bills,

they are set up on a payment plan suited to their income level. Only when a self-pay patient falls behind on his/her payments and it is certain he or she does not qualify for assistance are they sent to a collection agency.

Part VI, Line 2:

St. Joseph's Hospital has contracted with an outside company to perform the community wide needs assessment survey and has translated this information into the Community Health Needs Assessment Report which outlines actions taken. In addition, an outside company performs post admission surveys for all inpatients. This survey includes questions regarding whether the patient's needs were met during the stay, and the hospital reviews this HCAHPS data to determine what services may need to be added based on that data.

Part VI, Line 4:

St. Joseph's Hospital is located in a small town in a rural, mountainous region of West Virginia. The hospital serves its home county (with a population of approximately 24,477 residents), as well as parts of five surrounding counties. The population served is an aging population with nearly 30% of the population in the 45 to 65 year old age group and will be reaching retirement age over the next 20 years, resulting in a major impact on health care in the area. In St. Joseph's Hospital's home county, 18.8% of the population is below the poverty level and nineteen percent (19%) of the population is uninsured, with 4.6% of the children in the county having no insurance. The teen pregnancy rate is 31.2%. The following hospitals provide a full range of acute care, ancillary and case management services and many also provide long-term care. The hospitals

are located in the immediate service area or the contiguous service area:
Stonewall Jackson Memorial Hospital, United Hospital Center, Davis
Memorial Hospital, Louis A. Johnson VA Medical Center, and Broadus

provides comprehensive psychiatric services for patients that have been
involuntarily committed to the facility.
