JMC, the Town of Jupiter, Palm Beach County Health Department and El Sol (Jupiter's Neighborhood Resource Center), opened the Jupiter Volunteer Clinic. The Clinic was established, along with input from the Florida Public Health Institute, in response to the growing number of uninsured/underinsured individuals living in the Jupiter area, who have limited access to health care. In addition, Jupiter Medical Center acquired a medical screening vehicle called the "Wellness in Motion" van equipped w
