We provide resident centered care. We are restraint free, excellent outcomes in wound care, pain management, weight management. We also provide IV therapy, hypertension management, medication management, diabetic management, dementia care, restorative nursing care and palliative care. Health Central Park provides full therapy services 7 days a week, 12 hours a day. Our therapy patients have excellent outcomes and after discharge usually continue their therapy as outpatients. On any given day we have about 65 to 70 patients in therapy Our main program is our orthopedic program of excellence, the length of stay for our knee patients is 23 days and hips average 25 days and we have about 83 orthopedic patients per month. Our therapy satisfaction is 9% higher than our peers. Health Central Park's workforce is made up of about 300 employees, with nursing department being the largest of about 205, 125 of which are C N A's. We are privileged to have a full time Nurse Practitioner which acts as the physician extender and attends to urgent and other medica needs on a timely basis. We also have a full time dietician and a nutritional specialist to address the clinical dietary needs of our residents. Our social workers do discharge planning and assist with the psycho-social needs of the residents along with our full recreation departments.
