An active Younger Chemists Committee sponsors an annual career symposium and a research conference attended by students from around New England. The Medicinal Chemistry Group provides programs for scientists from biotechnology and pharmaceutical industries in the area. A committee sponsors meetings during Earth Day and National Chemistry Week which ecourage the public to view chemical demonstrations and involve students in exploring chemical phenomena. Special regional meetings are used to reach portions of the membership that are outside of the immediate Boston area.
