If members propose additional candidates or if the Nominating Committee itself proposes more candidates than there are openings on the Board of Directors, an election is held. If an election is held, the election is conducted by mail ballot. Only those ballots received 20 or more days prior to the Annual Meeting are counted. Results of the election are certified by an independent professional group and announced at the Annual Meeting. If no additional candidates are proposed by the members, or the Nominating Committee's slate presents a number of candidates which does not exceed the number of openings available, the committee's slate is considered elected by acclamation.
