Gary and Mary West Health Policy Center, Inc. Summary of Direct Charitable Activities Form 990-PF, Part IX-A

In 2015, the Gary and Mary West Health Policy Center, Inc. ("WHPC") built on its previous years' works and continued to provide input and feedback on project ideas where economic analysis, knowledge of payment incentives, and policy experience were needed. Several promising projects have been developed and continue to advance the West Health mission. In late 2015, WHPC further focused its work around actively researching senior-appropriate acute, long-term and chronic care models that support independence for seniors. Americans are living longer than ever before thanks to major medical and public health advances, and greater access to healthcare. However, as our population ages and grows, we face significant challenges to living out our years in the best way possible. We are in the midst of one of the largest demographic shifts in U.S. history as Baby Boomers turn 65 at the rate of 10,000 a day. This is already having a major impact on our healthcare system and community-based services, which are not scaled or structured to meet the demands, needs and expectations of seniors and their families.

CONTINUING (OR ONGOING) ACTIVITIES:

MEDICARE REFORM

With a few exceptions, Medicare – the health insurance program for the aged and permanently disabled – has changed little since enactment fifty years ago. Today, Medicare's benefit design, especially for Parts A (hospital insurance) and B (supplementary medical insurance) cost-sharing, differs in important ways from cost-sharing requirements in traditional health insurance. While the biggest difference is the lack of any catastrophic protection such as a cap on annual out-of-pocket spending, other appropriate changes could be implemented to assure a modernized benefit for beneficiaries. WHPC contracted with the Actuarial Research Corporation to develop a unique modeling tool to study the impact of policy proposals on beneficiaries and the federal budget.

VALUE-BASED INSURANCE DESIGN (V-BID)

V-BID is a concept in insurance design that centers on structuring cost-sharing to drive patients to high-value care. In 2014, the WHPC sponsored a research project through academicians at three respected universities that tested whether incorporating V-BID into high deductible health plans (HDHPs) would encourage people with chronic disease to migrate to HDHPs. The research showed that for a targeted group of "high-value" services, up to 45 million Americans could potentially migrate from more traditional plans to HDHPs that cover these services. The researchers estimate that the savings resulting from the shift in coverage for employer-sponsored insurance alone could be as much as \$1 trillion over 10 years.

While promising, this policy change requires a change in federal regulations by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). In July, 2014, staff of WHPC met with federal officials from the IRS and the U.S. Treasury Department to understand their perspectives on changing the regulations. The federal officials did not commit to changing the regulations but did ask for recommendations on how they should be changed. Since then, the WHPC has continued to engage with stakeholders to address the Treasury/IRS questions

and concerns. Currently, we have aligned more than 30 stakeholders from industry, medicine and advocacy to jointly recommend policy change.

Additional research is also underway to advance V-BID in the Medicare Advantage (MA) space. The use of Value-Based Insurance Design in MA plans may lower or eliminate cost-sharing with a goal of promoting evidence-based, high-value treatments and clinical services which are used to treat and manage chronic disease. This research will serve to support an MA demonstration project to allow participating MA plans to use V-BID to lower copayments and coinsurance for seniors in order to encourage the use of specific, evidence-based treatments/services as well as specific high-performing providers as an improvement to coverage for those seniors living with multiple chronic conditions. The WHPC funded research with the University of Michigan Center for Value-Based Insurance Design studies the impact of this policy on both the plans and the beneficiaries. Specifically, it focuses on congestive heart failure, diabetes and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

HEALTHCARE TRANSPARENCY - ALL PAYOR CLAIMS DATABASES

Federal, state, and private sector entities have embraced the release of healthcare data although challenges remain in making the most pertinent information readily accessible, understandable, and usable to consumers and other healthcare stakeholders. All-payer claims databases (APCDs) are databases typically created from a state mandate and generally include data derived from medical, pharmacy, and dental claims; provider files; and eligibility files from private and public payers in the state. APCDs hold great promise for accelerating healthcare transparency efforts to better understand cost and utilization of services, and recognize cost savings.

WHPC contracted with the University of New Hampshire and has collaborated with the APCD Council which is a learning group of government, private, non-profit, and academic organizations focused on improving the development and deployment of state-based all payer claims databases (APCDs). The APCD Council is convened and coordinated by the Institute for Health Policy and Practice (IHPP) at the University of New Hampshire (UNH) and the National Association of Health Data Organizations (NAHDO). The Council's work focuses on shared learning amongst APCD stakeholders, early stage technical assistance to states and catalyzing states to achieve mutual goals.

NEW ACTIVITIES:

HOME-BASED PRIMARY CARE

WHPC focused on advancing policies to manage chronic conditions through the delivery of home-based primary care for the frail elderly. Specifically, ways to more effectively utilize primary care providers and care coordination teams in order to meet the goal of maximizing health care outcomes for Medicare patients living with chronic conditions. There is a small, often underrepresented population in the U.S. healthcare debate that is critical to how we think about improving patient-centered care and lowering costs. The frail elderly are some of Medicare's most complex patients. This group accounts for only five percent of the Medicare population, but drives almost 50 percent of its costs.

The research involved in-depth review of MedStar's nationally recognized Medical House Call Practice (MHCP) model to identify the key levers that will catalyze the growth of home-based primary care for the frail elderly. Specifically, WHPC assessed the methodology used to capture cost and potential

savings for this program model and provided additional data analytics to inform the development of appropriate payment policies.

LONG-TERM SERVICES AND SUPPORTS

In May, 2015, the WHPC began a research project with the Center for Health Care Strategies (and its partners Mathematica Policy Research and Airam Actuarial Consulting) to identify best practices for reimbursement of Medicaid's long-term services and supports (LTSS) programs. The national initiative will glean lessons from pilot efforts in eight states: Arizona, Kansas, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin.

Medicaid's LTSS programs provide health-related supportive services for low-income seniors with a focus on helping individuals remain independent in their homes or communities as long as possible. As the country's largest funder of LTSS, Medicaid covers a flexible set of services including personal assistance with basic daily tasks such as bathing, dressing, toileting and eating, as well as home- and community-based services like adult day care and, when necessary, nursing home care. As states grapple with the rising cost of Medicaid, they have increasingly looked to managed care organizations to provide LTSS and coordinate the care of individuals served by the program, typically paying a fixed amount per month for each beneficiary. However, if reimbursement strategies do not address the diverse needs of seniors, it can lead to inadequate care being provided to those who need the most care and excessive payments for those who do not require a high level of assistance. The eight participating states were chosen for their commitment to using payment strategies to drive improvements in long-term care. Over the next year, key stakeholders from the government, private sector and policy community will join technical experts from CHCS, Mathematica Policy Research, and Airam Actuarial Consulting to help these states test new rate-setting, risk adjustment and data collection approaches for Medicaid managed LTSS (MLTSS) programs.

Participating states will test new or revised rate setting methods over several months. The best practices they identify will be included in a toolkit available to all states. The toolkit will be part of an online resource library to help states at different phases of designing, implementing or administering Medicaid MLTSS programs use rate-setting approaches to drive care improvements for beneficiaries while lowering costs.
