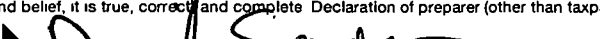
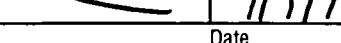

PART IX-A Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

1) Learning and evaluation: Activities to learn from and communicate grantmaking results.

One of the Foundation's guiding principles is to "be a learning organization interested in measuring outcomes, communicating results, and diffusing successful ideas for implementation throughout New York State and beyond." These learning and evaluation activities increase the impact of the Foundation's grantmaking. Foundation staff develop grant outcome reports to capture and share the lessons of nearly every grant awarded and maintain a vibrant website to disseminate these lessons. Staff also spend time developing and shaping policy analyses and reports on key topics affecting New York's health system.

2) Leverage: Activities to raise funds and create partnerships with other organizations to increase the ability of grantees to improve the health of New Yorkers.

A key strategy for the Foundation is to attract and leverage public and private funds to complement and amplify its own grant dollars. In 2015, a grant to the Institute for Veterans and Military Families at Syracuse University yielded \$15 million in federal Supportive Services for Veteran Families funding to support the most vulnerable veterans and their families on Long Island and in the five boroughs of New York City. With NYSHHealth support for technical assistance from the Community Health Care Association of New York State (CHCANYS), five community health centers in New York State received federal New Access Point funding totaling more than \$16 million over five years. In addition, the Foundation's work with CHCANYS to develop an analysis and plan for sustainable health centers in New York helped inform Mayor de Blasio's Caring Neighborhoods initiative, which will invest \$20 million over the next two years to expand primary care capacity in New York City. The Foundation is also leveraging the funding of a range of private funders. For example, the California HealthCare Foundation and the Hilton Foundation are collectively contributing \$40,000 to a project with the Center for Health Care Strategies to develop the evidence for housing as a critical health care intervention for people who are chronically homeless and have complex health care needs. In addition, the Robin Hood Foundation contributed \$25,000 to complement an NYSHHealth grant to the Corporation for Supportive Housing to develop a statewide community needs assessment on supportive housing.

3) Outreach and education: Activities to convene key stakeholders and educate the media, policymakers, and other audiences about important health care trends and issues affecting New Yorkers and the New York health system.

Foundation staff regularly reach out to the media and respond to requests from reporters to inform their stories on pressing health issues; write blog posts, journal articles, and opinion pieces; share news and information via e-mail blasts and social media; and deliver speeches and presentations at meetings and conferences. The Foundation also serves as a neutral convener of key players in New York's health system. In 2015, the Foundation hosted dozens of convenings, from small, invitation-only discussions, to its "A Conversation With..." series (which brings together leaders in the field of health care to discuss issues pertinent to the Foundation's work), to large conferences attracting hundreds of attendees. These two large convenings were: (1) a summit on population health (attended by approximately 400 people), co-hosted with the New York Academy of Medicine and New York University, to discuss opportunities for bridging the divide between health care and population health and (2) a conference on health care competition and consolidation, attended by more than 200 health care leaders, policymakers, and researchers, to address New York State's rapidly shifting health care market resulting from health system consolidation.

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BY-LAWS
OF
THE NEW YORK STATE HEALTH FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I
ESTABLISHMENT OF CORPORATION

The Corporation is a Type D corporation as defined in Section 201 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York. The Corporation has been formed under the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York and the formation of the Corporation is authorized by Section 7317(k) of the New York Insurance Law. The provisions of Section 7317(k) of the New York Insurance Law are hereby incorporated by reference, and to the extent of any inconsistencies between the provisions thereof and the provisions contained in these By-laws or in any other law, general, special or local, the provisions of Section 7317(k) of the New York Insurance Law shall be controlling.

ARTICLE II
MEMBERS

The Corporation shall have no members, as permitted under Section 201 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York, which provides that absent contrary provisions, "[A] type D corporation is subject to all provisions of this chapter which are applicable to a type B corporation under this chapter . . ." Note that Section 601 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law provides that type B corporations may have no members.

ARTICLE III
OFFICES

The principal office of the Corporation shall be located in the County of New York of the State of New York or such other place within the State of New York as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. The Corporation may also have offices at such other places within or without the State of New York as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine or the business of the Corporation may require.

ARTICLE IV
DIRECTORS

4.1 Appointment and Term. The Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Directors composed of nine members, three of whom shall be voting members and six of whom shall be non-voting members, which shall be appointed as follows: one voting member and two nonvoting members shall be appointed by each of the governor, the temporary president of the senate, and the speaker of the assembly. Each member of the Board of Directors shall have a term of three years and may be reappointed at the end of said term by the same person that made the original appointment.

4.2 Vacancies. A vacancy in the membership of the Board of Directors shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term provided for by the original appointment by the same person that made the original appointment.

4.3 Qualifications. Members of the Board of Directors may not be officers or employees of the State of New York or any municipal subdivision thereof. The Board of Directors shall be broadly representative of the community and include representatives of patient, consumer and public interest organizations and individuals with expertise in public health, health care delivery and financing, patient health issues, investments and philanthropic administration; provided further, no more than three members of the entire Board of Directors shall be representatives from any one organization or provider group and Board vacancies shall be filled from eligible representatives who are not represented or who are under represented on the Board. No person who is an officer, director, or staff member of Empire HealthChoice, Inc. (d/b/a Empire Blue Cross and Blue Shield) at the time such corporation applied to the Superintendent of Insurance for permission to convert into a for-profit organization under Section 7317 of the New York Insurance Law, or thereafter, shall be an officer, director or staff member of the Corporation.

4.4 Chair of the Board and Other Designees.

(a) Selection by vote. The Chair will be elected for a two-year term in the following manner: Prior to the end of the Chair's term, the full board will conduct a non-binding "Sense of the Board" resolution vote expressing a preference for a Chair. Following such vote, a Chair will be designated by a unanimous vote of the voting members. The maximum number of such two-year terms that any Board member may serve as Chair is three.

(b) Chair Rotation. If there is not unanimous approval by the voting members of the designation of a new Chair, then, until there is a unanimous vote, the Chair position will rotate annually in following order: the voting member appointed by the Temporary President of the State Senate; the voting member appointed by the Governor; the voting member appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly. A Chair designated using the rotation process has a term of up to 12 months, or until such time that the Board selects a Chair by vote. If a Chair is elected following a Chair designated through the rotation process, then the next time the rotation process is used, the voting member next in order would become Chair. A Director may decline appointment as Chair, in which case, the Director next in order will be appointed.

The Board of Directors may from time to time designate other members of the Board to such other positions (including Committee chairs) as the Board may determine in its discretion.

4.5 Resignation. A director may resign at any time by giving notice to the Board of Directors, the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. Unless otherwise specified in the notice, the resignation shall take effect upon receipt thereof by the Board or such officer, and the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

4.6 Meetings. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at the place, time, and date as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, or, if not so fixed, as may be determined by the President of the Corporation, at any place within or without the State of New York. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chair of the Board or the President of the

Corporation and shall be called by the Chair of the Board, President or Secretary of the Corporation at the direction of not less than two directors then in office, or as may otherwise be provided by law. Any request for such meeting shall state the purpose or purposes of the proposed meeting. A director may participate in a meeting of the Board of Directors by a conference telephone, videoconference or similar communication equipment by which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each other if all participants are advised of the communications equipment and the names of the participants in the conference are divulged to all participants. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this Section constitutes presence in person at the meeting.

4.7 Notice. Notice of the time, date and place of annual or special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given to each director by first class mail, fax, overnight delivery service, email or personal delivery not less than two (2) days before the date of the meeting. Notice of special meetings shall indicate the purpose for which they are called and the person or persons calling the meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of meeting. Notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who submits a signed waiver of notice whether before or after the meeting.

4.8 Quorum. All three voting members of the Board of Directors, present in person or by communications equipment described in paragraph 4.11 of this ARTICLE IV shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business or of any specified item of business.

4.9 Voting. Prior to any vote that shall be necessary for the transaction of any business or the exercise of any power or function of the Board, the Chair will poll all members of the Board to determine whether there is a unanimous consensus on the pending action. All items where there is unanimous consensus will be placed on a consent agenda for action by the Board. In the event that unanimous consensus is not reached on an action, then a separate vote by the Board shall be taken. The affirmative vote of all three voting members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be necessary for the transaction of any business or the exercise of any power or function of the Board of Directors. Voting may be by voice vote, or by any other method agreed upon by the Board of Directors; provided, that, upon demand of any person entitled to vote, any vote upon any question before the meeting shall be by ballot.

4.10 Powers and Delegation. The Board may delegate to one or more of its members, or its agents, such powers and duties as it may deem proper. The members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall have the power to make and execute contracts and all other instruments, and to exercise such other powers, necessary or convenient for the exercise of its powers and functions.

4.11 Action by the Board of Directors. If all voting members of the Board of Directors consent in writing to any action of the Corporation, such action shall be as valid a corporate action as though it had been authorized at a meeting of the Board of Directors and the written consents (which may be executed in counterparts) shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors. Participation of one or more directors by conference telephone allowing all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other at the same time shall constitute presence at the meeting.

4.12 Conduct of Meetings. The Chair of the Board shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors or, in the absence of the Chair, any other director elected by those present. The Secretary of the Corporation shall act as Secretary at all meetings of the Board, but in the absence of the Secretary, any Assistant Secretary or any person appointed by the presiding officer.

4.13 Compensation. The members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall serve without compensation for their services as members, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties. Members of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law, may engage in private employment, or in a profession or business.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES AND ADVISORY BOARDS

5.1 Committees of the Board. The Board of Directors may designate one or more committees of the Board of Directors, each of which shall consist of the three (3) voting directors, plus other directors as the Board may determine, which committees, to the extent not restricted by law, shall have and exercise the authority and act on behalf of the Board of Directors in the management of the Corporation; but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors of any responsibility imposed upon them by law. Each committee shall continue at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. Each committee may adopt rules for its own government not inconsistent with these By-laws or with rules prescribed by the Board of Directors.

5.2 Committees of the Corporation. The Board may elect or appoint committees of the Corporation consisting of such persons who may, but need not be directors, as the Board shall designate. These committees shall have such duties as permitted by law and as deemed appropriate by the Board.

5.3 Advisory Boards. A community advisory board shall be established by the Board of Directors to allow ongoing community consultation and engagement.

ARTICLE VI CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

6.1 Conflicts of Interest Policy. All directors and officers shall comply at all times with the provisions of this ARTICLE VI. This ARTICLE VI shall constitute the formal mechanism established by the Board to avoid conflicts of interest, as required by Section 7317(k)(11) of the New York Insurance Law.

(a) A conflict of interest shall include any transaction or situation in which such director or officer, or any of their immediate family members, has a direct or indirect financial interest which may influence the judgment of such member, agent or representative in the performance of his or her duties to the Corporation;

(b) Each such director or officer shall disclose to the Board each situation or transaction in which such person has, or may reasonably be considered to have, a conflict of interest, and pursuant to Section 715 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, the test in

such an event is that the contract or transaction was fair and reasonable as to the Corporation at the time it was authorized;

(c) Each such director or officer shall be prohibited from accepting any gratuitous service, loan, discount, money, or article or service of value (x) from entities having actual or prospective business contacts with the Corporation or (y) otherwise as a result of his or her position, other than articles or services of nominal value or reasonable entertainment of nominal value; and

(d) The Board may set forth other restrictions and requirements (including a conflict of interest policy) that are designed to ensure compliance with applicable law or otherwise to ensure independent judgment of the members of the Board or its agents, representatives or persons acting on its behalf.

6.2 Prohibition Against Grants Benefiting WellChoice. The Corporation may not make grants benefiting WellChoice, Inc., a Delaware corporation, or any subsidiary, affiliate or successor (by merger, consolidation, sale of assets or otherwise), or any director, member of management or staff of any of the foregoing.

ARTICLE VII OFFICERS

7.1 Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be such as the Board of Directors shall from time to time designate in their absolute discretion, including, without limitation, a President, a Secretary, one or more Vice Presidents, Assistant Vice Presidents, Assistant Secretaries and/or Assistant Treasurers. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except no person may hold the offices of both President and Secretary.

7.2 Election and Term of Office. The Board of Directors shall elect the officers of the Corporation at each annual meeting. Each officer shall be elected for a term of one year or a shorter or longer term as approved by the Board of Directors, or until his or her successor is duly elected and qualified.

7.3 Removal and Resignation. Any officer may be removed with or without cause by the affirmative vote of all three voting members of the Board of Directors. An officer may resign by written notice to the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. The resignation shall be effective upon receipt or at a subsequent time specified in the notice of resignation. The Board of Directors shall have the power to fill any vacancies in any offices occurring for whatever reason.

7.4 Compensation. The officers of the Corporation may receive such reasonable salaries and other reasonable benefits as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine.

7.5 Duties. The duties and authority of officers shall be those usually pertaining to their respective offices, subject to the supervision and direction of the Board of Directors.

7.6 Employees and Other Agents. The Board of Directors or the President of the Corporation may appoint from time to time such employees and other agents as they shall deem necessary, advisable or appropriate, each of whom shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of

Directors, and shall have such authority and perform such duties and shall receive such reasonable compensation, as the President of the Corporation may from time to time determine subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII ACCOUNTS AND INVESTMENTS

8.1 Accounts. The Board of Directors is authorized to select the banks or depositories they deem proper for the funds of the Corporation and shall determine who shall be authorized from time to time on the Corporation's behalf to sign checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money, acceptances, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness, to enter into contracts, or to execute and deliver other documents and instruments.

8.2 Investments. The funds of the Corporation may be retained in whole or in part in cash or be invested and reinvested from time to time in such property, real, personal, or otherwise, including stocks, bonds, or other securities, as the Treasurer, subject to the direction and control of the Board of Directors may deem advisable.

ARTICLE IX BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Corporation shall keep at its principal office correct and complete books and records of accounts and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors, any committees of the Board of Directors, and of the election of officers and actions of the officers.

ARTICLE X FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall end on the last day of the month of December.

ARTICLE XI SEAL

The Board of Directors shall provide a seal for the Corporation which shall be in the charge of the Secretary, to be affixed to documents in accordance with the directions of the Board of Directors or the officers of the Corporation or as may be required by law.

ARTICLE XII WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever notice is required to be given under the provisions of the laws of the State of New York or the organizational documents of the Corporation, a waiver thereof signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice to the fullest extent permissible by applicable law.

ARTICLE XIII
PERSONAL LIABILITY, INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

13.1 Personal Liability. Section 7317(k)(8)(A) of the New York Insurance Law provides that neither the members of the Board of Directors of the Corporation nor any agent or other person or persons acting on its behalf, while acting within the scope of their authority as members or agents of the Board, shall be subject to any personal liability resulting from the carrying out of the powers conferred hereunder.

13.2 Indemnification and Insurance.

(a) New York Public Officers Law. Section 7317(k)(8)(B) of the New York Insurance Law provides that Section 17 of the New York Public Officers Law (which requires that the State of New York defend and indemnify State officers and employees) shall apply to members of the Board of Directors and agents or other persons acting on the Board's behalf, in connection with any and all claims, demands, suits, actions or proceedings which may be made or brought against any of them arising out of any determination made or actions taken or omitted to be taken in compliance with any obligations under or pursuant to the terms of Section 7317(k) of the New York Insurance Law.

(b) Additional Indemnification Rights. In addition to the indemnification rights provided under Section 17 of the New York Public Officers Law, the following shall apply to directors and officers of the Corporation, as well as to such other persons described below:

(i) Except as otherwise provided by law, no director or officer of the Corporation shall be liable to any person other than the Corporation based solely on such director's or officer's conduct in the execution of such office unless such conduct constituted gross negligence or was intended to cause the resulting harm.

(ii) Except as otherwise provided by law and except as provided in paragraph 13.2(b)(iii), the Corporation shall indemnify any person made, or threatened to be made, a party to any action or proceeding, whether criminal or civil, including an action by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor and an action, by reason of the fact that such person, or such person's testator or intestate, is or was a director or officer including also an action by or in the right of any corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise in which such director or officer served in any capacity at the request of the Corporation, against judgments, fines, amounts paid in settlement and reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees actually and necessarily incurred as a result of such action or proceeding, or any appeal thereon and including attorneys' fees and costs actually and necessarily incurred by a director or officer in seeking to enforce indemnification rights.

(iii) The Corporation shall not indemnify any director or officer if a judgment or other adjudication adverse to the director or officer establishes that his

or her acts were committed in bad faith or were the result of active and deliberate dishonesty and were material to the cause of action so adjudicated, or that he or she personally gained in fact a financial profit or other advantage to which he or she was not legally entitled.

(iv) The Corporation shall have the power, to the full extent permitted by law, to purchase and maintain insurance to indemnify its directors or officers, and to indemnify the Corporation for any obligation which it incurs as a result of indemnification of directors or officers.

ARTICLE XIV AMENDMENTS

These By-laws may be altered, amended or added to by the affirmative vote of all the voting members of the Board of Directors at any meeting or by the unanimous written consent of the voting members of the Board of Directors.
