GRANT APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Proposal letters are considered appropriate applications for grants. Submissions should contain the purpose and background of the organization

Applicants should submit as much detail as necessary to explain and justify the need for funding. Particular attention will be paid to the reasonableness of administrative expense ratios and fund raising costs. Organizations must be willing to have results of a grant audited.

The following information, indexed on a cover sheet, must accompany the proposal:

- 1 Amount requested
- 2 Specific purpose of funding
- 3 Specific location (s) of project/service
- 4 Details of other sources and amounts of funding, including list of foundations
- 5 List of current board members
- 6 Budgetary data (for the project, if the request is for a specific project)
- 7 Proof of <u>federal</u> (not state) tax-exempt status (i. e., current 501 (c) (3) letter)
- 8 Federal tax identification number
- 9 Most recent audited financial statements

<u>February 1st</u> is the deadline for applications to be considered in that year's budget. In order for pertinent information to be considered current, we suggest that applications be <u>sent between December 1st and February 1st</u>.

Applicants will be notified of grant decisions usually after July 1, following the annual meeting of the Foundation Board of Directors.

GRANT GUIDELINES

- 1 The Foundation's areas of interest involve the fields of higher education, particularly in scientific and environmental fields, educational programs at all levels, and human services. Occasionally, grants are made in other areas such as health, medical research and cultural <u>Grants generally are limited to organizations located in the greater Chicago area.</u>
- 2 Grants may be made for general operating support, specific projects, and

- occasionally, capital programs Grants will be made on a single year basis Grants made for specific projects require grantees to render accountability by means of periodic reports
- 3 The Foundation will make annual grants on a recurring basis to sustain operations of some organizations. However, long-term dependency situations are not considered desirable.
- 4 Grant requests are suggested to be within a range of \$2,500 (or less) to \$15,000. Grant recipients and amounts will be determined by several criteria. Naturally, availability of funds is a key factor.
- 5 The Foundation will occasionally make large grants (\$50,000 or more) to support unusually promising efforts in any of its areas of interest. Innovative research, special education, and/or other activities will be considered if the Foundation's support would assist an effort or a project in making a significant impact benefiting mankind.
- 6 The use of the matching grant, or "challenge" approach is encouraged where feasible.
- 7. The Foundation will support only organizations qualified as tax-exempt, (i.e., 501© (3) or 509 (a) (1) or (a) (2) organizations), under the regulations of the United States Internal Revenue Service **
- 8. The Foundation does not make grants directly to individuals.
- 9. The Foundation does <u>not</u> make grants for purposes that are strictly religious in nature.
- 10. The Foundation does <u>not</u> make grants for specific events, such as seminars, conferences, etc.
- 11. The Foundation does <u>not</u> normally support theater groups.
- 12. The Foundation does not normally support public or private high schools.
- ** Effective August 17, 2006, the Pension Protection Act of 2006 (H.R. 4) became law.

Among other things, this law imposes certain obligations on private foundations (such as McGraw Foundation) considering grants to "Supporting Organizations."

If your organization is a "Public Charity" under code section 501 (c) (3), it will have received an <u>additional</u> designation of 509 (a) (1), 509 (a) (2), or 509 (a) (3). We request that any grant application made to McGraw Foundation <u>include</u> proof of the appropriate Sec. <u>509</u> designation. This Sec. <u>509</u> designation is usually stated on the same federal Internal Revenue Service letter indicating your 501 (c) (3) status.

509 (a) (3) denotes a <u>supporting organization</u> affected by the new law. Before McGraw Foundation can proceed on an application from a 501 (c) (3) organization with a 509 (a) (3) designation, more information will be needed. If you have any doubt as to the nature and category of your organization's tax-exempt status, and current documentation thereof, please consult your professional tax advisor.



Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Foundation and nature of activities

The McGraw Foundation (the Foundation) was established in 1948 and is an Illinois not-for-profit corporation and exempt organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Its primary purpose is to fund grants to tax-exempt organizations in the fields of education, social services, cultural, health and environmental activities. The Foundation also matches, to a limit of \$25,000 per director, grants and contributions made by board members to tax-exempt organizations. The Foundation is governed by a self-perpetuating Board of Directors. Operations are managed by a full-time executive director to carry out the policies and procedures established by the Board of Directors.

Note 2 - Significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. These financial statements reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Financial statement presentation

The Foundation is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets, unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. As of December 31, 2015 and 2014, all of the net assets are unrestricted with no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets. Unrestricted assets have no donor imposed or legal stipulations as to their use. In addition, the Foundation is required to present a statement of cash flows.

Cash

Cash consists of checking and money market accounts. For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Foundation considers all highly liquid investments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash.

Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statements of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the statement of activities and changes in net assets. The cost of investments sold is based on the earliest acquisition cost of each security held at the time of sale

less any amortized premium paid over face value The Foundation's investments are managed by a professional manager.

The Foundation's investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the fair value of individual investments, it is at least reasonably possible that significant changes can occur in fair value that may materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

Property and equipment

Purchased property and equipment are capitalized at cost. Donated property and equipment are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair value. Such donations are reported as unrestricted contributions unless the donor has restricted the donated asset to a specific purpose. Equipment is depreciated using the straight-line method over estimated useful lives ranging from 5 to 7 years.

Income taxes

The Foundation is a private foundation and qualifies for exemption from income taxes but is subject to a two percent Federal excise tax on new investment income, including realized gains. The rate can be reduced to one percent if certain requirements as to the level of charitable distributions are met.

The Internal Revenue Code requires that certain minimum distributions be made in accordance with a specified formula. Failure to pay the minimum by the end of the succeeding year can result in additional taxes and possible loss of the Foundation's tax-exempt status. Distributions in excess of the minimum requirement reduce the required minimum distributions in future years, subject to a five-year limitation. At December 31, 2015, the Foundation had excess distribution carryovers to 2016 of approximately \$2,700,000.

The Foundation adopted the accounting for uncertainty in income tax guidance, which clarifies the accounting and recognition for tax positions taken on its income tax returns. In evaluating the Foundation's tax provisions and accruals, the Foundation believes that its estimates are appropriate and the Foundation has no material unrecognized income tax positions. The

Foundation's tax filings are subject to audit by various taxing authorities. At December 31, 2015, the Foundation is no longer subject to examination by federal and state taxing authorities for the periods ending before 2012

Compensated absences

Employees of the Foundation are entitled to paid vacation and paid sick days depending on job classification, length of service, and other factors. It is not practicable for the Foundation to estimate that amount of compensation for future absences. Accordingly, no liability for compensated absences has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements. The Foundation's policy is to recognize the costs of compensated absences when actually paid to the employees.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Financial statement presentation

Certain accounts relating to the prior year have been reclassified to current year presentation with no effect on previously reported increase (decrease) in unrestricted net assets.

Date of management's review

In preparing the financial statements, the Foundation has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through April 20, 2016, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Program services

The McGraw Foundation's mission is to provide financial assistance for educational and charitable purposes in furtherance of the public good and promoting the well-being of mankind. This is accomplished by providing support for a variety of educational and charitable activities. The Foundation was funded through contributions from Max McGraw, several McGraw family members and other benefactors.

Note 5 - Fair value measurements

The Foundation measures certain financial assets and liabilities at fair value in accordance with U.S. GAAP, which defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. U.S. GAAP also establishes a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the instrument's fair value measurement. The three levels within the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Association has the ability to access.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 5 - Fair value measurements, cont'd

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive

Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2015 and 2014.

Common stocks, state and municipal bonds, corporate notes and bonds, U.S. government securities, limited partnership and short term investments: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Note 6 - Lease

The Foundation conducts its operations from a premise that is leased under a cancellable operating lease which was renewed in 2015 and which will expire in November 2018. Total rent expense for the Foundation's operating lease amounted to approximately \$17,717 and \$17,399 in years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014, respectively.

Note 7 - Concentration of credit risk and market risk

Financial instruments that potentially expose the Foundation to concentrations of credit and market risk consist primarily of investments in debt and equity securities. The investments in debt securities do not represent significant concentrations of market risk inasmuch as such investments are diversified among U.S. Treasury and U.S. agency issuers. Common stock investments, while diversified among different industries and companies, are subject to declines in market values associated with the U.S. and global economies. To manage the risk, the Foundation strives to diversify its investments among various financial instruments and asset categories and uses multiple investment strategies.

Note 8 - Grant contingency

The Foundation has approved to provide financial support to the McGraw Center for Conservation Leadership program conducted by the Max McGraw Wildlife Foundation. Financial support is estimated at \$500,000 per year for the next three years beginning in 2016. This is a nonbinding commitment, and therefore, no hability has been recorded in the financial statements.

The Foundation has approved the McGraw Foundation Challenge Grant Program beginning in 2011. Under this program, the Foundation will match cash donations made to the Max McGraw Wildlife Foundation up to a maximum of \$200,000 annually in each of the next five years. If more than \$200,000 is collected in any one year, the amount in excess of \$200,000 may be carried over to the following year. The Foundation cannot predict the amount that will be paid



from this grant program. Accordingly, no liability has been recorded in the financial statements. The Foundation paid \$200,000 during the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014.

The Foundation has also approved a grant to Allendale Association in the amount of \$150,000 over a three year period beginning in 2014 The Foundation paid \$50,000 during the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014, respectively.

Note 9 – Grant payable

At December 31, 2014, the Foundation was committed under grant programs for payments for future years of \$42,500 with a present value of the same. This grant commitment was paid in 2015.
