AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF WILLIAM MALE FOUNDATION A CALIFORNIA NONPROFIT PUBLIC BENEFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the corporation is WILLIAM MALE FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE II

PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal office for the transaction of the activities and affairs of this corporation is located at **1281 Hymettus Ave, Encinitas**, in San Diego County, California. The board of directors may change the location of the principal office. Any such change of location must be noted by the secretary on these bylaws opposite this Section; alternatively, this Section may be amended to state the new location.

ARTICLE III

GENERAL AND SPECIFIC PURPOSES

This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public purposes.

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law. Despite any other provision in these articles, the corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that do not further the purposes of this corporation, and the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by (a) a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law, or (b) a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Internal

Revenue Code Section 170(c)(2) or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law.

The specific purpose of this corporation is to promote the arts by providing grants to individuals who are eighteen (18) years or older residing in San Diego County for the pursuit of the arts. In the context of these purposes, the corporation shall offer qualified individuals the opportunity to apply for scholarships or grants for study at an educational institution under Section 4945(g)(1) or for travel, study or other similar purposes to enhance a particular skill of the grantee or to produce a specific product under Section 4945(g)(3).

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of lobbying or propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except as provided in the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(h); this corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including publishing or distributing statements) any political campaign or behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE IV

CONSTRUCTION AND DEFINITIONS

Unless the context requires otherwise, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions in the California Nonprofit Corporation Law shall govern the construction of these bylaws. Without limiting the generality of the preceding sentence, the masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter, the singular includes the plural, the plural includes the singular, and the term "person" includes both a legal entity and a natural person.

ARTICLE V

DEDICATION OF ASSETS

This corporation's assets are irrevocably dedicated to public benefit purposes. No part of the net earnings, properties, or assets of the corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual, or to any director or officer of the corporation. On liquidation or dissolution, all properties and assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of the corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation that is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and that has established its exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

ARTICLE VI

PRIVATE FOUNDATION PROVISIONS

- a. The corporation will distribute its income for each taxable year to be distributed at such time and in such manner as not to subject the foundation to tax under Section 4942, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- b. The corporation will not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d), or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- c. The corporation will not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c), or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.
- d. The corporation will not make any investments in a manner that would subject it to tax under Section 4944, or corresponding provisions of any later federal tax laws.

ARTICLE VII

CORPORATION WITHOUT MEMBERS

This corporation shall have no voting or nonvoting members within the meaning of the Nonprofit Corporation Law.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. General and Specific Powers of Board

a. General Powers

Subject to the provisions and limitations of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law and any other applicable laws, and subject to any limitations of the articles of incorporation or bylaws, the corporation's activities and affairs shall be managed, and all corporate powers shall be exercised, by or under the direction of the board.

b. Specific Powers

Without prejudice to the general powers set forth in Section 1 of these bylaws, but subject to the same limitations, the board shall have the power to:

(1) Appoint and remove, at the pleasure of the board, all corporate officers, agents, and employees; prescribe powers and duties for them as are consistent with the law, the

- articles of incorporation, and these bylaws; fix their compensation; and require from them security for faithful service.
- (2) Change the principal office or the principal business office in California from one location to another; cause the corporation to be qualified to conduct its activities in any other state, territory, dependency, or country; conduct its activities in or outside California; and designate a place in or outside California for holding any meeting.
- (3) Borrow money and incur indebtedness on the corporation's behalf and cause to be executed and delivered for the corporation's purposes, in the corporate name, promissory notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of trust, mortgages, pledges, hypothecations, and other evidences of debt and securities.
- (4) Adopt and use a corporate seal and alter the form of the seal.

Section 2. Number of and Qualifications for Directors

The board of directors shall consist of at least one (1) director but no more than five (5) directors unless changed by amendment to these bylaws. The exact number of directors shall be fixed, within those limits, by the resolution adopted by the board of directors. The qualifications for directors are individuals who are willing to volunteer their time to the organization and who support the purposes of the organization. There shall be no nonvoting or honorary directors.

Section 3. Restriction on Interested Persons as Directors

No more than 49 percent of the persons serving on the board may be "interested persons." An interested person is (a) any person compensated by the corporation for services rendered to it within the previous 12 months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a director as director; and (b) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendant, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of such person. However, any violation of this paragraph shall not affect the validity or enforceability of transactions entered into by the corporation.

Section 4. Designated Directors

- a. Directors may be designated by the founder William Male ("Founder") until he is unable or unwilling to so designate. Directors who are designated by the Founder may not be removed without written consent from the Founder unless such director is (a) convicted of a felony, (b) declared of unsound mind by a court order, or (c) found by a final order or judgement of any court to have breached a duty under California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, Chapter 2, Article 3 ("Conditions for Removal"). Designated directors shall be listed in Exhibit B attached to these bylaws and may be amended from time to time in the Founder's sole discretion.
- b. Each designated director shall hold office until such director (a) resigns, (b) is removed by the Founder, or (c) satisfies one of the Conditions for Removal provided above.

c. In the event that there are vacancies on the Board of Directors that have not been filled by the Founder's designation, directors may be elected or appointed as provided in Section 5 below to fill such vacancies. Directors who are elected or appointed by the board and not designated by the Founder shall serve for a term of one (1) year and may be re-elected for successive one-year terms in the discretion of the board. Elected and appointed directors shall be listed in **Exhibit C** attached to these bylaws and may be amended from time to time by the board.

Section 5. Vacancies on Board of Directors

a. Events Causing Vacancies of Board

A vacancy or vacancies on the board of directors shall occur in the event of (a) death, removal, or resignation of any director; (b) the declaration by resolution of the board of a vacancy in the office of a director who has been convicted of a felony, declared of unsound mind by a court order, or found by a final order or judgment of any court to have breached a duty under California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, Chapter 2, Article 3; (c) removal of a designated director by the Founder; (d) the increase of the authorized number of directors, or (e) expiration of an elected director's term.

b. Resignation of Directors

Except as provided below, any director may resign by giving written notice to the chairman of the board, if any, or to the president or the secretary of the board. The resignation shall be effective when the notice is given unless it specifies a later time for the resignation to become effective. If a director's resignation is effective at a later time, the board may elect a successor to take office as of the date when the resignation becomes effective.

Except on notice to the California Attorney General, no director may resign if the corporation would be left without a duly elected director or directors.

c. Removal of Directors.

Except as provided above with respect to designated directors, any director may be removed, with or without cause, by the vote of the majority of the members of the entire board of directors at a special meeting called for that purpose, or at a regular meeting, provided that notice of that meeting and of the removal questions are given as provided in Section 6. However, a director who was designated as a director by the Founder may be removed without cause by the Founder, and may not be removed without the written consent of the Founder. Any vacancy caused by the removal of a director shall be filled as provided in Sections 4 and 5.

Any director who does not attend three successive board meetings will automatically be removed from the board without board resolution unless:

- (A) The director requests a leave of absence for a limited period of time, and the leave is approved by the directors at a regular or special meeting. If such leave is granted, the number of board members will be reduced by one in determining whether a quorum is or is not present;
- (B) The director suffers from an illness or disability which prevents him or her from attending meetings and the board by resolution waives the automatic removal procedure of this subsection; or
- (C) The board by resolution of the majority of board members agrees to reinstate the director who has missed three meetings.

c. Filling Vacancies

Vacancies that are not filled under Section 4 may be filled by approval of the board, or if the number of directors then in office is less than a quorum, by (1) the unanimous written consent of the directors then in office, (2) the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office at a meeting held according to notice or waivers of notice complying with Corporations Code Section 5211, (3) a sole remaining director, or (4) if no directors remain, then by the California Attorney General's office.

d. No Vacancy on Reduction of Number of Directors

Any reduction in the authorized number of directors shall not result in any directors being removed before his or her term of office expires.

Section 6. Meetings of Board

a. Place of Meetings

Meetings of the board shall be held at any place within or outside California that has been designated by resolution of the board or in the notice of the meeting or, if not so designated, at the principal office of the corporation.

b. Meeting by Telecommunication

Any board meeting may be held by conference telephone, video screen communication, or other communications equipment. Participation in a meeting under this Section shall constitute presence in person at the meeting if all of the following apply:

- (1) Each person participating in the meeting can communicate concurrently with all other persons.
- (2) Each person is provided the means of participating in all matters before the board, including the capacity to propose, or to interpose an objection to, a specific action to be taken by the corporation.
- (3) The board has adopted and implemented a means of verifying both of the following: (i) A person communicating by use of communications equipment is a director entitled to participate in the board meeting; and (ii) All statements, questions, actions or votes were made by that director and not by another person not permitted to participate as a director.

c. Annual and Other Meetings

The board shall hold a general meeting for purposes of organization, election of officers, and transaction of other business on the first **Friday of March of each year at 11:00 a.m.**, or on the next Friday if the day indicated is a legal holiday. Notice of this meeting is not required.

Other general meetings of the board may be held without notice at such time and place as the board may fix from time to time.

d. Special Meetings

(1) Authority to Call Special Meetings

Special meetings of the board for any purpose may be called at any time by the chairman of the board, if any, the president or any vice president, the secretary, or any two directors.

(2) Notice of Special Meetings

Notice of the time and place of special meetings shall be given to each director by (a) personal delivery of written notice; (b) by first class mail, postage prepaid; (c) telephone,

including a voice messaging system or other system or technology designed to record and communicate messages, either directly to the director or to a person at the director's office who would reasonably be expected to communicate that notice promptly to the director; (d) telegram; (e) facsimile; (f) electronic mail; or (g) other electronic means. All such notices shall be given or sent to the director's address or telephone number as shown on the corporation's records.

Notices sent by first-class mail shall be deposited in the US mails at least four (4) days before the time set for the meeting. Notices given by personal delivery, telephone, electronic mail, or telegraph shall be delivered, telephoned, sent, or given to the telegraph company, respectively, at least 48 hours before the time set for the meeting.

The notice shall state the time of the meeting and the place, if the place is other than the corporation's principal office. The notice need not specify the purpose of the meeting.

e. Quorum

A majority of the authorized number of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except adjournment. Every action taken or decision made by a majority of the directors present at a duly held meeting at which a quorum is present shall be an act of the board, subject to the more stringent provisions of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, including, without limitation, those provisions relating to (a) approval of contracts or transactions in which a director has a direct or indirect material financial interest, (b) approval of certain transactions between corporations having common directorships, (c) creation of and appointments to committees of the board, and (d) indemnification of directors. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business, despite the withdrawal of some directors, if any action taken or decision made is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for that meeting.

f. Waiver of Notice

Notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who, either before or after the meeting, signs a waiver of notice, a written consent to the holding go the meeting, or an approval of the minutes of the meeting. The waiver of notice or consent need not specify the purpose of the meeting. All such waivers, consents, and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting, notice of a meeting need not be given to any director who attends the meeting and who, before or at the beginning of the meeting, does not protest the lack of notice to him or her.

g. Adjournment

A majority of the directors present, whether or not a quorum is present, may adjourn any meeting to another time and place.

h. Notice of Adjourned Meeting

Notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting need not be given unless the original meeting is adjourned for more than 24 hours. If the original meeting is adjourned for more than 24 hours, notice of any adjournment to another time and place shall be given, before the time of the adjourned meeting, to the directors who were not present at the time of the adjournment.

Section 7. Action Without Meeting

Any action that the board is required or permitted to take may be taken without a meeting if all board members consent in writing to the action; provided, however, that the consent of any director who has a material financial interest in a transaction to which the corporation is a party and who is an "interested director" as defined in Corporations Code Section 5233 shall not be required for approval of that transaction. Such action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as any other validly approved action of the board. All such consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the board.

Section 8. Compensation and Reimbursement

Directors as such will not receive any stated salaries for their services, but by resolution of the Board of Directors, a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the Board; but nothing contained herein will be construed to preclude any Director from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.

Section 9. Committees of Board of Directors

a. Creation and Powers of Committees

The board, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, may create one or more committees, each consisting of two or more directors and no one who is not a director, to serve at the pleasure of the board. Appointments to committees of the board shall be by majority vote of the directors then in office. The board may appoint one or more directors as alternate members of any such committee, who may replace any absent member at any meeting. Any such committee shall have all the authority of the board, to the extent provided in the board resolution, except that no committee may:

- (1) Take any final action on any matter that, under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporations Law, also requires approval of the board;
- (2) Fill vacancies on the board or any committee of the board;
- (3) Fix compensation of the directors for serving on the board or on any committee;
- (4) Amend or repeal bylaws or adopt new bylaws;

- (5) Amend or repeal any resolution of the board that by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (6) Create any other committees of the board or appoint the members of committees of the board;
- (7) Expend corporate funds to support a nominee for director if more people have been nominated for director than can be elected; or
- (8) Approve any contract or transaction to which the corporation is a party and in which one or more of its directors has a material financial interest, except as special approval is provided for in Corporations Code Section 5233(d)(3).

b. Meetings and Action of Committees

Meetings and actions of committees of the board shall be governed by, held, and taken under the provisions of these bylaws concerning meetings and other board actions, except that the time for general meetings of such committees and the calling of special meetings of such committees may be set either by board resolution or, if none, by resolution of the committee. Minutes of each meeting shall be kept and shall be filed with the corporate records. The board may adopt rules for the governance of any committee as long as the rules are consistent with these bylaws. If the board has not adopted rules, the committee may do so.

c. Committees with Non-directors

The board may establish committees with non-directors provided such committees do not exercise the authority of the board.

ARTICLE IX

OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

Section 1. Offices Held

The officers of the corporation shall be a president, a secretary, and a chief financial officer. The corporation may also have at the discretion of the board of directors, one or more vice presidents and such other officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of these bylaws.

Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the secretary, treasurer nor the chief financial officer may serve concurrently as either the president of the chairman of the board pursuant to Corporations Code Section 5213.

Section 2. Election of Officers

The officers of the corporation, except such officers as may be appointed in accordance with these bylaws, shall be chosen annually by the board and shall serve at the pleasure of the board, subject to the rights of any officer under any employment contract.

Section 3. Appointment of Other Officers

The board may appoint and authorize the chairman of the board, the president, or another officer to appoint any other officers that the board may require. Each appointed officer shall have the title and authority hold office for the period, and perform the duties specified in the bylaws or established by the board.

Section 4. Removal of Officers

Without prejudice to the rights of any officer under an employment contract, the board may remove any officer with or without cause. An officer who was not chosen by the board may be removed by any other officer on whom the board confers the power of removal.

Section 5. Resignation of Officers

Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the board. The resignation shall take effect on the date the notice is received or at any later time specified in the notice. Unless otherwise specified in the notice, the resignation need not be accepted to be effective. Any resignation shall be without prejudice to any rights of the corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.

Section 6. Vacancies in Office

A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these bylaws for regular appointments to such office, provided, however, that vacancies need not be filled on an annual basis.

Section 7. Responsibilities of Officers

a. Chairman of the Board

If a chairman of the board is elected, he or she shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors and exercise and perform such other powers and duties as the board may assign from time to time. If there is no president, the chairman of the board shall in addition be the chief executive officer of the corporation and shall have the powers and duties of the president set forth in these bylaws.

b. President/Chief Executive Officer

Subject to such supervisory powers as the board may give to the chairman of the board, if any, and subject to the control of the board, the president shall be the general manager of the corporation and shall supervise, direct and control the corporation's activities, affairs, and officers. The president shall preside at all board meetings in the absence of the chairman of the board. The president shall have such other powers and duties as the board or the bylaws may require. The president shall also serve as the chief executive officer.

c. Vice Presidents

If the president is absent or disabled, the vice presidents, if any, in order of their rank as fixed by the board, or, if not ranked, a vice president designated by the board, shall perform all duties of the president. When so acting, a vice president shall have all powers of and be subject to all restrictions on the president. The vice presidents shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as the board or the bylaws may require.

d. Secretary

The secretary shall keep or cause to be kept at the corporation's principal office or such other place as the board may direct, a book of minutes of all meetings, proceedings, and actions of the board, and committees of the board. The minutes of the meetings shall include the time and place that the meeting was held; whether the meeting was annual, general, or special, and, if special, how authorized; the notice given; the names of persons present at board and committee meetings; and the number of members present or represented at members' meetings.

The secretary shall keep or cause to be kept at the principal California office, a copy of the articles of incorporation and bylaws, as amended to date.

The secretary shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of the board and of committees of the board that these bylaws require to be given. The secretary shall keep the corporate seal, if any, in safe custody and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as the board or the bylaws may require.

e. Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer

The chief financial officer, who may also be referred to as the treasurer, shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and records of accounts of the corporation's properties and transactions. The chief financial officer shall send or cause to be given to the directors such financial statements and reports as are required to be given by law, by these bylaws, or by the board. The books of account shall be open to inspection by any director at all reasonable times.

The chief financial officer shall (i) deposit, or cause to be deposited, all money and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the corporation with such depositories as may be designated by the board of directors; (ii) disburse the funds of the corporation as may be ordered by the board of directors; (iii) render to the president, chairman of the board, if any, and the board, when requested, an account of all transactions as chief financial officer and of the financial condition of the corporation; and (iv) have such other powers and perform such other duties as the board or the bylaws may require.

If required by the board, the chief financial officer shall give the corporation a bond in the amount and with the surety or sureties specified by the board for faithful performance of the duties of the office and for restoration to the corporation of all of its books, papers, vouchers, money, and other property of every kind in the possession or under the control of the chief financial officer on his or her death, resignation, retirement, or removal from office.

ARTICLE X

CONTRACTS WITH DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

No director of this corporation nor any other corporation, firm, association, or other entity in which one or more of this corporation's directors are directors or have a material financial interest, shall be interested, directly or indirectly, in any contract or transaction, unless (a) the material facts regarding that director's financial interest in such contract or transaction or regarding such common directorship, officership, or financial interest are fully disclosed in good faith and noted in the minutes, or are known to all members of the board prior to the board's consideration of such contract or transaction; (b) the board's consideration of such contract or transaction is authorized in good faith by a majority of the board by a vote sufficient for that purpose without counting the votes of the interested directors; (c) before authorizing or approving the transaction, the board considers and in good faith decides after reasonable investigation that the corporation could not obtain a more advantageous arrangement with reasonable efforts under the circumstances; and (d) the corporation for its own benefit enters into the transaction, which is fair and reasonable to the corporation at the time the transaction is entered into.

This section does not apply to a transaction that is part of an educational or charitable program of this corporation if it (a) is approved or authorized by the corporation in good faith and without unjustified favoritism and (b) results in a benefit to one or more directors or their families because they are in the class of the persons intended to be benefited by the educational or charitable program of this corporation.

ARTICLE XI

LOANS TO DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

This corporation shall not lend any money or property to or guarantee the obligation of any director or officer without the approval of the California attorney General; provided however, that the corporation may advance money to a director or officer of the corporation for expenses reasonably anticipated to be incurred in the performance of his or her duties if that director or officer would be entitled to reimbursement for such expenses by the corporation

ARTICLE XII

INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, this corporation shall indemnify its directors, officers, employees, and other person described in Corporations Code Section 5238(a), including persons formerly occupying such positions, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," as that term is used in that section, and including an action by or in the right of the corporation, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a person described in that section. "Expenses," as used in this bylaw, shall have the same meaning as in that section of the Corporations Code.

On written request to the board by any person seeking indemnification under Corporations Code Section 5238(a) or Section 5238(c), the board shall promptly decide under Corporations Code Section 5238(e) whether the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Corporations Code Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c) has been met and, if so, the board shall authorize indemnification.

To the fullest extent permitted by law and except as otherwise determined by the board in a specific instance, expenses incurred by a person seeking indemnification under these bylaws in defending any proceeding covered by these bylaws shall be advanced by the corporation before final disposition of the proceeding, on receipt by the corporation of an undertaking by or on behalf of that person that the advance will be repaid unless it is ultimately found that the person is entitled to be indemnified by the corporation for those expenses.

Subject to the requirements set forth in Corporations Code Section 5047.5, no cause of action for monetary damages shall arise against any person serving without compensation as a director or officer on account of any negligent act or omission occurring (1) within the scope of that

person's duties as a director acting as a board member, or within the scope of that person's duties as an officer acting in an official capacity; (2) in good faith; (3) in a manner that the person believes to be in the best interest of the corporation; and (4) is in the exercise of his or her policymaking judgment, provided that the corporation maintains the required liability insurance coverage, the claim against the officer or director can also be made directly against the corporation, and the liability insurance policy is applicable to the claim.

ARTICLE XIII

INSURANCE

This corporation shall have the right to purchase and maintain insurance to the full extent permitted by law on behalf of its officers, directors, employees, and other agents, to cover any liability asserted against or incurred by any officer, director, employee, or agent in such capacity or arising from the officer's, director's, employee's, or agent's status as such.

ARTICLE XIV

MAINTENANCE OF CORPORATE RECORDS

This corporation shall keep at its principal office in California:

- a. Articles of Incorporation
- b. Bylaws
- c. Adequate and correct books and records of account;
- d. Written minutes of the proceedings of its board and committees of the board; and
- e. Record of each director's name and address.

These corporate records shall be open to inspection by the directors at all reasonable times during office hours.

ARTICLE XV

INSPECTION RIGHTS

Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect the corporation's books, records, documents of every kind, physical properties, and the records of each subsidiary. The inspection may be made in person or by the director's agent or attorney. The right of inspection includes the right to copy and make extracts of documents.

ARTICLE XVI

REQUIRED REPORTS

Section 1. Annual Report

The board shall cause an annual report to be sent to the directors within 120 days after the end of the corporation's fiscal year. That report shall contain the following information, in appropriate detail:

- a. The assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the corporation as of the end of the fiscal year;
- b. The principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds;
- c. The corporation's revenue or receipts, both unrestricted and restricted to particular purposes;
- d. The corporation's expenses or disbursements for both general and restricted purposes;
- e. Any information required by section 2 of these bylaws;
- f. An independent accountants' report, or if none, the certificate of an authorized officer of the corporation that such statements were prepared without audit from the corporation's books and records.

This requirement of an annual report shall not apply if the corporation receives less than \$25,000 in gross receipts during the fiscal year, provided, however, that the information specified above for inclusion in an annual report must be furnished annually to all directors and to any member who requests it in writing.

Section 2. Annual Statements of Certain Transactions and Indemnification

As part of the annual report, or as a separate document if no annual report is issued, the corporation shall, within 120 days after the end of the corporation's fiscal year, annually prepare and furnish to each director a statement of any transaction or indemnification of the following kind:

- a. Any transaction (i) in which the corporation, or its parent or subsidiary, was a party, (ii) in which an "interested person" had a direct or indirect material financial interest, and (iii) which involved more than \$50,000 or was one of several transactions with the same interested person involving, in the aggregate, more than \$50,000. For this purpose, an "interested person" is either:
 - (1) Any director or officer of the corporation, its parent, or subsidiary (but mere common directorship shall not be considered such an interest); or
 - (2) Any holder of more than 10 percent of the voting power of the corporation, its parent, or its subsidiary. The statement shall include a brief description of the transaction, the names of interested persons involved, their relationship to the corporation, the nature of their interest in the transaction and, if practicable, the amount of that interest, provided that if the transaction was with a partnership in which the interested person is a partner, only the interest of the partnership need be stated.
- b. Any indemnification or advances aggregating more than \$10,000 paid during the fiscal year to any officer or director of the corporation under Article XI of these bylaws, unless that indemnification has already been approved by the board under Corporations Code Section 5238(e)(2).

ARTICLE XVII

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS OR ARTICLES

The Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation may be amended only with the written approval of the Founder until this requirement ceases, and thereafter by a majority of the directors. The Founder's approval requirement shall cease when the Founder has died, become incapacitated, or has failed to respond to the Corporation after the Corporation has attempted to obtain approval from the Founder. Founder shall be deemed to have failed to respond if the Founder does not reply to the Corporation's written request for approval within thirty (30) days after the request is mailed to the Founder at the address shown in **Exhibit A**, which may be updated from time to time in writing by Founder.
