Thereafter, AHSSHC acquired hospitals operated by the Southwestern, Lake Union and Mid-America Union Conferences of the General Conference of Seventh-Day Adventists. AHSSHC is the parent organization to a number of subsidiaries. These subsidiaries operate hospitals, nursing homes, and provide various other healthcare services. All of the hospital and nursing home subsidiaries of AHSSHC are IRC 501 (c)(3) organizations. AHSSHC provides executive leadership and various support services (i.e. legal, compliance, human resources, treasury functions) to all of its subsidiaries. Article II of the Restated Articles of Incorporation of AHSSHC set forth the purposes of the organization. Specifically, paragraph 1 of the Article states the following: "In furtherance of its charitable purposes, the Corporation shall operate to further the health ministry of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in such ways as the Board of Directors shall determine in its discretion, and specifically to provide management, consulting, and related services to educational institutions and health care facilities (e.g., hospitals, skilled nursing, home health, hospice, physician clinics, etc.) owned and operated by organizations affiliated with the Corporation and that are located within the geographic areas of the United States served by the Southern Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, the Southwestern Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, Lake Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, Mid-America Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists and such other locations as may be approved by the Board of Directors or the Executive Board of the Corporation." These stated purposes demonstrate that AHSSHC was established to carry out the health ministry of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and that its policies, programs, and activities will be conducted in accordance with the health mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Section 3, Article III of the Bylaws of AHSSHC states that its business and affairs will be controlled by its Board of Directors. Section 4, Article III of the Bylaws provides that the membership of AHSSHC shall elect its Board of Directors. Certain members of the Board of Directors serve in these positions by virtue of their employment with the various union conferences or state/multi-state Conferences of the General Conference (Article III, Section 5 of the Bylaws). The necessary qualifications of Directors are set forth in Article III, Section 6 of the Bylaws. The union, state, and multi-state conferences of the General Conference are unincorporated associations that serve as regional/state/multi-state ecclesiastical leaders who provide theological and administrative support to organizations controlled and/or affiliated with the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The membership of AHSSHC is described in Article II, Section 1 of the Bylaws. The membership is composed of those individuals who sit on the Executive Committees of the Southern Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, the Southwestern Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, the Lake Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, the Mid-America Union Conference of Seventh-day Adventists and AHSSHC's Board of Directors. An individual holding membership privileges by virtue of his election as a member of one of the above-named Union Conferences or as a member of the Board of Directors of AHSSHC retains his membership privileges only so long as he remains a member of his respective Union Conference Executive Committee or as a member of the Board of Directors of AHSSHC. Each member has one vote (see Section 2, Article II of the Bylaws) and questions put before the members are determined by majority vote (see Section 6, Article II of the Bylaws). As noted above, the Board of Directors of AHSSHC is elected by the members of AHSSHC. The majority of the members of AHSSHC are elected officials of the above-named Union Conferences of the General Conference. Accordingly, the Directors of AHSSHC will always be elected by members who serve as members by virtue of their elected position of one of the Seventh-day Adventist Church Union Conferences. Further, the majority of the individuals who serve on the Board of Directors of AHSSHC serve by virtue of their employment positions with the relevant Union Conference/State/Multi-State Conference of the General Conference. Therefore, a majority of the Board of Directors of AHSSHC is composed of individuals serving in their official capacity as representatives of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. As noted above, AHSSHC performs support functions and provides executive leadership for the benefit of its various publicly supported organizations within the meaning of IRC 509(a)(3)(A). The formation of the predecessor of AHSSHC was authorized by the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists to perform these support functions in pursuit of the health ministry of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Accordingly, the purposes of the General Conference are carried out by AHSSHC through its support to its subsidiary organizations that own and operate hospitals and nursing homes.

First-class or charter travel. Pursuant to the AHS system-wide general policy regarding business travel, no reimbursement will be provided for any additional cost incurred with respect to first-class or charter air travel beyond the cost of a regular coach airfare. As a means of providing additional business travel reimbursement for those members of the AHSSHC senior executive management team that travel frequently on behalf of AHS, a special annual travel allowance is provided for those executives. As AHS operates 44 hospitals and a number of other health care facilities in 10 states, the senior leadership of AHSSHC travel extensively and often visit multiple hospital locations in different states as a part of a single business trip. The special travel allowance can provide reimbursements to the executive for such items as the purchase of air travel upgrade coupons, to cover the cost differential between coach and first-class travel, or to cover the cost of a charter flight. The special travel allowance benefit was originally authorized by and codified into a policy by the AHSSHC Board Compensation Committee (the Committee), an independent body of the AHSSHC Board of Directors, who also approves the annual cap on the amount of the allowance. The special travel allowance has an annual cap of \$24,000 for members of the AHS Corporate Management Committee (10 individual executives) and \$15,000 for AHS Corporate Office Senior Vice Presidents (8 individual executives). The CEO of AHS has been approved by the Committee to travel by charter for AHS business trips in an amount which may exceed the established annual cap. Those executives who receive the special travel allowance are responsible for tracking the expenses reimbursable under the special travel allowance and must submit such expenses on their accountable plan expense report. Any taxable reimbursements made to executives under the special travel allowance arrangement are treated as taxable compensation to the executive. Travel for companions. AHSSHC has a Corporate Executive Policy that provides a benefit to allow for a traveling AHSSHC executive to have his or her spouse accompany the executive on certain business trips each year. Typically, reimbursement is only provided to Vice Presidents and above and is usually limited to one business trip per year beyond the annual AHS President's Council business meeting and other meetings where the spouse is specifically invited. The AHSSHC Corporate Executive Spousal Travel Policy was originally approved and reviewed by the AHSSHC Board Compensation Committee, an independent body of the AHSSHC Board of Directors. All spousal travel costs reimbursed to the executive are considered taxable compensation to the executive. Tax indemnification and gross-up payments. AHS has a system-wide policy addressing gross-up payments provided in connection with employer-provided benefits/other taxable items. Under the policy, certain taxable business-related reimbursements (i.e., taxable business-related moving expenses, taxable items provided in connection with employment) provided to any employee may be grossed-up at a 25% rate upon approval of the filing organization's CEO and CFO. Additionally, employees at the Director level and above are eligible for gross-up payments on gifts received for board of director services. Discretionary spending account. A nominal discretionary spending amount was provided in the current year to all eligible executives who attend the annual AHS President's Council business meeting (\$500 per executive) or the annual AHS CFO Conference or CMO/CNO business meeting (\$300 per executive). Other discretionary spending accounts may be provided in connection with other AHS sponsored conferences but typically do not exceed \$200 per participant. With respect to the AHS President's Council meeting, eligible executives may include AHSSHC Vice Presidents and above and all AHSSHC subsidiary organization CEOs and Regional CFOs. The payment provided to each executive was considered taxable compensation to the executive. Health or social club dues or initiation fees. AHSSHC has a Corporate Executive Policy that addresses business development expenditures. Under this policy, certain AHS eligible executives may be reimbursed for member dues and usage charges for a country club or other social club upon authorization. Club memberships must be recommended by the CEO of the AHS hospital organization and approved by the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the organization. In addition, the proposed membership must be approved annually by the AHSSHC Board Compensation Committee, an independent committee of the Board of Directors of AHSSHC. Eligible executives are limited to certain senior level executives (hospital organization CEOs, the CEO of the nursing home division of AHS, senior vice presidents at three large hospital organizations, regional CEOs and CFOs and the president and senior vice presidents of AHSSHC). In the current year, for this filing organization, two executives were eligible to receive reimbursement for club fees. Each AHS executive who is approved for a club membership must submit an annual report to the AHSSHC Board Compensation Committee that describes how the membership benefited their organization during the preceding year.</p>

Part I, Line 4b	<p>Executive Plan. In recognition of the contribution that each executive makes to the success of AHS, AHS provides to eligible executives participation in the AHS Executive FLEX Benefit Program (the Plan). The purpose of the Plan is to offer eligible executives an opportunity to elect from among a variety of supplemental benefits, including deferred compensation benefits taxable under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 457(f), to individually tailor a benefits program appropriate to each executive's needs. The Plan provides eligible participants a pre-determined benefits allowance credit that is equal to a percentage of the executive's base pay from which is deducted the cost of mandatory and elective employee benefits. The pre-determined benefits allowance credit percentage is approved by the AHSSHC Board Compensation Committee, an independent committee of the Board of Directors of AHSSHC. Any funds that remain after the cost of mandatory and elective benefits are subtracted from the annual pre-determined benefits allowance are contributed, at the employee's option, to either an IRC 457(f) deferred compensation account or to an IRC 457(b) eligible deferred compensation plan. Upon attainment of age 65, all previous 457(f) deferred amounts are paid immediately to the participant and any future employer contributions are made quarterly from the Plan directly to the participant. The Plan documents define an employee who is eligible to participate in the Plan to generally include the Chief Executive Officers of AHS entities and Vice Presidents of all AHS entities whose base salary is at least \$230,000. The Plan provides for a class year vesting schedule (2 years for each class year) with respect to amounts accumulated in the executive's 457(f) deferred compensation account. Distributions could also be made from the executive's 457(f) deferred compensation account upon attainment of age 65 or upon an involuntary separation. The account is forfeited by the executive upon a voluntary separation. In addition to the Plan, AHS has instituted a defined benefit, non-tax-qualified deferred compensation plan for certain executives who have provided lengthy service to AHS and/or to other Seventh-Day Adventist Church hospitals or health care institutions. Participation in the plan is offered to AHS executives on a prorata schedule beginning with 20 years of service as an employee of AHS and/or another hospital or health care institution controlled by the Seventh-Day Adventist Church and who satisfy certain other qualifying criteria. This supplemental executive retirement plan (SERP) was designed to provide eligible executives with the economic equivalent of an annual income beginning at normal retirement age equal to 60% of the average of the participant's three, five or seven highest years of base salary from AHS active employment inclusive of income from all other Seventh-Day Adventist Church healthcare employer-financed retirement income sources and investment income earned on those contributions through social security normal retirement age as defined in the plan. The number of years included in highest average compensation is determined by the individual's year of entry to the SERP and by the individual's year of entry to the AHS Executive FLEX Benefit Program. Adventist Health System Sunbelt Healthcare Corporation (AHSSHC), the parent organization of a system of healthcare organizations known as Adventist Health System (AHS) has established a Physician Retention Plan (the Physician Plan), in order to recognize the contribution certain physician employees make to the success of AHS. The Physician Plan was established for the purposes of providing deferred bonuses to certain eligible physicians of AHSSHC and its affiliates to aid in such physicians' attraction and retention. The Physician Plan was adopted by AHSSHC (together with any related other participating employers, the "Employer") for certain physician employees of the Employer. The purpose of the Plan is to offer those eligible physician employees an opportunity to receive deferred bonus payment amounts from the Employer. Such deferred compensation payment amounts are taxable pursuant to section 457(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). It is intended that Benefits payable under the Plan shall not constitute deferred compensation within the meaning of section 409A of the Code (together with the Treasury regulations or any other authoritative guidance issued thereunder, "Section 409A") under the "short-term deferral" exception outlined, as of the Effective Date, in Treasury Regulation 1.409A-1(b)(4)-i.e., because all Benefit payments under the Plan shall be made no later than two and one-half (2 1/2) months following the last day of the calendar year in which the Benefit payments are no longer subject to a substantial risk of forfeiture. Notwithstanding the preceding, if and to the extent future guidance indicates that Benefits payable under the Plan do constitute deferred compensation within the meaning of Section 409A, it is intended that the Plan satisfies the requirements of Section 409A. The determination of physicians eligible to participate in the Physician Plan is made by a committee of individuals who serve on the Board of AHSSHC. This committee follows policies, processes, and guidelines that are designed to ensure its compliance with the intermediate sanctions laws as set forth in IRC Section 4958. The committee reviews and approves all components and amounts and timing of payments of deferred compensation that may be paid to the physician upon their continued service. During the current year, Neil Finkler, MD, Chief Medical Officer at Florida Hospital, a 2,579 bed acute care hospital and a subsidiary of AHSSHC, vested and received payment in the amount of \$3,000,000 under the Physician Plan.</p>
