Founded in 1945, the Noble Foundation continues the vision of its founder, Lloyd Noble, to influence agriculture by exploring and improving production agriculture techniques and advancing plant science through research and discovery. The Noble Foundation has become a leading plant and agricultural research institute that (a) conducts fundamental research for plant gene/trait discovery, (b) conducts fundamental research to produce critical, publicly available genomic/genetic resources for researchers worldwide, (c) performs translational and developmental research to incorporate innovations and discoveries into plants, (d) performs plant breeding and development, and (e) evaluates and assesses crops and technology in a production agricultural environment for performance and value assessment. These research operations complement the Noble Foundation's agricultural programs, which involve long-term, professional relationships with regional agricultural producers to assist them in achieving their individual production, financial and quality-of-life goals. The Noble Foundation's operations are conducted through three operating divisions: Agricultural, Plant Biology and Forage Improvement. The Noble Foundation employs more than 330 staff members in these operating divisions and their supporting groups, representing 20 or more countries. Among these employees, approximately 90 hold doctorate level degrees. These operations are based on an 800 acre campus which includes more than 500,000 square feet of research and administration space and a complementary 13,000 acres of farms offering different operating characteristics in southern Oklahoma. In 2015, Noble Foundation agricultural consultants and scientists published more than 71 peer-reviewed articles in scientifically respected journals and, received four (4) issued U.S. and international patents, and filed six (6) U.S. patent applications. In furtherance of its charitable mission and its commitment to advance the fields of plant science and production agriculture, Noble Foundation agricultural consultants and scientists formally collaborate with a broad base of academic and government institutions, participating as a collaborating institution in the U.S. Department of Energy's BioEnergy Science Center at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory, and collaborating with institutions such as Oklahoma State University, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension, University of North Texas, Texas AgriLife Research, Texas AgriLife Extension Service, University of Georgia-Athens, Iowa State University, Cornell University, University of Kentucky, University of California-Los Angeles, University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, University of Delaware, West Virginia University, University of Missouri-Columbia, University of Wisconsin, University of Tennessee, LSU Agricultural Center, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, University of Florida, Mississippi State University, Kansas State University, University of California-Berkeley, and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The Noble Foundation was a founding member of the Association of Independent Plant Research Institutes (AIP), which furthers collaboration and close communication with other member institutions: Boyce Thompson Institute for Plant Research, The Donald Danforth Plant Science Center, and the Plant Biology Department of the Carnegie Institute for Science. In support of its research, the Noble Foundation receives public support from the National Science Foundation, the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology, and National Aeronautics and Space Administration. Moreover, through its youth outreach and education program, Noble Academy, The Noble Foundation is collaborating with a local private school, Oak Hall Episcopal School (Grades 7-8), and local public schools, including Plainview Middle School, Ardmore Middle School and Dickson Middle and High Schools. Additionally, through Middle and High School teacher workshops, Noble Academy is reaching teachers (and their students) across the State of Oklahoma. Outside of the traditional classroom setting, Noble Academy works with other nonprofit organizations, for example, 4-H, Oklahoma FFA (Future Farmers of America), and the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens, to share with urban and rural students in grades 7-12 the importance of agriculture and agricultural research through hands-on, interactive experiences. In furtherance of developing and delivering these educational experiences, The Noble Foundation and Noble Academy further collaborate with the University of Oklahoma, The Oklahoma Department of Education, The Southern Oklahoma Technology Center (SOTC), The Oklahoma School for Science and Mathematics, and Oklahoma Farm Bureau. Support for operations causes our funds spent for operating and administrative costs, as reported on Part I, to be higher than an exclusively granting foundation. The calculation below shows how our administrative and operating costs are allocated into the operating groups. Operating and administrative costs (Part I-Line 24) \$39,770,663. Amounts paid to acquire assets (Part XII-Line 2) \$8,383,537 and grants paid (Part I-Line 25) \$1,564,043 equal the total amount paid for charitable purposes of \$49,718,243. Direct charitable activities and administrative expenses for charitable purposes (Part IX-A) Agricultural division \$14,605,646, Forage Improvement division \$12,437,788, and Plant Biology division \$15,962,401 equal the total direct charitable activities of \$43,005,835 plus contributions, gifts, grants paid of \$1,564,043 equal total direct charitable activities and grants paid of \$44,569,878.
