Bozeman Deaconess Health Group consists of our departments that provide physician services to outpatients. The number of Medicare and Medicaid patients seen in 2015 decreased from about 44% of total visits in 2014 to 42% of total visits in 2015. Revenue for these patients and uninsured patients totaled 45% of all clinic revenue. Total operating revenues were \$56,347,221 with associated operating expenses of \$62,782,447. The loss of \$6,435,226 is reflective of our commitment to provide access to all patients regardless of their ability to pay.

4b (Code) (Expenses \$ 22,162,349 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 56,617,170)
Bozeman Deaconess Surgical Services strives to offer a wide array of surgical options using state of the art technology. Of the 6,040 inpatient and outpatient surgeries, about 34% were Medicare and Medicaid patients, which comprised 41% (\$23,141,922) of total revenue from these services (\$56,617,170). Over 60% of the Medicare/Medicaid revenues were unreimbursed (\$13,992,055) and written off, along with almost 36% of the remaining revenue (\$5,903,294 from other payors). Our operating room also recorded \$15,702,214 in operating expenses plus another \$6,460,135 of indirect overhead.

4c (Code) (Expenses \$ 13,344,132 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 24,149,596)
The Emergency Room at Bozeman Deaconess Health Services is one of the busiest departments in our organization, with just over 30,000 visits in 2015. Approximately 35% of these visits were from Medicare and Medicaid patients, comprising \$8,756,624 of the \$24,149,596 of the gross revenue. Over 60% of the Medicare/Medicaid revenue were unreimbursed (\$5,289,254) and written off, along with almost 36% of the remaining revenue (\$5,514,684). Direct and indirect expenses incurred in supporting the operation of this emergency room accumulated to \$13,344,132.
