For 2015, we had over 75 volunteers (members and Ladies Auxiliary members) reporting over 24,000 hours of 2015 volunteer service.

For 2015, our active membership grew 9.4%, from 475 to 520 men. No other Colorado local KofC Council has more members.

Volunteer services included work for the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish Stewardship Center and its Food Bank for the poor.

Fraternal volunteer teamwork was demonstrated in our fundraising projects as well as our community service projects.

4b (Code: _____) (Expenses \$ 35,330 including grants of \$ 30,330) (Revenue \$ 35,330)**SUPPORTING COMMUNITY & YOUTH.** Our 2015 annual fundraiser for people with intellectual disabilities raised \$4,424 donated to two local 501(c)(3) charities, a special public school and a local county service agency serving people with intellectual disabilities.

Our summer peach-sale fundraiser provided net revenue of \$3,119 donated to the Colorado Knights of Columbus Charities 501(c)(3) toward purchasing an Ultra-sound machine in support of the Church's pro-life mission.

Donations serving Youth included \$6,250 in college and catholic high school scholarships, \$2,200 of winter coats for needy students at Guardian Angels Catholic School (K-8th) in Denver, \$2,400 for the 2015 re-chartering of two Boy Scout Troops and two Cub Packs, and \$2,400 for a coach bus to take State Special Olympics participants and their family members to the State Special Olympics in Grand Junction, Colorado.

4c (Code: _____) (Expenses \$ 32,157 including grants of \$ 26,230) (Revenue \$ 32,157)**SUPPORTING THE CATHOLIC CHURCH and priest/religious vocations.** Fundraisers provided ~\$9,800 in net revenue by preparing and serving over 15 after-Mass breakfasts, Friday Fish Fries, and burritos. The profit came entirely from having all volunteer workers.

We provided in 2015 \$9,500 to several men in the seminary in preparation to be Catholic priests. We provided over \$11,000 to

Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Northglenn, CO. We spent \$1,600 in our volunteer work improving the grounds at the

Stations of the Cross Shrine near San Luis, CO. Our Council received the KofC Colorado Culture of Life Service Award for our service roles for the January 17, 2015 Denver Cathedral Respect-Life Mass and the related Respect-Life Rally and March-for-Life events held near the Cathedral. Denver Police estimated 5,000 attended the Rally.

with Directors elected for five-year terms by members who attend the election meeting. Directors may be officers or trustees of Council 7502.

NKCHA, Inc. owns a two-story building and land with a parking lot. The property is rented to Council 7502 for its office and for business and social meetings of members. It is not open to the public for rent. NKCHA's excess funds are donated to Council 7502.

The property may be rented or used, space available, by a Council 7502 member for various purposes including use by a 501(c) organization with which the member is affiliated.

Part III, line 1 and 2: Funds were to help pay for officer's surgery to remove cancerous tissue. Of the \$1,335, Council 7502 was passing on \$1,035 in earmarked donations by another member and from an anonymous donor. The Council has a small budget for providing small sums (normally no more than \$300 per occurrence) for members needing emergency funds.
