Description

"Care To Share" Program:

In September 1997, the foundation established the "Care to Share" program which serves low-income and medically fragile children and their families. The program's focus is on the many families needing help when dealing with a child or family member that has been recently diagnosed with an acute or chronic medical condition. "Care to Share" was established in collaboration with Oregon Health & Sciences University to assist low-income and non-insured families that do not have the financial resources available to provide basic care and medical needs for their family.

Importantly, the program specifically supports family medical needs that are not otherwise met through federal and state programs. Medical needs supported by the Foundation range from providing transportation, to dental work, to emergency surgical procedures and diabetic supplies. The Foundation does not exercise any control over the professional care and judgment of the doctors selected for medical care.

For 2015, the program served over 82 families and had total expenditures of \$108,151.

Statement 14 - Form 990-PF, Part IX-A, Line 2 - Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

Description

"CommuniCare" Program:

The Foundation believes there should be an opportunity for young people to improve the quality of their communities. The "CommuniCare" program was established as a program to provide an environment where teens learn about the needs of their community through grantmaking and thus promote a long-term understanding and ethic of philanthropy and volunteerism in "giving back to your community".

The goal of the program is to help build a city that is known for its encouragement of teen participation as they become adult citizens in the community. This is accomplished by offering students an opportunity to "make a difference" in their community by engaging in community service that is challenging, rewarding and educational.

For 2015, the program served approximately 135 students in 11 different schools/youth nonprofit organizations and had total expenditures of \$114,421.

Statement 15 - Form 990-PF, Part XV, Line 2b - Application Format and Required Contents

Description

In June 2015, the Directors began a strategic planning process to redefine philanthropic focus areas. In the interim, the Directors began only reviewing grant proposals that were invited to apply by a CARE Foundation Director. In addition, the Directors reviewed sponsorship requests for galas, dinners, lunches and auction fundraisers from organizations that the CARE Foundation had previously funded.

Organizations that were invited by a Director to submit a full grant application were asked to submit a written application, which would include a cover letter detailing the nature and amount of the request. In addition, the request needed to include the following information:

- 1) A project description describing the proposed project and emphasizes the specific objectives to be accomplished, the target population and the number of people being served. A work plan and timetable should be provided, if applicable.
- 2) A brief history of the accomplishments of the applicant organization, a description of the organization's mission and number of clients served, and a write-up of the background and qualifications of the individuals involved.
- 3) A concise description of the methods_used_to evaluate the results of the proposed project should be provided if the grant application is for a specific project.
- 4) A list of the officers and directors of the organization and a percentage they contribute to the overall income of the organization.
- 5) A list of full-time and part-time staff positions and a short description of each job function.
- 6) A detailed budget of the project and the annual operating budget of the sponsoring organization.
- 7) A Donor Report showing a list of major contributors and approximate levels of giving.
- 8) A list of additional sources from which funds for this project are being sought.
- 9) An IRS determination letter verifying the tax-exempt status of the organization.

Until redefined philanthropic focus areas are determined, The Harold and Arlene Schnitzer CARE Foundation continues to concentrate on funding non-profit organizations that enhance the quality of life in Oregon and Clark County Washington. Organizations in Portland, Oregon are given first funding priority; approximately 90% of grant funds stay in the Portland metropolitan area. The Foundation's principal purpose is to assist with Jewish, cultural, youth, education, medical, social service, and community activities.

The Foundation funds approved grant requests for operating expenses, special projects, and capital campaigns. The Foundation does not provide funds for individuals, non tax-exempt organizations, other private foundations or political groups.

For 2015, (6) six grant applications were accepted or reviewed from organizations the Foundation had not previously funded.
