GENERAL INFORMATION

The Margoes Foundation was established in 1984 by the will of John A. Margoes and operates as a private foundation incorporated under California law.

GRANT PROGRAM HISTORY

John Margoes envisioned that the foundation would be a resource and catalyst for supporting imaginative and creative program opportunities that enabled:

- Minority and other disadvantaged youth to obtain a college education.
- People with mental disabilities to live in non-institutional environments and lead productive lives.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

The foundation accepts grant requests only from tax-exempt, charitable organizations that are not defined as private foundations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

GEOGRAPHICAL FOCUS

The foundation prefers to fund eligible non-profit organizations located in the San Francisco Bay Area to facilitate interactions with grantees and oversight of the grant.

TERM OF GRANT

Grants are awarded for a one-year period and may be extended based on grantee performance and program effectiveness.

PROGRAM LIMITATIONS

The foundation does not:

- Accept requests from individuals or award loans, scholarships, or grants to individuals.
- Award grants for annual fund campaigns, fundraising events, operating deficits, endowments, sectarian religious activities or sectarian religious facilities.
- Assume any obligation to provide continuing support to grantees.

CURRENT GRANTMAKING FOCUS AREAS

PRIMARY FOCUS AREAS

- 1) The foundation places a high priority on funding college access and success programs that help prepare low-income, and other disadvantaged students to qualify for college and graduate with a degree. Programs include:

COLLEGE ACCESS PROGRAMS

- After-school and academically focused summer college access programs that help students improve competencies in secondary school subjects and better qualify for college admissions, including: tutoring, mentoring, computer literacy, supplemental math and science, arts, and music.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

- Institutional college scholarship and financial aid programs, and student support programs for promising low-income, minority, and disadvantaged students.

- 2) The foundation places a high priority on programs that help people with mental illness live in non-institutional environments and lead productive lives. Programs include:

- Support to community-based programs that empower people with mental illness to live independently and lead productive lives.
- Support to programs that improve delivery of mental health services for young people turning 18 and transitioning from residential therapeutic care to independent living.

- 3) The foundation is interested in proposals that integrate the above listed primary focus areas such as:

- Programs that assist mentally ill youth or young adults to attend or complete college.
- Programs that encourage low-income, first generation, and other underserved students to pursue an education in the fields of mental health or social work.

GRANT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

The Margoes Foundation accepts and reviews grant proposals twice a year. Applicants should contact the foundation if they have questions about the current grantmaking priorities and application procedures.

The Foundation utilizes an online grants management portal where applicants can submit requests, file reports, and review their grant history, in order to streamline the application process. Applicants should visit the foundation's website for application instructions.

Narrative Questions

The proposal narrative should answer the following questions:

- Concise description of the organization, including relevant history, mission, geography and population(s) served, and type(s) of programs and/or services provided (limit 1,000 words).
- Concise description of the program/project (if applicable) including target population, need, purpose, specific goals/objectives, timeline, evaluation, and lead staff qualifications (limit 1,500 words).

Documents to Upload

The following documents must be uploaded when submitting a proposal online:

- Organization budget detailing all proposed expenditures and projected sources of funding (required).
- Program/project budget (if applicable) detailing all proposed expenditures and projected sources of funding.
- A list of other funders (including amounts, whether single or multi-year, and whether pending or committed) for the program/project and for the organization as a whole.
- Financial statement showing actual revenue and expenses for the agency's most recently completed fiscal year (required).
- List of board members and their affiliations (required).

GRANT REPORTING GUIDELINES

All grantees are required to submit an online report at the completion of the grant period, as specified in the grant agreement.

Narrative Questions

The grant report narrative should answer the following questions:

- What were the specific objectives of the funded project/program?
- In what specific ways were these objectives met?
- What objectives were not met and why?
- What future plans do you have for the funded project/program?
- With 20/20 hindsight, is there anything you might have done differently, or is there anything you learned that will change the program in the future?

Documents to Upload

The following documents must be uploaded when submitting a report online:

- A financial statement for the project (or if not a project, then for the organization) that shows how the grant funds were spent. (You can annotate the financial statement if that is a convenient way to explain the expenditures to us). Please include any pertinent invoices when applicable.

RENEWAL PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

Grantees who wish to be considered for subsequent grant funding should submit a renewal request, which will fulfill the grant report requirements and serve as a new application for renewed funding.

Narrative Questions

The renewal proposal narrative should answer the following questions:

- Briefly describe the programs offered, demographics, and numbers of participants served by the whole agency and by each program, including the program funds are being requested for.
- Are you requesting funding for the same program? If not, please describe the new program here.
- What are the objectives for this year's request? Are they different from last year's? How and why? If there are changes in the amount of the grant request for this round, please describe them here.

Documents to Upload

The following documents must be uploaded when submitting a renewal proposal online:

- Financial statement showing actual revenue and expenses for the agency's most recently completed fiscal year (required).
- Organization budget detailing all proposed expenditures and projected sources of funding (required).
- Program/project budget (if applicable) detailing all proposed expenditures and projected sources of funding.
- A list of other funders (including amounts, whether single or multi-year, and whether pending or committed) for the program/project and for the organization as a whole (required).

VENTURE PHILANTHROPY AWARD 2017

The Margoes Foundation is looking for new and innovative college access and success programs that prepare low-income and under-represented students to qualify for and succeed at four year universities. Candidates will be San Francisco Bay Area based organizations:

- At early stages of development seeking funds to launch a program or service that has the potential to be scaled at a statewide or national level
- With a revenue generation model for long-term sustainability.

In 2017, the Margoes Foundation will award one Venture Philanthropy (VP) grant to the most promising program presented. The successful applicant will be awarded a three-year grant of \$50,000 per year, pending achievement of agreed upon benchmarks.
