The difference between the standard rates (including uninsured discount) and the amounts actually collected after all reasonable collection efforts have been exhausted is charged off against the allowance for doubtful accounts in the period they are determined to be uncollectible. Each OhioHealth entity applies a discount to self-pay patient accounts that do not qualify for charity at the time of billing. If the account is deemed uncollectible, the balance is written off to bad debt. OhioHealth makes all reasonable efforts to qualify eligible patients for charity, including periodic retrospective account reviews to determine if patients that were written off to bad debt should have qualified for charity.


