The cities of Broken Arrow and Owasso were two of the fastest growing communities in Oklahoma between 2000 and 2010. The population of the city of Owasso grew 56% to 28,915 from 2000 to 2010 and the population of the city of Broken Arrow grew 32% to 98,850 from 2000 to 2010. Wagoner County (southeast of Tulsa) and Grapes County (northeast of Tulsa) showed the two highest population growth rates from 2000 to 2010. 
