BECAUSE DR. KOBLIK HAD BEEN ASKED TO STAY ON AS PRESIDENT WELL PAST NORMAL RETIREMENT AGE (HE TURNED 74 JUST AFTER STEPPING DOWN AS PRESIDENT), THE NEED FOR HIM TO PERFORM A FULL TEN YEARS OF FUTURE CONSULTING SERVICES HAD DECREASED OVER TIME AND THE BOARD THEREFORE DECIDED TO BUY OUT THE CONSULTING AGREEMENT.
