AMENDMENT AND COMPLETE RESTATEMENT OF BYLAWS

OF THE

ARGYROS FAMILY FOUNDATION.

A California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation

ARTICLE I

Members, Purpose and Dedication of Assets

Section 1. Members. This Corporation shall have no members.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the Corporation shall be to engage in charitable and educational purposes. This Corporation shall terminate within ten (10) years of the death of the last to die of George L. Argyros, Sr., Julianne Argyros, Melissa A. Mitchell, and Stephanie A. Gehl.

Section 3. Dedication of Assets. This Corporation's assets are irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes. No part of the net earnings, properties, or assets of the Corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual, or to any Director or officer of the Corporation. On liquidation or dissolution, all properties and assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of the Corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation that is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and that has established its exempt status under Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3).

ARTICLE II

Board of Directors

Section 1. General Powers. Subject to the provisions of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law (the "Law") and any limitations in the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of this Corporation, the activities and affairs of this Corporation shall be conducted and all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may delegate the management of the activities of this Corporation to any person or persons, management company or committee, however composed, provided that the activities and affairs of this Corporation shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised under the ultimate direction of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Number of Directors. The authorized number of Directors of this Corporation shall not be less than five (5) nor more than nine (9), until changed by a duly adopted amendment to these Bylaws, or as provided in Section 14 of this Article II, below. The exact number of

Directors shall be fixed, within those limits, by a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors may appoint an honorary director who shall serve at the will of the Board, but who will have no voting or other rights.

Section 3. Qualification. So long as required by law, not more than forty-nine percent (49%) of the persons serving on the Board of Directors of this Corporation may be "interested persons," as defined by the Law (presently Section 5227). An interested person is (a) any person compensated by the Corporation for services rendered to it within the previous twelve (12) months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a Director as Director; and (b) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendent, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of such person.

Section 4. Selection. All Directors shall be designated by George L. Argyros, Sr. and Julianne Argyros, provided that if either of George L. Argyros, Sr. and Julianne Argyros is unable or unwilling to designate a Board of Directors, then the other of them shall have the sole right to designate the Board of Directors. In the event neither of George L. Argyros, Sr. and Julianne Argyros is willing and able to designate a Board of Directors, then vacancies shall be filled as otherwise provided in these Bylaws at Section 14 of this Article II.

Notwithstanding the above direction for designating the Board of Directors, Melissa A. Mitchell and Stephanie A. Gehl shall each have the right to designate her successor as Director (provided, however, George L. Argyros, Jr. and his issue, if any, shall never serve as a Director or officer of the Corporation), by an instrument in writing filed with the Board of Directors prior to her resignation or death, provided further, however, that George L. Argyros, Sr. and/or Julianne Argyros, shall have the right to remove any and all Directors. In the event Melissa A. Mitchell and/or Stephanie A. Gehl has not designated a successor Director to take such person's place in the event of death or resignation, and George L. Argyros, Sr. and Julianne Argyros are for any reason unable to designate successor Directors(s), then vacancies shall be filled as otherwise provided in these Bylaws at Section 14 of this Article II.

Section 5. Term. A person who is a descendant of the marriage of George L. Argyros, Sr., and Julianne Argyros and who has been designated by George L. Argyros, Sr. and/or Julianne Argyros as a Director shall hold office until his or her resignation or removal, except as otherwise provided by law. A person who is not a descendant of the marriage of George L. Argyros, Sr. and Julianne Argyros who has been designated by George L. Argyros, Sr. and/or Julianne Argyros as a Director shall hold office for a term of three (3) years, or until his or her resignation or removal. Any Director who is otherwise appointed shall serve for a term of three (3) years, or until his or her resignation or removal. A Director elected to fill a vacancy shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which elected and until a successor has been elected and qualified. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Board of Directors determines that a vacancy in the office of Director should not be filled, a Director whose term has

;

expired shall be allowed to resign, without a successor named to fill such vacancy, provided that such resignation does not cause the number of Directors to fall below the minimum number of Directors required by these Bylaws.

Section 6. Annual and Regular Meetings. The Board of Directors shall hold an annual meeting each year on the third (3rd) day of July of each year at 1:00 p.m. at the principal office of the Corporation. At each such meeting, any business to come before the Board may be conducted, including election of Directors and officers. The Board of Directors may fix by resolution the time and place, either within or without the State of California, for the holding of other regular meetings of the Board of Directors without other notice than such resolution. Notice of any change in the time or place of regular meetings shall be given to all of the Directors in the same manner as notice for special meetings of the Board of Directors. In the absence of any such designation, regular meetings shall be held at the principal executive office of the Corporation.

Section 7. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose or purposes may be called by the Chief Executive Officer or if the Chief Executive Officer is absent or refuses to act, by the President or by any two (2) Directors. Special meetings of the Board shall be held at any place within or outside the State of California that has been designated in the notice of the meeting or, if not stated in the notice or there is no notice, at the principal executive office of the Corporation.

Section 8. Notice. Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held upon five (5) days notice by first-class mail or forty-eight (48) hours notice delivered personally or by telephone, including a voice messaging system or other system or technology designed to record or communicate messages, telegraph, facsimile transmission, electronic mail or other electronic means, charges prepaid, to each Director at his or her address as shown on the records of this Corporation or, if it is not shown on the records and is not readily ascertainable, at the place at which the meetings of the Directors are regularly held. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by telegram, or facsimile or electronic transmission, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company or actually transmitted by the person giving notice by electronic means. Any notice given personally or by telephone may be communicated either to the Director or to a person at the office of the Director whom the person giving the notice has reason to believe will promptly communicate it to the Director. Notice of a meeting need not be given to a Director who signed a waiver of notice or a written consent to holding the meeting or an approval of the minutes thereof, whether before or after the meeting, or who attends the meeting without protesting, prior thereto or at its commencement, the lack of notice to that Director. All such waivers, consents and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meetings. The business to be transacted at the meeting need not be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless specifically required by law or by these Bylaws.

Section 9. Quorum and Adjournment. A majority of the number of Directors authorized by these Bylaws and then serving shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors. A majority of the Directors present, whether or not a quorum is present, may adjourn the meeting for twenty-four (24) hours or less without further notice. If the meeting is adjourned for more than twenty-four (24) hours, notice of an adjournment to another time or place shall be given prior to the time of the adjourned meeting to the Directors who were not present at the time of the adjournment.

Section 10. Manner of Acting. The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting duly held at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a different number is authorized by law, the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation or these Bylaws. Even though a quorum be initially present at a meeting of the Board of Directors, if the number of Directors present is reduced to less than a quorum through the withdrawal of Directors, such meeting may not transact any business other than to adjourn from time to time until a quorum shall be present.

Members of the Board of Directors may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, so long as all members participating in such meeting can hear one another. Participation in a meeting in such a manner constitutes presence in person at such meeting.

Section 11. Action Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board of Directors who are not "interested" within the meaning of the law (presently Section 5227) shall individually or collectively consent in writing to such action. Such written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors. Such action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of such Directors.

Section 12. Directors' Duty of Care. A Director shall perform the duties of a Director, including duties as a member of any committee of the Board of Directors upon which the Director may serve, in good faith, in a manner such Director believes to be in the best interests of this Corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.

In performing the duties of a Director, the Director shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by:

- (a) One or more officers or employees of this Corporation whom the Director believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented;
- (b) Counsel, independent accountants or other persons as to matters which the Director believes to be within such person's professional or expert competence; or

(c) A committee of the Board of Directors upon which the Director does not serve, as to matters within its designated authority, which committee the Director believes to merit confidence,

so long as, in any such case, the Director acts in good faith, after reasonable inquiry when the need therefore is indicated by the circumstances and without knowledge that would cause such reliance to be unwarranted.

Section 13. Directors' Duty of Loyalty. Subject to being able to comply with Section 5233(d) of the Law or any successor section thereto, prior to consummating a "self-dealing transaction" or any part thereof, as defined by Section 5233 of the Law or any successor section thereto, either (a) the Board of Directors shall authorize or approve the transaction in good faith by a vote of a majority of the Directors then in office without counting the vote of the interested Director or Directors, and with knowledge of the material facts concerning the transaction and the Director's interest in the transaction; and, further, prior to authorizing or approving a selfdealing transaction, shall consider and in good faith determine after reasonable investigation under the circumstances that this Corporation could not have obtained a more advantageous arrangement with reasonable effort under the circumstances; or (b) where it is not reasonably practical to obtain approval of the Board of Directors prior to entering into the transaction, a committee or person authorized by the Board of Directors shall approve the transaction in a manner consistent with the standards set forth in clause (a) of this Section 13. In the event the procedure of clause (b) of this Section 13 is followed, the Board of Directors, after determining in good faith that the conditions of clause (b) of this Section 13 are satisfied, shall ratify the transaction at its next meeting by a vote of the majority of the Directors then in office without counting the vote of the interested Director or Directors.

Subject to being able to comply with Section 5234(a)(2) of the Law or any successor section thereto, no contract or other transaction between this Corporation and any corporation, firm or association in which one or more Directors are directors shall be authorized, approved or ratified by the Board of Directors or a committee of the Board of Directors unless the material facts as to the transaction and as to the Director's or Directors' common directorships are fully disclosed or known to the Board of Directors or committee of the Board of Directors, and the Board of Directors or a committee of the Board of Directors authorizes, approves or ratifies the transaction in good faith by a vote sufficient without counting the vote of the common Director or Directors.

Interested Directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Board of Directors which authorizes, approves or ratifies a self-dealing transaction.

Section 14. Removal and Filling Vacancies. The Board of Directors may declare vacant the office of a Director who has been declared of unsound mind by a final order of a court, or convicted of a felony, or who has been found by a final order or judgment of any court to have breached any duty arising under Article 3 of Chapter 2 of the Law or any successor article thereto. Further, the Board of Directors may declare vacant the office of a Director who (i) fails

to accept election within sixty (60) days; (ii) consistently fails to attend and/or participate in a meaningful manner in meetings; (iii) fails to comply with corporate policy, including, but not limited to conflict of interest policies; or (iv) whose conduct is deemed by the Board of Directors to be not in the best interests of the Corporation. A Director who was designated as a Director by George L. Argyros, Sr. and/or Julianne Argyros may be removed by the party so designating, and may not be removed without the written consent of the party so designating, provided such designating party is competent to act, except as provided by law. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors as well as any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of Directors shall be filled by designation as set forth in these bylaws, or if no designation is made, with the approval of the Board of Directors or, if the number of Directors then in office is less than a quorum, by (a) the unanimous written consent of the Directors then in office, (b) the affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors then in office at a meeting held pursuant to notice or waivers of notice complying with Section 5211, or (c) a sole remaining Director.

Section 15. Compensation. Directors and members of committees may receive such compensation, if any, for their services and such reimbursement of expenses as may be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors to be just and reasonable. This Section 15 shall not be construed to preclude any Director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity as an officer, agent, employee, or otherwise, and receiving compensation for those services. If any Director is considered an "Interested Person", as defined under Code § 5227, then such Director may not be compensated unless not more than forty-nine percent (49%) of all Directors are Interested Persons.

Section 16. Resignation. Any Director may resign effective upon giving written notice to the Chief Executive Officer, the President, the Secretary or the Board of Directors of this Corporation, unless the notice specifies a later time for the effectiveness of such resignation. If the resignation is effective at a future time, a successor may be designated to take office when the resignation becomes effective. However, except upon notice to the Attorney General, no Director may resign if this Corporation would then be left without a duly elected Director in charge of its affairs.

ARTICLE III

Officers

Section 1. Officers. The officers of this Corporation shall be a Chief Executive Officer, a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Secretary, a Chief Financial Officer, and such other officers with such titles and duties as shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the Secretary nor the Chief Financial Officer may serve concurrently as the Chief Executive Officer or President.

- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>Selection and Term of Office</u>. The officers of this Corporation shall be chosen by the Board of Directors and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.
- <u>Section 3</u>. <u>Removal</u>. Any officer selected by the Board of Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of this Corporation would be served thereby.
- Section 4. Resignation. Any officer may resign at any time upon written notice to this Corporation without prejudice to the rights, if any, of this Corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.
- Section 5. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise may be filled by the Board of Directors.
- Section 6. Chief Executive Officer. The Chief Executive Officer shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and exercise and perform such powers and duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the Board of Directors or prescribed by these Bylaws. In addition, the Chief Executive Officer shall be the general manager of this Corporation and shall subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have general supervision, direction and control of the business and officers of this Corporation.
- Section 7. President. To the extent the Chief Executive Officer is unavailable, the President shall be the general manager and chief executive officer of this Corporation and shall, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have general supervision, direction and control of the business and officers of this Corporation. The President shall preside in the absence of the Chief Executive Officer, or if there be none, at all meetings of the Board of Directors. To the extent the Chief Executive Officer is unavailable, the President shall have all of the powers and shall perform all of the duties which are ordinarily inherent in the office of the Chief Executive Officer, and he or she shall have such further powers and shall perform such further duties as may be prescribed for him or her by the Board of Directors.
- Section 8. Vice Presidents. In the absence or disability or refusal to act of the Chief Executive Officer and the President, the Vice President(s) in order of their rank as fixed by the Board of Directors, or, if not ranked, the Vice President designated by the Chief Executive Officer or the Board of Directors, shall perform all of the duties of the Chief Executive Officer, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chief Executive Officer. The Vice President(s) shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as from time to time may be prescribed for them, respectively, by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws.
- Section 9. Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and records of account of this Corporation. The Chief Financial Officer shall receive and deposit all moneys and other valuables belonging to this Corporation in the name and to the credit of this Corporation and

shall disburse the same only in such manner as the Board of Directors or the appropriate officers of this Corporation may from time to time determine and shall render to the Chief Executive Officer and the Board of Directors, whenever they request it, an account of all his or her transactions as Chief Financial Officer and of the financial condition of this Corporation. The Chief Financial Officer shall have all of the powers and shall perform all of the duties incident to the office of Chief Financial Officer, and he or she shall have such further powers and perform such further duties as may be prescribed for him or her by the Board of Directors.

Section 10. Secretary. The Secretary shall keep or cause to be kept at the principal executive office of this Corporation or such other place as the Board of Directors may order, a book of minutes of all proceedings of the Board of Directors, with the time and place of holding, whether regular or special, and if special, how authorized, the notice thereof given, and the names of those present at Board of Directors meetings. The Secretary or, if he or she is absent or unable or refuses to act, any other officer of this Corporation, shall give or cause to be given notice of all the meetings of the Board of Directors required by these Bylaws or by statute to be given, and he or she shall keep the seal of this Corporation, if any, in safe custody. The Secretary shall have all of the powers and perform all of the duties incident to the office of Secretary, and he or she shall have such further powers and shall perform such further duties as may be prescribed for him or her by the Board of Directors.

Section 11. Assistant Officers. The Assistant Vice Presidents, Assistant Treasurers, Assistant Secretaries, and such other assistant officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Article III, shall exercise and perform such powers and duties as the officers whom they are elected to assist shall specify and delegate to them, and such other powers and duties as these Bylaws, the Board of Directors, or the Chief Executive Officer may prescribe.

ARTICLE IV

Committees

Section 1. Committees of Directors. The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the authorized number of Directors, designate one or more committees, each consisting of two (2) or more Directors (with the exception of the Audit Committee which may have only one (1) member), to serve at the pleasure of the Board. The Board may designate one or more Directors as alternate members of any committee, who may replace any absent member at any meeting of the committee. Any committee, to the extent provided in the resolution of the Board, shall have all the authority of the Board, except with respect to:

- (a) The filling of vacancies in any committee;
- (b) The fixing of compensation of the Directors for serving on the Board or on any committee;

- (c) The amendment or repeal of Bylaws or the adoption of new Bylaws;
- (d) The amendment or repeal of any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable; and
- (e) The appointment of any other committees of the Board of Directors or the members of these committees.

Section 2. Meetings and Action of Committees. Meetings shall be held and taken in accordance with, the provisions of Article II of these Bylaws, with such changes in the context of those Bylaws as are necessary to substitute the committee and the committee members for the Board of Directors, except that the time of regular meetings of committees may be determined either by resolution of the Board of Directors or by resolution of the committee; special meetings of committees may also be called by resolution of the Board of Directors; and notice of special meetings of committees shall also be given to all alternate committee members, who shall have the right to attend all meetings of the committee. The Board of Directors may adopt rules for the government of any committee not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

Section 3. Executive Committee.

- (a) The Board may establish an Executive Committee which shall consist of the Chief Executive Officer (who shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee), all of the officers of the Corporation who are also Directors, and such additional Directors as may be appointed by the Board. A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of its business. In the absence of any member of the Executive Committee from a meeting of the Committee, the Board may appoint any Director to participate in that meeting as an alternate member thereof with power to vote in place of the absent member, and such alternate member may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at the meeting.
- (b) The Executive Committee shall formulate, supervise and implement the policies of the Corporation under the direction of the Board and between the meetings of the Board and while the Board is not in session.

Section 4. Finance Committee.

- (a) The Board may establish a Finance Committee which shall consist of the Chief Financial Officer of the Corporation and such additional persons as may be appointed by the Board. A majority of the members of the Finance Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of its business.
- (b) The Finance Committee shall formulate and supervise the financial policies of the Corporation, including those relating to the investments of the Corporation. The

Finance Committee shall adhere to the requirements of the Uniform Management of Institutional Funds Act (currently Probate Code § 18500 et. seq.)

Section 5. Grant Committee.

- (a) The Board may establish a Grant Committee which shall consist of such persons as may be appointed by the Board. A majority of the members of the Grant Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of its business.
- (b) The Grant Committee is responsible for reviewing applications for grants, determining qualification for grants, reporting to the Board of Directors regarding recommendations for grants, and following-up to determine that the grants have been properly used and that the future distributions of grant funds are appropriate. It shall also be the responsibility of the Grant Committee to ensure that the Corporation complies with all federal and state laws to ensure that distributions from the Corporation are "qualifying distributions." Specific review of corporate distributions to supporting organizations shall be made by the Grant Committee to ensure compliance with applicable law for "qualifying distributions." The Board may appoint any number of subcommittees to assist the Grant Committee in its discharge of these responsibilities.

Section 6. Audit Committee. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the Board of Directors shall appoint an Audit Committee to oversee the preparation of annual audited financial statements which are described in Section 1 of Article VII, below. The Audit Committee may include individuals who are not members of the Board of Directors, but the members of the Audit Committee shall not include any members of the staff, including the Chief Executive Officer, the President, or the Chief Financial Officer. In addition, the Audit Committee must be separate from the Finance Committee, if such a committee shall be appointed. Members of the Finance Committee may serve on the Audit Committee; however, the chairperson of the Audit Committee may not be a member of the Finance Committee and members of the Finance Committee shall constitute less than one-half (½) of the membership of the Audit Committee. Members of the Audit Committee shall not receive any compensation from the Corporation in excess of the compensation, if any, received by members of the Board of Directors for service on the Board and shall not have a material financial interest in any entity doing business with the Corporation.

Subject to the supervision of the Board of Directors, the Audit Committee shall have the following responsibilities:

- (a) Recommending to the Board of Directors the retention and termination of the independent auditor selected to prepare the Corporation's audited financial statements;
- (b) Negotiating the compensation of the independent auditor, on behalf of the Board of Directors;

- (c) Conferring with the auditor to satisfy the Audit Committee members that the financial affairs of Corporation are in order;
- (d) Reviewing and determining whether to accept the audit prepared by the independent auditor; and
- (e) Approving the performance of any non-audit related services provided by the independent auditor.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Corporation is not required to comply with California Government Code Section 12586(e), or any successor statute thereto, then the Corporation shall not be required to appoint an Audit Committee as set forth in this Section 6.

Section 7. Rules. Sections 3 to 11 of Article II of these Bylaws shall also apply, with necessary changes in point of detail, to committees exercising the authority of the Board of Directors, if any, and to actions by such committees, except that (a) the first sentence of Section 9 of Article II shall not apply and a quorum of the committee shall be a majority of the authorized number of members of the committee and except that (b) special meetings of a committee may be called by any two (2) members of the committee, unless otherwise provided by these Bylaws or by the resolution of the Board of Directors designating such committees. For such purpose, references to "the Board" or "the Board of Directors" shall be deemed to refer to each such committee and references to "Directors" or "members of the Board of Directors" shall be deemed to refer to members of the committee.

ARTICLE V

Miscellaneous

- Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers to be agent or agents of this Corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these Bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of this Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of this Corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents, of this Corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Chief Financial Officer and countersigned by the Chief Executive Officer of this Corporation.
- Section 3. Deposits. All funds of this Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of this Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

Section 4. Donations. The Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation or his or her designee is authorized to accept donations which support the purposes of the Corporation as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation of this Corporation whether such donation is for a specific project or projects or is for the general support of the Corporation's programs.

Section 5. Representation of Corporate Shares. The Chief Executive Officer, or in the absence of such officer, the President or any Vice President or the Secretary or any Assistant Secretary of this Corporation, is authorized to vote, represent and exercise on behalf of this Corporation all rights incident to any and all shares of any other corporation or corporations standing in the name of this Corporation. The authority herein granted to said officers to vote or represent on behalf of this Corporation any and all shares held by this Corporation in any other corporation or corporations may be exercised either by such officers in person or by any other person authorized so to do by proxy or power of attorney duly executed by said officers.

ARTICLE VI

Principal Office, Other Offices, Books and Records

Section 1. Principal Office. The Corporation's principal office shall be located at 949 South Coast Drive, Suite 600, Costa Mesa, California, or elsewhere as the Board of Directors (the "Board") shall from time to time determine. The Board is granted full power and authority to change the location of the Corporation's principal office.

<u>Section 2. Other Offices.</u> The Board of Directors or the Chief Executive Officer may at any time establish branch or subordinate offices at any place or places where the Corporation is qualified to do business.

Section 3. Books and Records. This Corporation shall keep at its principal office in this state, if any, the original or a copy of its Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws as amended to date. Furthermore, this Corporation shall keep adequate and correct books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and committees of the Board of Directors. Minutes shall be kept in written form. Other books and records shall be kept either in written form or in any other form capable of being converted into written form. Every Director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect and copy all books, records and documents of every kind and to inspect the physical properties of this Corporation.

ARTICLE VII

Annual and Other Reports

Section 1. Financial Statements. A copy of any annual financial statement and any income statement of the corporation for each quarterly period of each fiscal year, and any accompanying balance sheet of the Corporation as of the end of each such period, that has been prepared by the Corporation shall be kept on file in the principal executive office of the Corporation.

In addition, if the Corporation is required to comply with California Government Code Section 12586(e) or any successor statute thereto, then the Corporation shall have prepared audited financial statements in lieu of or in addition to the financial statements discussed above. The audited financial statements shall be prepared by an independent certified public accountant in conformance with generally accepted auditing standards. If the certified public accountant also provides non-audit services to the Corporation, then the accountant shall adhere to the standards for auditor independence set forth in the latest revision of the Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States (Yellow Book).

The audited financial statements shall be made available for inspection by the California Attorney General and by members of the public no later than nine (9) months after the close of the fiscal year to which the statements relate. The corporation shall make its audited financial statements available to the public in the same manner that is prescribed for Internal Revenue Service Form 990 by the latest revision of Section 6104(d) of the Internal Revenue Code and corresponding regulations.

- Section 2. Annual Report. The Board shall cause an annual report to be sent to the Directors within one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of the Corporation's fiscal year. The report shall contain the following information, in appropriate detail:
- (a) The assets and liabilities, including the trust funds, of the Corporation as of the end of the fiscal year;
 - (b) The principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds;
- (c) The Corporation's revenue of receipts, both restricted and unrestricted to particular purposes;
- (d) The Corporation's expenses or disbursements for both general and restricted purposes; and
- (e) An independent accountants' report, or if none, the certificate of an authorized officer of the Corporation that such statements were prepared without audit from the Corporation's books and records.

The requirement of an annual report shall not apply if the Corporation receives less than \$25,000 in gross receipts during the fiscal year, provided, however, that the information specified above for inclusion in an annual report must be furnished annually to all Directors who request it in writing.

- Section 3. Annual Statement of Certain Transactions and Indemnifications. As part of the annual report to all Directors, or as a separate report if no annual report is issued, the Corporation shall, within one hundred twenty (120) days after the end of the Corporation's fiscal year, annually prepare and mail or deliver to each Director a statement of any transaction or indemnification of the following kind:
- (a) Any transaction (i) in which the Corporation, or its parent or subsidiary, was a party, (ii) in which an "interested person" had a direct or indirect material financial interest, and (iii) which involved more than \$50,000 or was one of several transactions with the same interested person involving, in the aggregate, more than \$50,000. For this purpose, an interested person is either:
- (1) Any Director or officer of the Corporation, its parent or subsidiary (but mere common Directorship shall not be considered such an interest); or
- (2) Any holder of more than ten percent (10%) of the voting power of the Corporation, its parent, or its subsidiary. The statement shall include a brief description of the transaction, the names of interested persons involved, their relationship to the Corporation, the nature of their interest in the transaction, and, if practicable, the amount of that interest, provided that if the transaction was with a partnership in which the interested person is a partner, only the interest of the partnership need be stated.
- (b) Any indemnifications or advances aggregating more than \$10,000 paid during the fiscal year to any officer or Director of the corporation under Article VIII of these Bylaws, unless that indemnification has already been approved, pursuant to Code § 5238, by a majority of Directors who are not "interested persons."

ARTICLE VIII

Indemnification of Directors and Officers

This Corporation shall, to the maximum extent permitted by law and subject to Section 5260 of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law, indemnify each of its present or former Directors and officers against expenses, judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred in connection with any proceeding or any threatened proceeding (hereinafter "proceeding" includes any threatened proceeding) arising by reason of the fact that any such person is or was a Director or officer of this Corporation; provided that the Board of Directors determines that such Director or officer was acting in good faith and in a manner such

person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of this Corporation and, in the case of a criminal proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe the conduct of such person was unlawful. Payments authorized hereunder include amounts paid and expenses incurred in settling any such proceeding. The foregoing does not apply to any proceeding specifically excluded by law, which includes actions brought by or in the right of this Corporation and certain actions alleging self-dealing or a breach of any duty relating to assets held in charitable trust.

If, because of the nature of the proceeding, this Corporation is prohibited by the Law from indemnifying its Directors or officers against judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts, this Corporation shall nevertheless indemnify each of its Directors or officers against expenses actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the defense or settlement of such proceeding arising by reason of the fact that any such person is or was a Director or officer of this Corporation; provided that the Board of Directors determines that such Director or officer was acting in good faith and in a manner such person believed to be in the best interests of this Corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances and further provided that, to the extent required by law, the authority specified by law shall also approve the indemnification provided for by this paragraph.

Expenses incurred in defending any proceeding may be advanced by this Corporation prior to the final disposition of the proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the Director or officer to repay the amount of the advance unless it is determined ultimately that the Director or officer is entitled to be indemnified as authorized in this Article VIII or by law.

The Board of Directors may authorize this Corporation to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any Director or officer against any liability asserted against or incurred by such person in such capacity or arising out of the person's status as such, whether or not this Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability.

This Article VIII does not apply to any proceeding against any trustee, investment manager or other fiduciary of an employee benefit plan in that person's capacity as such, even though that person may also be a Director or officer of this Corporation. Nothing contained in this Article VIII shall limit any right to indemnification to which such a trustee, investment manager or other fiduciary may be entitled by contract or otherwise, which shall be enforceable to the extent permitted by applicable law.

ARTICLE IX

<u>Limitation of Liability of</u> Certain Directors and Officers

Section 1. Limitation of Liability of Volunteer Directors and Volunteer Executive

Officers to Third Parties. There shall be no personal liability to a third party on the part of a
volunteer Director or volunteer executive officer caused by the Director's or officer's negligent
act or omission in the performance of that person's duties as a Director or officer, if all of the
following conditions are met:

- (a) The act or omission was within the scope of the Director's or executive officer's duties;
 - (b) The act or omission was performed in good faith;
- (c) The act or omission was not reckless, wanton, intentional or grossly negligent; and
- (d) Damages caused by the act or omission are covered pursuant to a liability insurance policy issued to the Corporation, either in the form of a general liability policy or a director's and officer's liability policy, or personally to the director or executive officer. In the event that the damages are not covered by a liability insurance policy, the volunteer Director or volunteer executive officer shall not be personally liable for the damages if the Board of Directors and the person had made all reasonable efforts in good faith to obtain available liability insurance.

"Volunteer" means the rendering of services without compensation.

"Compensation" means remuneration whether by way of salary, fee, or other consideration for services rendered. However, the payment of per diem, mileage, or other reimbursement expenses to a Director or executive officer does not affect that person's status as a volunteer with the meaning of this Section 1.

"Executive Officer" means the chief executive officer, president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer of a corporation, or such other individual who serves in like capacity, who assists in establishing the policy of the Corporation.

Nothing in this Section 1 shall limit the liability of the Corporation for any damages caused by acts or omissions of the volunteer Director or volunteer executive officer.

This Section 1 does not eliminate or limit the liability of a Director or officer for any of the following:

- (i) As provided in Section 5233 or 5237; or
- (ii) In any action or proceeding brought by the Attorney General.

Nothing in this Section 1 creates a duty of care or basis of liability for damage or injury caused by the acts or omissions of a Director or officer.

Section 2. Limitation of Liability of Certain Directors. Except as provided in Section 5233 or 5237, there is no monetary liability on the part of, and no cause of action for damages shall arise against, any nonpaid Director, including any nonpaid Director who is also a nonpaid officer, of this Corporation based upon any alleged failure to discharge the person's duties as Director or officer if the duties are performed in a manner that meets all of the following criteria:

- (a) The duties are performed in good faith;
- (b) The duties are performed in a manner such Director believes to be in the best interests of the Corporation; and
- (c) The duties are performed with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE X

Corporate Loans, Guarantees, and Advances

Except as provided by the Law (presently Section 5236), this Corporation shall not make any loan of money or property to or guarantee the obligation of any Director of this Corporation.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments to Bylaws

New Bylaws may be adopted, or these Bylaws may be amended or repealed, by the approval of the Board of Directors.
