Using a grassroots strategy, Healthy Community Initiatives staff works closely with faith leaders, residents, local businesses and schools to address community concerns and to identify solutions to improve neighborhoods. With a focus on community development and community health our goal is to address a variety of social determinants. Patients are responsible for providing the information necessary to complete the documentation. The FAP aids uninsured and underinsured patients who do not qualify for government-sponsored health insurance and who communicate their inability to pay for their medical care.
