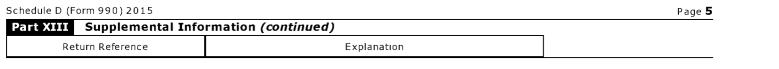

The annual review and signature indicating their agreement to comply with the policy is mandatory as part of employment with ETS.
