In furtherance of its charitable purpose, the Corporation provides a wide variety of benefits to the community. These services and donations account for a measurable portion of the Corporation's costs and serve to promote healthy life styles, community development, health education, and affordable access to care. Those records include management's estimate of the cost to provide charity care, the cost of services and supplies furnished for community benefit programs and costs in excess of program payments for treating Medical Assistance patients.
