

These communities look to Raleigh as their primary source for tertiary level care. The market is demographically diverse and fiercely competitive the only market in the state with three major health systems competing against one another. WakeMed shoulders the vast majority of care for the uninsured and underinsured, often exceeding 80% of the burden. Wake County was founded in 1771 and occupies approximately 860 square miles in the Piedmont region of North Carolina. 
