The Trustees engage in no activities other than grant-making in accordance with the trust agreement. These grants are made in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid trust agreement, a copy of which and its amendments are on file with the Internal Revenue Service. Individuals to whom grants are made, none of whom are related to any trust manager or substantial contributor must come within the classes set forth in the trust agreement. The individual beneficiaries are selected and payments are based upon, among other things, the age, health and income of each such individual and the amount of net income available from said Trust fund. The Fund can distribute to the individual beneficiaries only income. Any undistributed income and the principal of the trust fund are payable to designated charitable organizations. A fractional share of trust principal must be distributed to the charitable organizations in any year that there is a death of an eligible income beneficiary.
