Pursuant to Section 4945(g) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations 53.4945-4(d)(1), we are submitting the following information concerning grants made by The Coffey Foundation:

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Coffey Foundation, Inc. is a nonprofit organization which was established in 1954 to receive and administer funds for religious, charitable, scientific, educational and literary purposes. The Foundation has consistently filed Forms 990-PF through its taxable year ended November 30, 1979. The Foundation's Employer Identification Number is 56-6047501.

The Coffey Foundation was established by members of the F. H. Coffey Family and stockholders of Kent-Coffey Manufacturing Company. Kent-Coffey Manufacturing Company has since been dissolved. The only remaining original members of the Board of Trustees for the Foundation are W. H. Maynard, Sr., now semiretired and affiliated with Singer Company - Furniture Division and Ethel Coffey Hoyle. All present members of the Board are from various walks of life.

Prior to the effective date of Code Section 4945(g), the Foundation had made loans to local students for educational purposes. However, since the effective date of this new law, the Foundation has not made any new loans.

During the current year, the Foundation decided it would be a worth while community project to award scholarships and to once again make loans to individuals to further their education at the college level. For this reason, the Foundation has decided to create THE COFFEY FOUNDATION AWARDS which will include THE COFFEY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP and THE COFFEY FOUNDATION LOAN PROGRAMS which are intended to assist qualified students who are residents of Caldwell County in furthering their education.

THE OBJECTIVES OF THE COFFEY FOUNDATION AWARDS:

- I. To encourage the characteristics of industriousness, initiative, resourcefulness and other worthwhile personal characteristics of Caldwell County high school students.
- II. To recognize, reward and develop specific talents that provide potentials for development into creativity, leadership and service.
- III. To encourage students to further their education and in doing so to learn the workings of the various economic systems of our country.

SELECTION PROCEDURES:

Each high school in Caldwell County through principals, teachers, advisors, etc., will be informed of THE COFFEY FOUNDATION AWARDS and will be given a supply of application forms for the awards (a copy of this form is attached). Booklets and brochures will also be distributed to the high schools, and additional brochures and booklets will be available to any individual who desires to apply for the award.

A Screening Committee will be established at each high school. This committee will consist of four individuals including the principal and three individuals who are either teachers, advisors or counselors. The other three members of this Screening Committee will be selected by the principal. The Screening Committee from each high school will select no more than three candidates from potential applicants within their school. These three applicants will then be interviewed by the Selection Committee which shall make final decisions regarding the awards.

The Selection Committee will be comprised of no more than five members and no less than three members. These members will be selected and appointed annually by the Board of Trustees of The Coffey Foundation, Inc. Each year the Selection Committee will be informed by Board of Trustees of the moneys available for Awards. The amount of the Awards may vary from year to year. It is the Foundation's intention that the amounts of these Awards will be based upon the financial need of the recipient as well as the cost of the particular college or university the recipient has selected to attend. In no case, however, shall an Award exceed the amount necessary to pay the cost of tuition, room, board, books and other direct educational expenses.

The Selection Committee shall select individuals to receive the available Awards after completing the selection process. This process includes a detailed review of each application. Then, each applicant will be privately interviewed by the Selection Committee. The decision of the Selection Committee shall be based on the following criteria:

- (A) The personal characteristics of the applicant such as initiative, industriousness, ambition, and enterprise.
- (B) A satisfactory academic high school record.
- (C) Qualifications for acceptance at an accredited college or university of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools or the equivalent.
- (D) Participation and leadership in extra curricular high school activities.
- (E) Citizenship and service to the community.
- (F) Employment record and accomplishments, particularly in overcoming disadvantages and obstacles.
- (G) An original written paper stating why a particular course of study and future work was chosen.
- (H) Ability to express oneself orally, and present oneself favorably in a final interview before the Selection Committee.

No member of the Selection Committee shall be in a position to derive a private benefit, directly or indirectly, if certain potential grantees are selected over others. Children or other relatives of the Selection Committee or any member of the Board of Trustees of The Coffey Foundation shall not be eligible for these awards.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE COFFEY FOUNDATION AWARD:

The Awards will be made only for attendance at an accredited college or university of the applicants choice provided it is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools or the equivalent. The purpose of this requirement is to select students who wish to attend, and are capable of attending, bona fide accredited colleges and universities. The Coffey Foundation Awards are scholarships and loans to pay for directly related educational expenses of attending such colleges and universities. It is the intention of the Foundation that these awards will be made in an amount to pay tuition and other direct educational expenses necessary for a student to complete his four years of college education. However, each award is subject to an annual review by the Selection Committee. If the Committee decides that such an award shall not be continued, it will stop.

The scholarships shall be awarded to those applicants that the Selection Committee determines best satisfy the criteria for selection. After all available scholarships are awarded, then the Selection Committee will award the loans to be made for the year to individuals selected from the remaining applicants.

Loans made will be repaid to the Foundation after the grantee leaves college (e.g. after graduation or after withdrawing from school for any other reason). Interest at 6% per year will accrue on the loan. Such accruals will begin 6 months after the grantee leaves school. The terms of the loan repayment will be determined by the Selection Committee based upon the grantee's ability to pay. Determination of the repayment schedule will be made when the grantee leaves school.

PROCEDURES FOR EXERCISING SUPERVISION OVER THE AWARDS:

All moneys paid under the award program will be paid directly to the colleges or universities with any unused moneys being returned to The Coffey Foundation. Also, all students selected to receive The Coffey Foundation Awards must instruct the college or university to release grades and other pertinent information including awards and honors received to the Selection Committee upon request. The student must also agree that all unused moneys be returned to The Coffey Foundation should there be a refund due, for example, if the student is unable to complete a year of study for any reason. The Coffey Foundation will receive a copy of the grantees grades each reporting period. If any awards are made to grantees whose study at the educational institution does not involve the taking of courses, but only the preparation of research papers or projects, such as the writing of a doctoral thesis, the Foundation will arrange to receive a brief report of the progress of the paper or project at least once a year. The report will be approved by a faculty member supervising the grantee or by some other appropriate university official. A final report will be obtained by the Foundation upon the grantees completion of study at the educational institution.

PROCEDURES FOR REVIEW OF GRANTEE REPORTS, INVESTIGATION OF DIVERTED FUNDS, AND RECOVERY OF DIVERTED GRANT FUNDS:

As mentioned previously, even though The Coffey Foundation Awards may be made for a four year academic term, the continuation of this award will depend upon a review by the Selection Committee. All students selected to receive a Coffey Foundation Award must give permission for the college or university to release grades and other pertinent information to the Selection Committee upon request. The continuation of the award shall be based upon the review of the Selection Committee of the grantees courses to be taken for a particular academic period and the grades received for such period and a review of extracurricular activities. For each grading period, the Selection Committee, after receiving a transcript of the grades, will review the students academic performance. If poor grades are shown on the transcript or other problems arise, special conferences will be arranged with the student and a member of the Selection Committee to discuss his grades. The continuation of the grant will be contingent upon this review process.

By receiving transcripts for each student directly from the college or university to ascertain that the student is attending such college or university and by writing the checks for tuition and other direct educational expenses directly to the college or university, the Foundation can be certain that the funds are being used for the purposes for which they were intended. As previously mentioned, where a student has received an award and drops out of school, the school will be instructed to refund the moneys not used directly to The Coffey Foundation. The Foundation will follow up to make certain this is done.

Where information received from the college or from other sources indicates that all or any part of the award is not being used in furthering the purposes of the award, the Foundation will investigate the situation thoroughly. While conducting an investigation, the Foundation will withhold any further payments to the extent possible, until satisfied the funds will be used for college tuition. The Foundation will take all reasonable and appropriate steps either to recover the funds or to ensure their restoration to the uses for which the grant was intended. Depending upon the circumstances, the Foundation may make further payments for the tuition of the grantee but only after the Foundation has received the grantee's assurances that further diversion will not occur and has required the grantee to take any necessary precautions to prevent further diversions of funds.

In any case where a grantee has previously diverted funds received from the Foundation, and the Foundation determines that any part of the award has again been used for improper purposes, the Foundation will take all reasonable steps to recover the grant funds or to ensure the restoration of the funds and the use of the funds for direct college expenses. In such a case, the Foundation will withhold further payments until such funds are recovered, it has received the grantee's assurances that further diversions will not occur, and the grantee has been required to take any necessary precautions to prevent future diversions.


