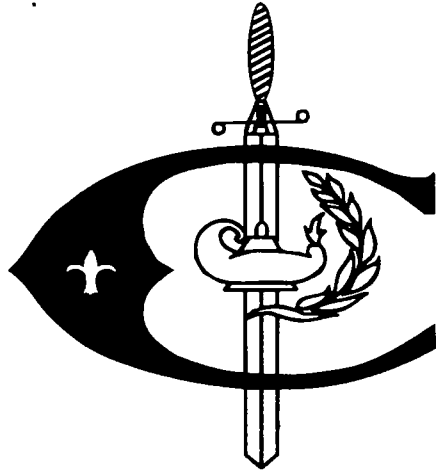

I come from a large extended family with many who work in the health field. With my uncle being a surgeon, my aunt a nurse, my grandma a medical laboratory scientist, and many more medical career variations in my extended family, I always listened to their conversations with admiration. Their anecdotes initiated my curiosity of the health care world and my grandmother's chemotherapy treatments for Lymphoma made it personal.


